Simmons Market Research Bureau says that
Christian stations play to the largest concentrated audience of homemakers among all formats $(56.6 \%)$. In a study completed in the Spring of 1986, Soma Communications, Inc. found that the majority of Christian radio listeners reside in popular in the Southern part of the United States The discovery was also made that more rural residents listen to Christian radio than urban residents, percentage-wise. $59.6 \%$ of the
