



One Vehicle Wreck 3 Injured, 2 Local

A one vehicle accident was investigated Sunday, June 21. Three individuals were injured when a 1976 Chevrolet pickup missed a curve 3 miles north of Shamrock on Highway

Rhonda Hill, 16, and Ricky Markham, 26, were taken to Amarillo after treatment at Shamrock General Hospital and listed critical condition. Hill was taken to St. Anthony's Hospital and Markham was taken to Northwest Texas Hospital. Markham is reported to be improving.

The driver of the vehicle, Wesley Steen, 20, remains at Shamrock hospital with minor injuries.

According to the investigating officer, Patrolman Kevin King, the accident occured about 6:20 a.m.. The pickup was northbound on Highway 83 and failed to negotiate a left hand curve. The vehicle left the roadway and hit a tree, headon. The three occupants remained in the pickup. Both Shamrock's volunteer ambulance service and fire departments were called to the scene. Steen and Hill were removed from the vehicle and transported to the hospital, but both Wheeler and Shamrock fire departments worked to remove Markham from the cab.

Land Bd. Announces **Forfeited Land Sale**

According to Arthur Wells, Veterans Service Officer for Wheeler County, the Veterans Land Board has announced another forfeited land sale, and that information on the 265 tracts of state land included in the August high-bid sale of the forfeited veterans' tracts is now available. Located in more than 110 Texas counties, the tracts range in size from ten acres to a 57.6 acre tract in Lamb County.

All tracts are open to bids from veterans, and some designated tracts may also be bid on by non-veterans. Bids may be placed on more than one tract and the Veterans Land Board will finance the full amount of the winning bid, less a five percent downpayment. A \$25 non-refundable fee on each tract has been set by the Texas Veterans Land Board.

The sale will be by sealed bid only with a minimum bid set by the Veterans Land Board. All bids must be received by the Board before 10:30 a.m. on August 17, 1987, at which time the bidding will close. Any and all bids received after that time and date will not be considered. Bidders need not be present at the bid opening, which is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. on August 17, 1987, in Room 831 of the Stephen F. Austin Building at 1700 N. Congress, Austin, Texas.

Texas veterans submitting winning bids will pay an interest rate of 8.75 percent, while winning bids from non-veterans will finance at 10.25 percent. Both will carry a thirty year assuma' le fixed-rate loan.




