Policies to guide the state's largest organization on the state level next year were adopted by the more than 1,100 voting delegates from 213 organized counties. Also approved were recommendations on national policies. These will be forwarded

Bobcat Tagging

Texas trappers and fur dealers are advised by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department that its bobcat pelts tagging program will continue despite a federal court order temporarily banning the export of bobcat pelts from the U.S.

The Defenders of Wildlife, Inc. (DOW) has filed suit in the U.S. Distirct Court for the District of Columbia against the Endangered Species Scientific Authority (ESSA), the federal agency which issues export licenses for bobcat pelts, alleging that continuation of the current licensing policy would be detrimental to the survival of the

Judge June L. Green issued a temporary restraining order effectively banning export of bobcat pelts and products taken in the U.S. during the 1979-80 season, pending the outcome of a hearing set for Dec. 3-5.

Ted Clark, the department's Wildlife Division Director, said there are no plans to modify the current tagging requirements in Texas at this time, pending the outcome of the litigation. The bobcat pelt tagging period is Nov. 15-Feb. 15.

Clark pointed out that Texas asked for, and received, an unlimited quota of bobcat pelt tags from the ESSA for the current season. "The resource is being managed," Clark said. "Bobcats are found in significant numbers virtually throughout Texas and they have not been threatened by hunting or trap-

He added that even if the export ban stays in effect throughout the season, the pelts still will be legal for domestic sale. Prices, however, may be affected if international sales are stopped, he said.
