Nevertheless, a few isolated cases have reported that they are receiving little or no reception. The poor reception area seems to be centered around the Kelton area. Shamrock reports good reception.

A mobile unit equipped with a nine ft. tower and a T-24 Trio UHF antenna, a standard 17" portable television set, and a B-T Converter, has been touring the county this week, in an attempt to learn just how far the signal is reaching and to check on the reception in the different areas.

Monday evening the mobile unit along with this reporter, headed straight East out of Wheeler on highway 152 toward the Oklahoma line. The first reception check was made on the state line. A good picture was received, however, it contained quite a bit of
