### Television Viewers 'Consumer Alert'

Like what you see on TV? Do you approve of it? Some consumers don't approve of some programs, and they're taking outside action on behalf of children.

In citizens' groups they're going beyond simply setting guidelines at home.

Several groups have complained to networks and sponsors that the content of many prime-time TV shows is offensive and amply influence children adversely.

Some consumer groups have effectively boycotted advertisers who sponsor shows they say are offensive.

**Deciding Starts at Home** Deciding on appropriate shows starts with the consumer. Also, "comparing notes" with others can help.

Consumers can study ratings of such groups as the National Parent-Teacher Association.

Some groups that rate programs are:

### TAKING ACTION

What can consumers do if "changing channels" or "turning off the set" isn't quite enough?

They have several opportunities to voice their feelings to people who influence programming.

First, you can let advertisers know if you think they're sponsoring a program of dubious merit.

You can also tell them when you like programs they sponsor.

Likewise, if you object to their particular advertising style — or approve of it — let them know that, too.

**FORMAL COMPLAINTS**

Consumers also could consider filing a formal complaint with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), if they feel specific programing is not "in the public interest."

When the FCC was created in 1934, it said that programing must be "in the public interest."

Radio and television stations must renew their broadcasting licenses every three years.

As members of a community served by a station, consumers have a legal right to participate in the license-renewal process.

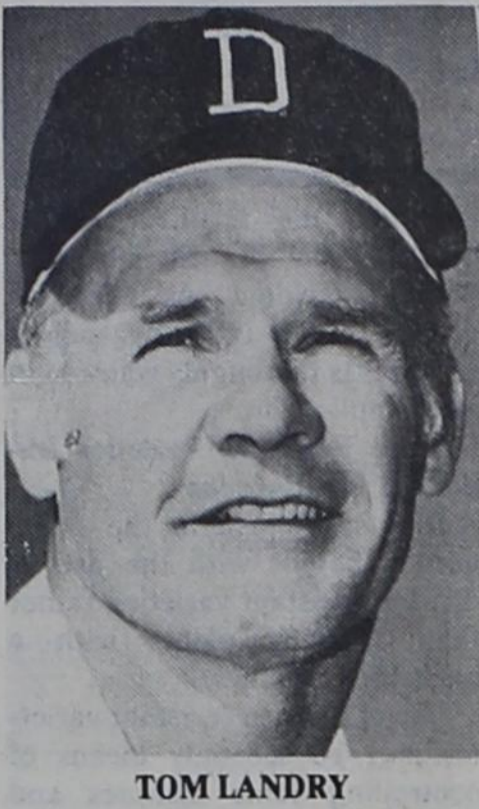

 Tom was born in Mission, Texas, on September 11, 1924. He was an All-Regional fullback at Mission High before enrolling at the University of Texas.  
 After one semester at Texas, Landry went into the Air Corps and flew 30 B-17 missions over Germany with the Eighty Air Force during World War II.  
 Following his discharge as a 1st Lieutenant in November 1945, Tom returned to Texas where he earned All-Southwest Conference honors as a junior and co-captained the Longhorns as a senior. Those Texas teams

defeated Alabama in the 1948 Sugar Bowl and Georgia in the 1949 Orange Bowl.  
 Landry joined the old New York Yankees of the All-America Conference in 1949, moving to the Giants in 1950. He was a mainstay in the Giants' defensive backfield through 1955, the last two years as player-coach. He was All-Pro in 1954.  
 Retiring as a player following the 1955 season, Tom was the Giants' defensive coach through 1959. Giants head coach Jim Lee Howell called him "the best defensive coach in the business."  
 Landry and his wife Alicia,

"The new challenge is what makes football interesting," the Cowboys' head coach said. "If you are winning the Super Bowl every year you don't have too much to look forward to. It will be easier to motivate the players this year, but it won't be easier to get back to the Super Bowl. That's what the challenge is all about."  
 For Landry, the dean of NFL coaches heading into his 21st season, it's just another in a long series of challenges that began in 1960 when the expansion Cowboys struggled to a 0-11-1 record.

"Any time you play the way we did last year, there's a weak point in your team," Landry said. "We have to make moves this year to bolster our team. And defense is an area we need to bolster. Last year we weren't able to control the game defensively."

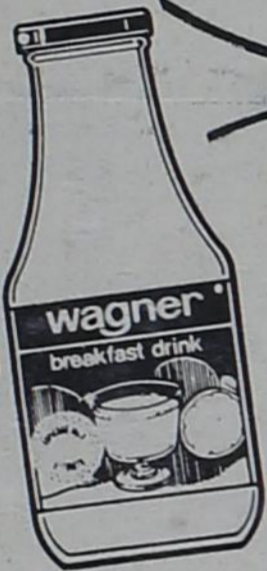

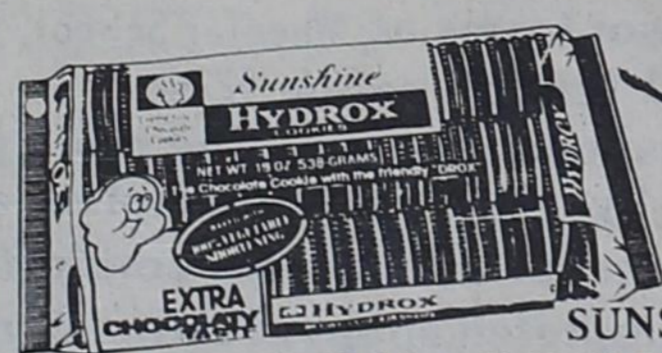
