

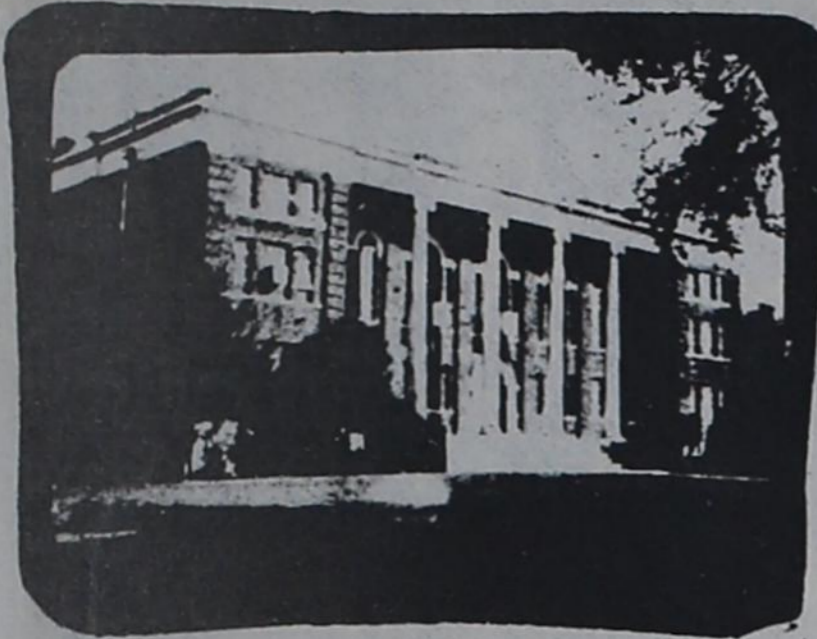

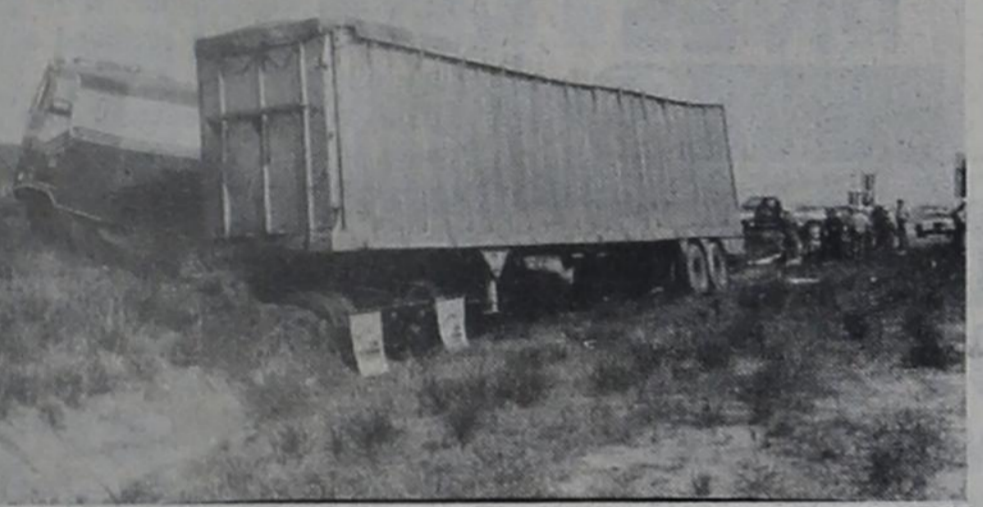
TRAFFIC ACCIDENT CLAIMS LIFE OF MYRTLE H. JONES

A car-truck accident at 10:15 Monday morning claimed the life of an Allison woman and seriously injured her husband. The accident occurred one mile east of Briscoe at the intersection of highway 83 and 1046 Myrtle H. Jones, 69, a passenger in the automobile driven by her husband was killed instantly when the vehicle was struck by a semi-truck. The Jones auto, traveling west, pulled onto highway 83 at the Briscoe turn-off and was struck by a southbound truck.

Lloyd L. Jones, 70, was treated at the scene and taken by ambulance to Parkview Hospital.

Jones was determined to have numerous internal injuries and was transferred immediately to St. Anthony's Hospital in Amarillo. Jones remains at St. Anthony's where his condition is reported improved.

The driver of the truck, Kenneth L. Bates of Shadduck, Okla., was treated at Parkview Hospital for shock and released.



Bill Stiles Jr. Will Receive Degree

William Gordon Stiles, Jr. of Wheeler is among 209 persons scheduled to receive baccalaureate degrees in May and August from Wayland Baptist College.

Stiles will be awarded the Bachelor of Science in Occupational Education degree. Formal commencement ceremonies for May and August graduates are scheduled for Saturday, May 16, at 10 a.m. in Wayland's Herral Memorial Auditorium. Degrees will be conferred on May graduates at that time, while candidates for graduation in August will receive their diplomas upon completion of their course of study, although they will participate in Saturday's ceremonies.

Of the 209 members of the Class of 1980, 63 will receive the Bachelor of Arts degree, 57 will be awarded the Bachelor of Science, six will receive the Bachelor of Music, and 83 will be awarded the Bachelor of Science in Occupational Education degree.

Wayland Baptist College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college dedicated to providing a quality education with an orientation that is positively Christian. It offers four degrees in 32 majors and 23 minor fields of study.

After nearly three-quarters of a century, Wayland - founded in 1908 - continues to maintain a strong enrollment, with almost 1,400 students attending classes this spring.

KELTON YOUTH IS KILLED IN TRACTOR ACCIDENT

An accident Saturday morning claimed the life of an 11-year-old Kelton boy. Ralph Benard Alves, was run-over by a tractor tire when he fell from the fender about 11:30.

Ralph and a 12-year-old friend were taking a tractor down a country road, 4 miles east and two south of Kelton. The front tire of the tractor "blew-out," causing the driver to lose control; the right side of the tractor climbed a 3-foot embankment. Ralph fell from the left fender in front of the tire and was apparently killed instantly.

The friend ran some distance, 1/2 mile or more, for help. Justice of Peace, Charley Whiteley, pronounced Alves dead at the scene.

Funeral services for Alves were held at 11 a.m. Tuesday at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Shamrock with Father B. A. Erpen, pastor, officiating. Pall bearers were Gary Clements, Melvin Green, Dean Johnson, and Gayle Singleton. Honorary pallbearers were members of Boy Scout Troop #287.

Watch Hemlines
To Predict Economic Trends
 You can watch hemlines and sometimes actually predict the nation's economy.
 Researchers say much of our behavior depends on the economic climate of the times—and hemlines are part of that behavior.

As economic upswings occur, women raise their dress lengths. As hard times approach, they are lowered.
 One theory predicts that economics in the western world flow in long-term cycles of 45-60 years.
 In this type of cycle, there are about 30 years of economic climbs — and about 15-20 years of hard times.
 Behavior and economics work like this:

Economic Upswings

During economic upswings, several things happen.
 That's the time for social revolutions—a period in which younger generations rebel against established traditions and norms.
 People, in general, adopt attitudes which show a striking contrast to those held a few years earlier.
 On a more personal level, people tend to liberate themselves from conventional behavior.
 For example, divorce rates increase, publications of sex magazines increase, and scandals are more likely to be uncovered.
 This is a period of time in which people can and do enjoy

the pleasures of life.
 This also tends to be a productive period for the arts and the social sciences, because there is time, money and energy which can be devoted to these areas.
 In addition, people who have stable economic resources can more easily take risks.
 They feel more confident about their own powers, and they believe they have control over their own destiny.
Watch Hemlines
 During economic upswings, people also believe that life can be made better, and injustices, therefore, are less tolerated.
 As a result of all this, the political climate changes, too, to one of individualistic capitalism.
Economic Hard Times
 When the economy becomes unstable, the nation's personality also changes.
 People become disenchanted

with capitalism, and they sway toward socialistic policies.
 On the whole, there is much less tolerance of unusual social behavior.
 Young people regain respect for the older generations, the traditional attitudes and behaviors.
 Marriages and family life take on a "new meaning", and they become stronger units of society.
 Mobility of people slows down, and families spend more time together at home.
... And Hemlines
 And here's where the hemlines change.
 Women tend to lower their

skirts (and pursue the women's movement "underground") during hard times.
So, Watch
 Now that we better understand the tie in, we can take up "hemline watching" just to help sort out the reasons why people are behaving as they are.
 Extension serve people of all ages regardless of socio-economic level, race, color, sex, religion or national origin.

Random Winds by Belva Plain (author of Evergreen) Delcorte Press. 496 pp.

Random Winds is a powerful American saga about three generations of doctors in the proud Farrell family. First there is Enoch, the dedicated country doctor who ignores the winds of change; then Martin, his son, a brilliant, charismatic neurosurgeon, whose enduring love for the woman he can never have almost brings his ruin; and Claire, his beautiful, flamboyant daughter, who tries to turn her back on convention and finds the price too high.

From a quiet turn-of-the-century village in upstate New York to elegant parties at the gracious Lamb House estate outside of London from the bedsides of the rural poor to the frenetic emergency room of a major New York City hospital, from war-torn London to sleepy lovers' hideaways on the French Riviera, **Random Winds** sweeps the reader along in an absolutely unforgettable story of the trials and triumphs of a renowned neurosurgeon, of a dynamic family struggling to hold its center, and, most of all, of a love that no human force could suppress.

Random Winds is a great novel. I recommend it as well as **Evergreen**.

Moviola by Garson Kanin. Simon and Schuster. 446 pp.

In **Moviola** Garson Kanin has written the ultimate Hollywood novel, encompassing the whole dazzling story of the movie business, from its beginnings with the invention of the nickelodeon to today, with a glittering cast of characters that includes D. W. Griffith, Thomas Edison, Mach Sennett, Charlie Chaplin, Fatty Arbuckle, Greta Garbo and John Gilbert, Louis B. Mayer, Irving Thalberg, Darryl F. Zanuck, Marilyn Monroe, David O. Selznick and almost every famous name and star in Hollywood history. At the heart of the novel is B.J. Farber himself, who has seen, known and done business with everyone from Edison on, and who now, at the age of ninety-two, rich, cantankerous and of sound mind, is negotiating (somewhat unwillingly) the sale of his famous studio to the head of a multibillion-dollar New York-based conglomerate. During the course of the negotiations, Farber reveals his life and his times, reliving the great, legendary past of Hollywood, all the famous stories that didn't happen the way we thought they happened—Farber was there: with Griffith during the making of **The Birth of a Nation**, with Mach Sennett when Charlie Chaplin invented his own screen character, with Fatty Arbuckle at the famous and scandalous party that ended Arbuckle's career and changed the mores of Hollywood, with Garbo during her arrival in Hollywood and her subsequent rise to fame, and there at the discovery of Marilyn Monroe decades later.

Farber has seen it all, and tells it all, including the story of his own life, his marriages, his children, and the upward climb to the top as the owner of one of Hollywood's biggest studios, a position which he may just possibly relinquish—but also maybe not—to the conglomerate who doesn't understand just how special the movie business is, who doesn't and can't love it the way Farber does.

Moviola is the most colorful, brilliant, inconoclastic, funny and moving novel about the movie business that anyone has ever written.

It is my understanding that **Moviola** is going to be a mini-series on TV this summer. COME READ WITH US!!!

Meeting About Grasshoppers
A meeting was held Thursday, May 15, in the District Courtroom to discuss the grasshoppers situation in Wheeler County, according to Don King, CEA.
According to adult counts last summer by USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) personnel, approximately 360,000 acre will be infested with economic levels of grasshoppers this summer. Eight grasshoppers per square yard is considered the economic level (that level at which it will pay to spray).
Under the control program sponsored by APHIS and the Texas Department of Agriculture, (TDA), APHIS, TDA and the land owner each pay one third of the cost of spraying. Tech cost to the landowner should be about 70 cents per acre this year.
Only range land and pastureland can be sprayed; cropland is not eligible. To qualify for the program there must be at least 10,000 acres in a sprayable block.
The program is using 8 oz. of malathion per acre. Although no kill rates are guaranteed, a kill rate of 60-70 percent can be expected in tall grass range with some brush. Kill rates can be high as 90-95 percent on smooth, short-grass range.
More than 7 million acres are expected to be infested in Texas this year and TDA has funds to spray 1.5 million acres. Therefore, it is important that land be signed up as soon as possible. A cut off date of June 3 has been set. By that date the land to be sprayed must be plotted on a map and money collected and on deposit in a bank.
Any producer who would like to sign up land to be sprayed or would like further information should contact Don King, CEA at 826-5243 or 826-3249 after office hours.
It is important that action be taken quickly if Wheeler County is to qualify for the program.
