For Windbreaks Because of the tremendous response to last year's windbreak tree planting program, the Wheeler County Soil and Water Conservation District is once again taking orders for windbreak tree seedlings from the Colorado State Forest Ser-

vice. These trees will be ordered weekly, with delivery expected in mid-March. Tree seedlings will be available in both potted and bare-rooted condition. The following varieties will be avialable barerooted: Caragana, Honeysuckle, Lilac, Plum, Sage, Sand Cherry, Nanking Cherry, Ash, Chinese Elm, Cottonwood, Narrowleaf Cottonwood, Golden Willow, Hackberry, Honeylocust, Russion Olive, Poplar, Austrian Pine, Ponderosa Rine, Scotch Pine,

Mountain Juniper, and Colorado Blue Spruce. The following trees will be available in pots: Austrian Pine, Lodgepole Pine, Ponderosa Pine, Scotch Pine, Douglas Fir, White Fir, Eastern Red Cedar, Rocky Mountain Juniper, Engelmann Spruce, Colorado Blue Spruce, and

Eastern Red Cedar, Rocky

Pinion Pine. The bare-rooted trees will cost \$.45 each, with a minimum order of 100 trees (50 of any one variety). Potted trees will cost \$.75 per tree, minumum order of 30 trees of one variety. Trees must be paid for in advance. Orders must be placed at the Soil Conservation Service office in WheelAnnual banquet in January.
