## New 6-Col Format For 'Times' July 5 Edition

The Thursday, July 5, edition of The Wheeler Times will be the first time for the new 6-column format. The new layout was suggested by the American Newspaper Publishers Association and will offer wider columns for copy and advertisements.

The wider columns, 2 1/16 inches, should be easier to read with less hyphenated words. The column width is to be standard over the nation, making possible for advertising agencies to prepare material which will fit in any newspaper.

The cost of advertising for the page, 1/2 page and 1/4 will remain the same. The 33% increase per column inch from \$1.69 to \$2.25 reflects the fewer inches per page. The size of the standing ads has been adjusted for the cost to remain the same—a 2 column by 2" ad this week will be widened and shortened to a 2 column by 1 1/2" ad, etc.

When the "Times" was printed here, using press or hot type, the 7 columns were 2" wide. In 1963, the paper switched to offset or cold type and the format was changed to

8 (1 13/16") columns. The width of the page has changed with the paper companies making the rolls of newsprint more narrow. The columns in this edition of the "Times" are 1 5/8" wide.

The classified page will continue to use 8 columns with the column width being reduced to 1 1/2".

It is hoped the news will be easier to read and the advertisements more attractive.

## CANADIAN PLANS CELEBRATION

Canadian's Fourth of July celebration will lead off with a performance of the annual rodeo on Monday night, July 2, beginning at 8 o'clock, two more rodeo performances will be held, one on Tuesday evening at 7 o'clock, and one in the afternoon at 2 o'clock on July 4th.

The Rodeo, which dates from 1888 and lays claim to having been the first Amateur Rodeo anywhere, will feature

saddle bronc riding, bareback riding, bull riding, bulldogging, calf roping and girls barrel racing. An added feature this year, in addition to the six traditional events, will be a wild cow milking contest for teams of three "white collar" businessmen.

In addition to the annual rodeo, a full schedule of other activities is planned, beginning with a Chamber of Commerce breakfast on July 3rd at

6:45 at Raney's Steakhouse. The Rodeo Dance, featuring Doug Collins and The West Texas Express, will be at the City Auditorium from 9 o'clock on the morning of the 4th at the Canadian night school parking lot and will begin promptly at 10 o'clock. After the Parade, at approximately 11 o'clock, a contest will be held to find the girl most likely to have "skool between her teeth." The song is a take-off of the newly released song by Tony Glenn by that name. Singer/song writer Glenn will be here from Nashville that day to judge the contest, which is open to anyone who wants to enter. Contestants must be at the Parade Line-Up by 9 o'clock to enter.

A Barbeque lunch will be served by the Canadian Rodeo Association on the Courthouse Lawn, starting at noon. Tickets purchased for the Barbeque may also be used for the afternoon performance of the Rodeo. The Barbeque will also be served to the oldtimers at their annual Reunion in the City Auditorium, registration for the Reunion will begin at 11 o'clock that morning.

Activities on the 4th at the City Park will begin at 3:30 that afternoon with a free hot dog feed and concert featuring four bands, all sponsored by KABL 6. The annual Fireworks display, which is sponsored by the City of Canadian and the volunteer Fire Department, will begin at the City Park at 9:30.

## Home Freezing Hints

Your home freezer can be a real time-saver for today's busy lifestyle. Besides storing meats, fruits and vegetables, you can use your freezer for make-ahead items such as casseroles, main dishes, food for entertaining, snacks or even entire meals packed individual portions.

A frozen food item will only be as good as the original product, so choose vegetables, fruits and meats of good quality. Be sure to follow recommended procedures for preparing foods for freezing, such as blanching fresh vegetables.

Also take the following precautions:

- Check the temperature of your freezer with a freezer thermometer to be sure it is 0 degrees F. or below.

- Prevent freezer burns of frozen foods by using containers or materials designed for the freezer. Use moisture-vapor-proof plastic bags and wraps, freezer wrap, freezer containers or heavy-duty foil.

- After foods are packaged for the freezer, date foods with an "expiration date" according to maximum storage times. Storing foods for longer

periods is not dangerous as long as proper temperature is maintained, but the flavors and textures of foods may deteriorate.

For recipes and more information on home canning, freezing, drying, making jams, jellies, and preserves and on pickle making, contact Linda Daughtry, County Extension Agent (Home Economics), at 826-5243, Box 505, Wheeler, Texas 79096. If you would like to have your pressure canner tested, free of charge, you may bring it by the Extension office (2nd floor of the Wheeler County Courthouse). Please

bring the entire cooker and allow one half day for testing. Educational programs conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service serve people of all ages regardless of socio-economic level, race, color, sex, religion, or national origin.

I am now doing my second stint in Parkview. I'm not really unhappy here, but I can sure think of a lot of things I need to do. I rather like to watch the clock-work routine, not even the girl that brings the pill tray never misses a turn. I'm grateful for that because at home, where I have to depend on my own thinking I am likely to miss a pill or two. So again I'm grateful.

For a long time I've been wanting to write something about Friendship but it is a subject almost too big for me to handle. It is certainly not something that is new under the sun. I don't have a story at hand about a friendship of pre-historic people, but we all know about the tie between David and Jonathan, many years before the birth of Christ. It is a thing that is not restricted to an age, because small children make friends that lasts a lifetime. The very rich and the very poor develop this lasting relationship. I would not vouch for a friendship among wicked people, but in good people the roots of friendship go very deep. What is it then that makes a friendship. My answer would be, "The Love of God." We are told that God is Love. So it seems to me that He is the source of friendship.

A weekend trip by my friend and neighbor, Hestell Killingsworth, brought the thought of lasting friendship to me. Mr. Adams remarked, after he knew Clarence well, that he had doubted that he could ever have another friend like Jessie. But Clarence had filled that place. Some time in the 1940's the Adams moved to a farm near Plainview. Hestell and Clarence visited them as often as they could, knowing that they would have a hearty welcome. The couples sang together and attend group singings. Five years ago, Cora lost Moodie about a year ago, Hestell lost Clarence. Those hardships and grief did not break the bonds of friendship. Last weekend Hestell drove to Plainview and visited with Cora, who has given up the farm and moved into town. Such a wonderful and satisfying visit these women had; What is a friendship anyway?

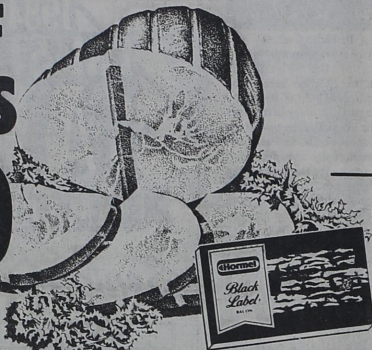

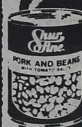
