today, if our gallant comrades had not been willing to suffer the supreme sacrifice. They did not die in vain; no American will ever have died in vain outside of the school. as long as our nation remains free.

In the spring of 1919, amidst complete devastation, the poppies bloomed in abundance on the battlefields of France, "Flanders Field". Many of our men had fallen in battle there, and a replica of this poppy became the Memorial Flower of the American Legion Auxiliary.

The American Legion was the first to adopt the poppy as its Memorial Flower at the National Convention in Cleveland, September 27-29, 1920. The American Legion Auxiliary adopted the poppy as its Memorial Flower as its organizing convention held in Kansas City in October, 1921. When one is pinned with a poppy during the Memorial Day Activities, that person is wearing a flower that is an emblem of faith; faith which is being kept with all who died, through service to the living.

This year the American Legion Auxiliary salutes the slogan, "Honor the Dead and Aid the Disabled" in the tangible way, with the American Legion Memorial Poppy. Temple V.A. medical center patients and domiciliary residents assist in this program by making the red crepe poppies one, two, three or more petals at a time. The petals are wrapped around a center of green. As Bobbie Ayers, Arnoldo Gonzalez Unit #486, Zapata, TX. wrote a poem about the poppy;

"The poppy is more than a flower, that blooms is more than a flower, that blooms in Flanders Field. It is a Memorial Flower, for men who would not yield." So during the week of May 19 through May 30, 1987, when you see a poppy, remember what it means. It is a symbol, of those who cared, the men who dreamed, fought and died for freedom.

Beginning May 19, some of our local Auxiliary members will sell poppies, in return for any donation; to repay the disabled veterans who made them, with the reminder of the poppy monies, being used by the West-Passon Post #138 for needs of local veterans widows and children.
