A Pettit Jury was called in Tuesday, the behalf of the City of Wheeler in June 30, at 9:00 a.m. in 31st Judicial District Court for the selection of a jury for the trial of Danny Carr of this resolution is on file in the city Arizona. The hot temperature of summer often reflects the "hot temperatures" of children. "Free" time and increased interaction during summer holidays provide many opportunities for youngsters to find themselves at odds with friends, brothers and sisters, and

Instead of giving up or losing patience with children, try following these suggestions from the National Institute of Mental Health:

\*Find children's positive behavior and \*Provide physical outlets for child-

ren's abundance of energy. \*Plan surroundings and situations so undesired behaviors are less likely to

occur. \*Help children understand the cause of stressful situtaions so they can

learn to respond properly. \*Use physical restraint when necessary, but explain the reasons behind

\*Set a few limits as possible, in terms children understand.

\*Accept childrens' angry feelings and offer appropriate ways for them to express their anger.

\*Encourage children to see themselves as valued people.

\*Express affection and help children understand your love and concern. \*Set good examples because adult actions are powerful influences.

Parents may find the summer season offers more opportunities than desired to teach children how to deal with anger and frustration. Hopefully, with understanding and patience, parents and children can benefit from their increased interactions and gain on self control.







#### SUMMERTIME FUUD SAFETT

Summer is a time for taking food out to the porch, the park, and the beach. Not remembering food safety on these outings can lead to food poisioning, which is no picnic.

Food safety begins at the grocery store. Pick up poultry and meat last, and get them home and stored in the refrigerator as soon as possible.

If leaving home for a cookout, pack wisely. Make sure the cooler is well insulated and has enough ice to keep the food cold.

Before barbequing, make sure everything is clean, from hands to cooking utensils to preparation surfaces. A quick wash with hot soapy water will do. Use separate cutting boards and utensils for raw and cooked food, or wash them thoroughly between uses. Make sure to wash hands often to avoid "cross contamination."

Never use the same plate for cooked meat or poultry that once had raw meat or poultry on it, unless it has been thoroughly washed in hot, soapy

The flu like symptoms of food poisoning are unwelcome picnic guests. Foodborne illnesses can be prevented by handling food wisely.



All children are invited between the ages of 4 and 14! Parents may sit in too if you like.



\* "Sugar-free" products cannot contain any nutritive carbohydrate that any ingredient added to enhance sweetner, such as sucrose, maltose, the color of the product is considered honey, fruit juice, molasses, etc.

\* "Low-Calorie" products contain no more than 40 calories per serving and no more than 0.4 calories per

## **Area Farmers Are Invited To File**

Wheeler, Hemphill and Roberts Farmers are invited to run for county committee Wheeler, TX. Eligible farmers in Wheeler, Hemphill and Roberts counties are invited to become nominees for the Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) county committee, FmHA County Supervisor, John D. Wolf III announced today.

As a result of the 1985 Farm Bill, two of the three members of the FmHA county committees must be elected. The third member is designated by FmHA. The county committee assists the FmHA county office in determining the eligibility of applicants for certain types of FmHA loans.

Generally, farmers who are residents of these counties but not FmHA borrowers are eligible to become nominees for the FmHA county committee.

'Farmers in these counties, serving on the committee, play an important role by assisting in the process of loan applications and reviews," said Wolf. For this election one member will

be elected for a term of three years. Nominating petitions must be returned to the FmHA Wheeler county office by July 22, 1987.

Additional information and application forms for those who are interested in becoming nominees for the county committee are available at the FmHA county office, 112 West Oklahoma, or by calling 826-3280.
