Breakfast And Lunch Program
82-83 SCHOOL YEAR
Wheeler I.S.D. breakfast and lunch prices for this school year will be the same as last year. Breakfast for all grades K-12th will be 25 cents and adults will be 60 cents. Lunch prices for K-4th will be 55 cents, 5th-12th grades will be 65 cents and adults will be \$1.25. Advance meal tickets will be available for students and adults to be purchased for ten meals. Prices for a ten-meal ticket will be: Breakfast K thru 12th—\$2.50 and adult—\$6.00, lunch tickets for K thru 4th—\$5.50, 5th thru 12th—\$6.50 and adult—\$12.50. Buying meal tickets in advance will greatly improve the efficiency of the lunch room program. Free and reduced forms will again be available for students and will need to be filled out by parents and returned to the school as soon as possible. Students and adults will only be able to charge meals for one month and then their bill must be paid or they will not be allowed to charge the next month. This policy change is due to overdue bills from last year that would accumulate over several months of unpaid charges. Please take note of this change in lunch room policy and the availability of the prepaid meal tickets for your convenience.
