(Makes 6-8 servings, about 35¢/serving.)
Water
3lb. chicken
1 T. salt
8 oz. of shell macaroni
3 T. flour
2 t. salt
1/4 t. pepper
1/2 t. basil leaves (opp.)
1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen thawed green peas
1/2 C. soft bread crumbs
1/2 C. all veg. Crisco
1/2 C. chopped onion
1/2 t. oregano leaves (opp.)
3 C. milk
4 oz. American cheese (diced)
Bring 3 quarts water to a

boil in large sauce pan; add chicken and cook until tender. Remove chicken and reserve broth. Remove chicken from bones and cut into bite-size pieces. Add 1 tablespoon salt and enough water to reserved broth to make 3 quarts liquid, bring to boil. Gradually add macaroni so that liquid continues to boil. Cook uncovered, stirring occasionally, until tender. Drain in colander.

Meanwhile, in large skillet heat Crisco; add onion and saute until lightly browned. Add flour and remaining seasonings. Gradually add milk and stir over medium heat until sauce boils 2 minutes. Add peas and heat. Combine macaroni, chicken, and sauce in 2 1/2

quart casserole. Sprinkle with crumbs and dot with cheese. Bake in 350 degrees oven for 30 minutes. *Save broth used for cooking macaroni and use for soups of sauces, if desired.
