took her to a fancy restaurant where the waitress handed her the check by mistake. "I almost fainted when I saw the cost of that meal," she said. "Oh, goodness," I told him. "I could prepare just as good a meal at home
for a fourth of the cost!" So a friendly wager was made and Alyne's winning recipe is the result.
