Combating Laundry-Product

Does your laundry have more stains after washing or drying than before you start-

Laundry products themselves could be the emies."

Three "weapons" to combat laundry-product stains will make the family washday a more "peaceful" event.

Rusty Water Stains Rust in the water supply can cause yellowish or brownish stains on clothing that has just

been washed. Don't use chlorine bleach it will make the stain more intense.

Use a commercial rust remover instead. Before you use one, though, check the label for any warnings about use in the washer.

Liquid Fabric Softeners Liquid fabric softeners can stain clothes when in direct

contact with fabric. Blue-colored softeners create a bluish or grayish stain. White or pink softeners cause a grease-like stain.

Sometimes these grease-like stains are mistakenly identified as grease leaking from the washer.

These stains - from fabric softeners - are not perma-You can remove these stains

by dampening the stains first. rubbing it with bar soap and then rewashing the item.

To prevent these stains in the first place, use caution when you add a liquid fabric softener to the wash. Never pour fabric softener directly onto any fabric.

Dryer-ADDED SOFTERNERS Dryer-added fabric softeners sometimes create oily looking stains or flecks, especially on solid-color permanent-press polyesters and

This happens particularly in cases of overloading, underloading or adding a fabricsoftener sheet after the dryer has been in operation for a

To remove these stains, rub with bar soap and then relaunder the article.

Tax Statement

By Charles Buzzard

If you are disabled and qualify for the Residence Homestead Exemption, you are entitled to receive an additional exemption of \$10,000 off the market value for your residence homestead. This exemption applies to

school taxes only. 'Disabled' for purposes of actions, not just his words. this exemption means either that, because of physical or mental disability, you are unable to engage in any substantial gainful work; or that you are 55 years of age or older and blind, and by reason of the blindness you are unable to engage in your previous work.

If you are receiving disability Insurance Program administered by the Social Security Administration, you living. will qualify as long as you apply on time.

If you are receiving disability benefits under any other program, you will not en sponsored to High School automatically qualify. must still meet the definition the hospital waiting room, of disability stated previously Parkview Clinic and several and apply before April 30.

You may not receive both Over-65 Exemption and the Hunter. Disability Exemption. You

must choose one or the other. Any country, city, school district, special district may, by a vote of its governing body, offer this local option Disability Exemption. The same qualifications for this exemption is the same as the \$10,000 exemption.

Are you a Disabled Veteran or Qualifying Survivor? If so, you may qualify for the Disabled Veteran Exemption. More about this exemption next week.




