



Basic Facts About Fire Detectors

Two types of fire detectors are available for home use: heat detectors and smoke detectors. Smoke detectors alone when properly located and maintained, offer the minimum level of safety recommended by the National Fire Protection Association. Smoke detectors operate on either of two different principles, photoelectric and ionization, in reacting to the products of co oustion.

At least two-thirds of the deaths in home fires stem from inhalation of smoke and toxic gases. These deadly combustion products will activate a properly located and maintained smoke detector, awakening the household and allowing time for escape.

Since most home fire deaths occur at night and since smoke rises, it makes sense to install a smoke detector outside the sleeping areas of your home on or near the ceiling.

The best location is in the hallway near your home's bedrooms. Fires generally start in the living areas or in the kitchen. The smoke detector should be in the hallway between these areas and the bedrooms. If yours is a large or multi-level home, you should serioulsy consider installing two or more smoke detectors.

In NFPA's standard on "Household Fire Warning Equipment," the minimum protection is a smoke detector to protect each sleeping area plus one on each additional story of the home.

Guidelines for Detector Purchase and Installation

Both placement and type of sound must be given great consideration. There are two types of warning sounds for you to choose from: the constant horn-type sound found or nost smoke detectors or the siren-type warning sound. This siren sound is the same type used on fire, police and other emergency vehicles.

2. Don't install your smoke detector in front of air registers. Your location should be away from windows or doors that create high velocity air



DROUGHT. There is probably Mr. and Mrs. Terry Hall and no word in the English language that arouses more worry and fear amoung farmers and ranchers. Most people are more than willing to fight the majority of problems associated with farm and ranch opera- 21 tion but sometimes drought looks unfightable. At present, Texas is experiencing a drought of varying intensity. In some areas the conditions could become as critical as they were during the worst of the 1950's.

"The lessons learned from the droughts of the 30's and the 50's have resulted in conservation stocking rates for most ranchers since that time" according to Charles Coffman, Range Conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service in Wheeler. "However, conservation stocking is not enough to enable ranchers to survive the bad effects of a drought without damage to the forage resource. This is the reason a drought plan is such an important part of any sound ranching operation."

Drought plans provide for controlled reduction of livestock numbers before forage supplies are deleted. A sound drought plan should consider when the plan will be initated. The plan should be inititated early enough that forage resource does not suffer permanent damage. the dates will vary with each ranching operation and forage resource.

In addition, the rancher should consider exactly what action will be taken as a result of the drought. Will all or a percentage of the livestock be sold?
