

Swaim said grain samples should consist of one gallon and then the sample may be shown anywhere. All foreign matter, cracked grains and diseased grains should be removed as well as have grains of about uniform size. Heads of grain, fruit, and vegetables should be of uniform size and at the stage of growth and maturity desired for proper use of the product including free from blemishes and good color-
