## Wheeler ISD Tax Rate Decreased

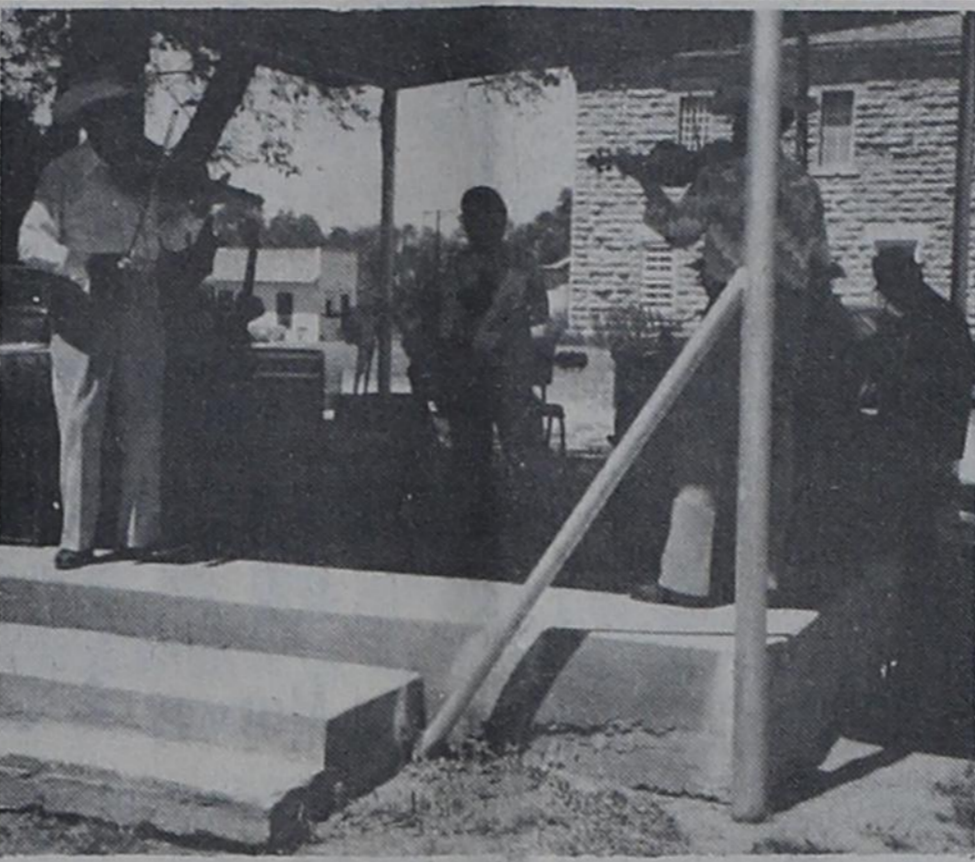
The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Wheeler ISD was held Thursday night, August 9.

The Board adopted the budget for the 1979-80 school year and set the tax rate at \$1.40. The new rate lowers the 1979-80 tax rate 15 cents.

The Board accepted the resignation of Bobby Hill and Linda Hogan and employed Steve Hutsell as a math and science teacher.

The Board of Trustees reviewed the personnel and student policies of the school and adopted the revisions of the policies for the 1979-80 school year. The First National Bank of Wheeler was selected as the depositing bank.

In other action, the Trustees authorized the purchase of a new vehicle for extra-curricular travel.

## CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

Saturday August, 11 1979 Wheeler County citizens gathered to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the organizing of Wheeler County.

The settling of the Texas Panhandle in Wheeler County began at Hide Town on Sweetwater creek in 1873 where buffalo hunters spread their hides to dry then stacked them for freighters from Dodge City, Kansas to pick up to ship to Eastern markets. Disturbances became so great from renegade Indians escaping from reservations that the United States Government established Fort Elliott two miles West of Hide Town near the bend of Sweetwater creek and one mile from the settlement of Sweetwater town. This was done to halt the Indians from murdering and stealing from cowmen who were trying to settle the luscious grassy area and make their homes.

It was one hundred years ago on April 12, 1879 that a few civic minded men met in Henry Fleming's Saloon one night and organized Wheeler County as a governing body as they were tired of being governed by officers of Fort Elliott.

According to court records Emanuel Dubbs was elected County judge. The county was named Wheeler in Honor of Royal T. Wheeler Chief Justice of the Texas Supreme Court. With the organizing this gave Wheeler jurisdiction over the 26 Panhandle Counties and the authority to break away from Clay County jurisdiction which was two hundred miles away at Henrietta, Texas.

Other officers elected were: Sheriff-Henry Fleming; Deputy Sheriff a Mr. Poe. Tax Assessor Collector-Mark Huselby; Treasurer-Frank Schick; Attorney-Moses Wiley; Surveyor-Travis Leach; Inspector Levi Schick. S.W. Cummins was appointed Justice of Peace for the unorganized County of Oldham. A.D. Tomb, elected County Clerk.

The Old Mobeetie Association, Wheeler County Historical Commission and Little Mobeetie Theatre got together with the Mobeetie Community where the making of Texas Panhandle history began and had a celebration commemorating the 100th anniversary of the organizing of Wheeler County.

A picnic lunch was served at noon, in the shade of the trees at the Mobeetie jail, with a few interested citizens and some visitors present. At about 1:30 musicians and visitors assembled under the arbor to enjoy music visiting and hearing speakers tell about early events of their relatives and first settlers. Chuck Hogan was master of cere-

monies. Names of the performers will be given by the Mobeetie News reporter, Wilbur Beck.

This was a very happy occasion for everyone present. The musicians consisted of fiddles, guitars and accordion and presented a program beautifully with their rare talent. The eldest member present was the only daughter living of Zack T. Miller who settled the Panhandle in 1879. There were visitors from far away, one was from Iowa.

A tour of the museum was begun at 4:00 which lasted until about 5:00 then all retired to rest for awhile to return at 8:30 for viewing the drama, "Old Mobeetie". All of this was free to everyone and we wish to extend many thanks to the Sheriff department, Mr. and Mrs. Lonnie Miller, Ky, Topaz and Kelley Kyseth, Reverend Hansard, Attorney, David Lewis (who so beautifully represented Temple Houston in the drama). Thanks to Mrs. Lonnie Miller as narrator, and each of the other persons who took part for the first time in the drama that was beautifully presented by them and the regular cast. Many thanks to Larry Lockwood of Elk City, Oklahoma for furnishing two sets of square dancers for the drama that really help to drama-

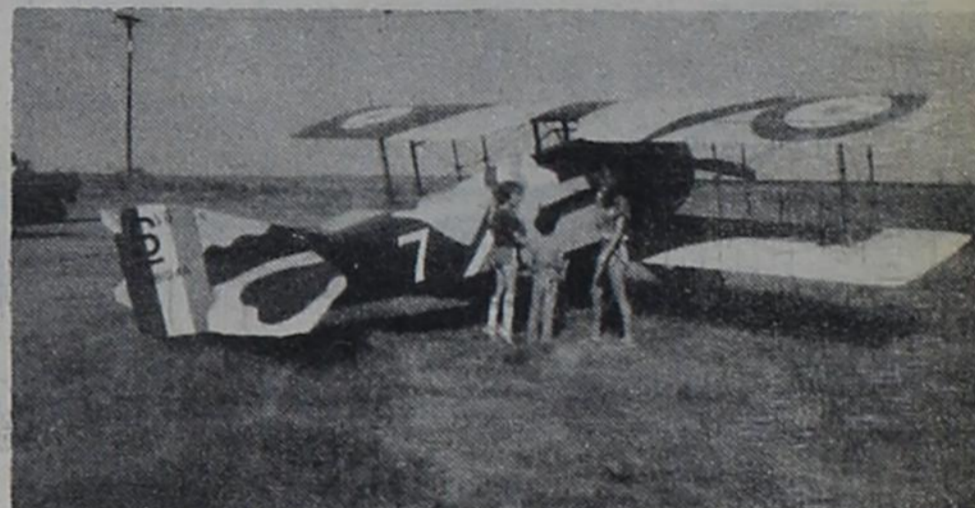
tize the scenes. At the end of the drama everyone joined together in singing, "God Bless America" to end the celebration. A great time was had by all, we wish you could have been there.
