### 31 Years of Service . . .



**RETIREMENT:** When her shift is over at midnight Friday, December 31, Myrtle Dorman will enter retirement after spending 31 years as dispatcher for the Wheeler County Sheriff's Department. Myrtle began her duties in 1951 when her husband took oath of office as Sheriff; until the Shamrock dispatch was installed in the 1960's she was the only dispatcher in the county. Mrs. Dorman remained Wheeler's only dispatcher until 1977 when her husband retired and the job was divided into shifts. Myrtle received recognition for her work in 1957 when she was awarded a pistol by the Globe News as an Outstanding Officer; as a result of a shootout east of Shamrock, a manhunt was underway and Myrtle remained at her post around the

Friday marks the end of 1982—a year of progress for Wheeler.

The Wheeler Care Center should be taking patients by Monday at the latest; this is a 90 bed facility with a number of rooms reserved for individuals who need only someone to cook and monitor their medication. Wheeler will see a few of their senior citizens return home and will no longer have to watch "home folks" leave because we offered no place for them to go after they were unable to care for themselves.

Dr. James H. Roe, M.D., has moved to Wheeler and is now practicing at Parkview Hospital and Clinic. Dr. Roe will make the load lighter for Dr. Barbour and Dr. Mendiola.

Drs. Simmons and Simmons of Pampa have opened an office at 601 S. Canadian in Wheeler. One of the optometrists is in the office each Tuesday for appointments.

Sweetwater Creek Dam is back on the drawing board with a vote scheduled for 1983. The Texas Legislature is to receive a bill establishing the Wheeler County Water District at the first of the session. A county-wide bond election will be scheduled on the \$21 million plus dam project. The Sweetwater project has been in the mill since 1960.

A new airport is also on the drawing board. The land, 4 miles east of Wheeler, should be deeded over to the City by the end of the week. The greater portion of the funds for the project should come from the state with local individuals donating time and labor toward the completion of the new facility.

The year, 1982, also saw the peak and decline of the oil industry in the county. Activity is expected to increase after the first of the year but we have seen the peak.

### Fed. Land Bank Rate Is Lowered

Interest rates on Land Bank variable rate loans will be reduced to 11.25 percent on farm loans and to 11.75 percent on farm-related business and rural residence loans, said Talmadge P. Porter, president of the Federal Land Bank Association of Childress.

These rates become effective January 1, 1983.

"The Land Bank's objective is to provide credit to Texas agriculture at the lowest possible cost, consistent with sound business practices," said Thomas H. Benson, president of the Federal Land Bank of Texas in Austin.

"For over two years the Bank's average cost of funds consistently has been higher than the loan rate," Benson continued. "However, for the past four months, we have begun to see a decline in bond costs."

"As a result of this decline, we are able to reduce the Bank's loan interest rate," he said. "We hope that the decline in bond interest rates will continue, allowing us to make further reductions in the loans rate."

The Federal Land Bank Association of Childress makes long-term real estate loans on farm and rural residence property in the counties of Childress, Hall, King, Cottle, Donley, Wheeler, and Collingsworth.
