children between the ages of 2 and 5 the HIB immunization. HIB stands for Haemophilus Influenza B. This is a bacteria that causes many infections
in children, including meningitis in children, including meningitis,
skin, bone and joint infections, skin, bone and joint infections, pneumonia, epiglottitis, and ear
infections. Unfortunately, this immunization will not prevent ear infections, but it will decrease the chance of these other infections when caused by HIB. So, every child
between the ages of 2 and 5 that hasn't received this immunization should be taken to your physician for this very important preventative measure. If you have any questions, submit them to:
