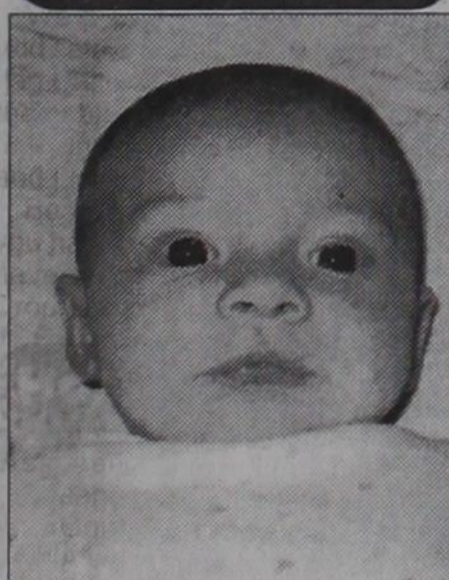

These are the results of the District meet yesterday Monday Oct. 22nd for Wheeler.

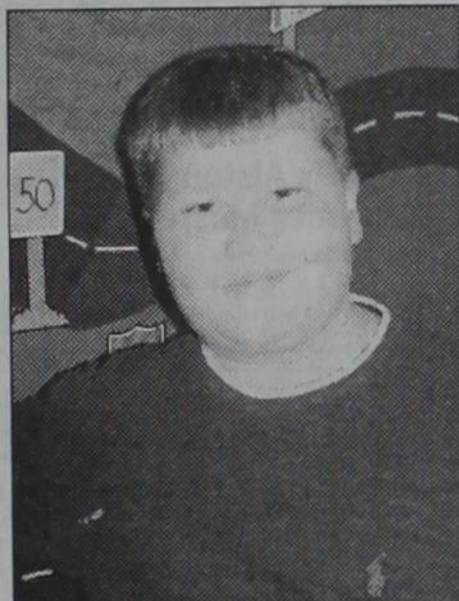

Wheeler Mustangs-0 Clarendon Broncos-17

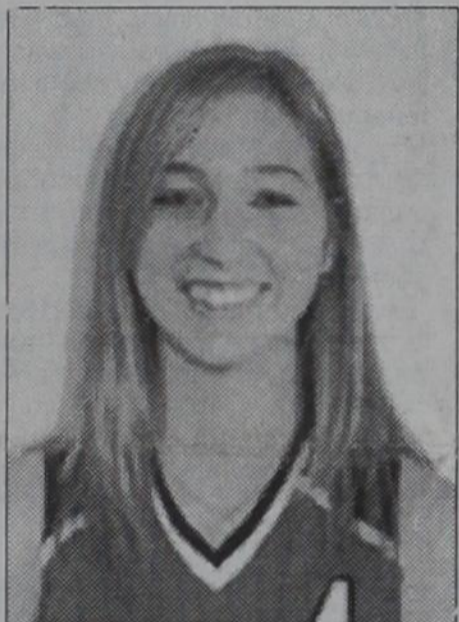
The Wheeler Mustangs lost to the visiting Clarendon Broncos Friday evening 17-0.

Clarendon's Alton Gaines led the ground attack with 21 carries for 54 yards and one touchdown in this District 3-1A match up.

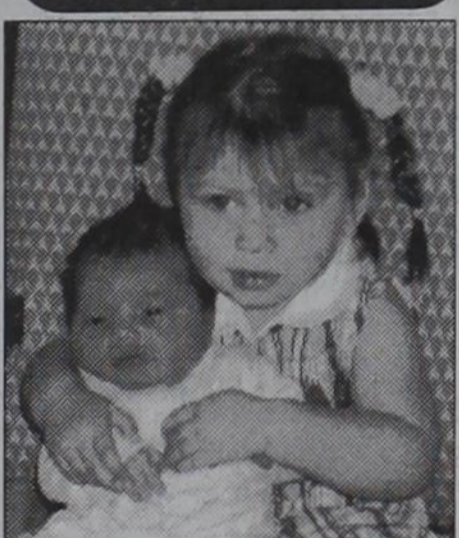
Clarendon's quarterback, Nathan Gribble, attempted to spread the ball around, completing 9 of 23 passes for one touchdown.

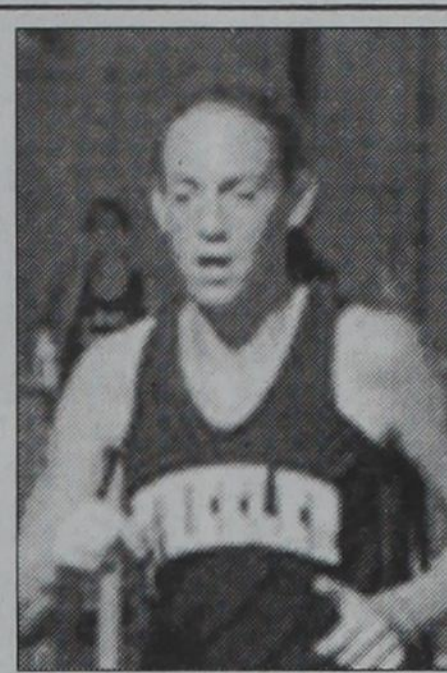

Kelton Students' Are Taught Hand Washing

County Extension Agent, Karen Tellman takes Glo Bug Handwashing program to Kelton. The Students in Mrs. Pigg's Pre-K thru 1st grade Physical Education Classes learn the importance of the Five Steps in Handwashing:

1. Wet hands with water and then add soap.
2. Use friction to work up a lather and wash hands for at least 20 seconds.
3. Rinse well under a stream of water.
4. Dry hands thoroughly, with a single use paper towel whenever possible.
5. Turn off faucet with a paper towel, if possible.

Youth were able to see how well they washed their hands by the use of Glo Bug Potion and a black light. The students could see where they needed to scrub more around their fingernails and that using a nail brush would help to remove the dirt. Remember the High Five to prevent the spread of germs and infection. Hand washing can be difficult for younger children. Try to make the process fun. Sing a song your child likes to encourage them to spend more time washing. Some example songs could be 'Row, row, row your Boat,' or 'happy birthday.' These tend to be repetitive and long enough to allow for 15 seconds of hand washing time. Remind your child why you are washing, make up a fun story about the reason of hand washing.

A recent study in Pediatrics, found that waterless, alcohol-based hand gel decreased the spread respiratory illnesses in the home.

Anti-bacterial gel is a good tool to use when on the run, but hand washing still is best when the facilities are available. If you would like the Glo Bug Handwashing Program to come to your class, call Karen Tellman at the Extension office 826-5243.

Parkview Artery Got Flu?

Your head aches, and so does every bone in your body. You're cold one minute and hot the next. Your throat is scratchy and you're starting to cough. You may be getting the flu!

If you have the flu, you'll have lots of company. Each year from November to April, all across the United States, as many as 60 million people come down with the flu. Although children get the flu most often, people in every age group can catch it.

Usually when you're sick with a virus, your body builds up a defense system by making antibodies against it, so you don't get that particular virus strain again. Unfortunately, flu viruses mutate (change) each year, so you aren't protected from getting the flu forever.

Although you may feel miserable if you get the flu, it's unlikely to be serious. It's rare that healthy people have complications like pneumonia or bronchitis from the flu. Older adults (over age 65), young kids (under age 5), and people with chronic medical conditions are more likely to become seriously ill with the flu.

If you get the flu, the best way to take care of yourself is to rest in bed and drink lots of liquids like water and other noncaffeinated drinks. Stay home from school or work until you feel better and your temperature has returned to normal. You probably don't need to contact your doctor unless you develop complications or you have a medical condition (for example, diabetes or heart or lung problems).

Antibiotics don't help people with the flu get better because they don't work on viruses. Sometimes doctors can prescribe an antiviral medicine to reduce the length of time someone is ill from the flu.

I'd like to use this space today to make a prayer request. My dad (his name is Philip Johnson) is going to be undergoing surgery this week (probably on the 24th so it may have already taken place by the time you are reading this) in Dallas. He was diagnosed several months ago with something called renal cell carcinoma. Basically, it is kidney cancer. I've done a little research into this particular disease and the prognosis is actually pretty good at this stage. They discovered it early when he went in for a general examination on his last birthday (his 65th). They are likely to just remove part of that kidney, but are prepared to remove all of it, if necessary. There will be no radiation or chemotherapy because those particular therapies are generally not effective in helping. However, there is a higher-than-most percentage chance of survival from this type of cancer than most others. He was told to expect to be in the hospital from 5-7 days.

My wife and I are going to be down there the week of his surgery and about the time we leave to come back to Wheeler, my sister from Amarillo will go down and spend some time with him. Of course, my Dad's wife (they celebrated their 1-year anniversary last month) will be with him through all of this, too. And, he is surrounded by many good friends from the congregation they attend, too.

I know that over the course of time everyone makes prayer requests for their loved ones. I guess it is just my turn. I trust in the power of prayer (read James 5:13-18). Please pray for my dad. Thank you.
