The expansion of the business involved some negotiation, as the Hefley's liked their location and the only alternative was to

buy the other half of the building they occupied. Levi Reid agreed to sell the building and close Reid's Barber Shop -- a business he had owned and operated in Wheeler for years.

Jerry's Barbecue was closed and the expansion project was underway the first of May. The remodeling and renovation of the building included new ceiling, paneling, carpeting, kitchen equipment and furnishings.

After many hours of hard work by the Hefleys and several others who helped, the project was complete and Jerry's Barbecue was ready to open its doors for the second time in little over five months.

The menu handed the customers at Jerry's includes Bar-B-Q of all kinds, chicken fried steak, shrimp, charcoal burgers and salad bar. The food is prepared to eat either at Jerry's or for carry-out.

Fire can happen to YOU! This very year, on the basis of national averages, some home in your general neighborhood will be involved in fire. It could be YOURS.

Over a half-million American homes are hit by fire each year--60 homes every hour. More than 6,000 people, mostly the young and the aged, die in these fires--17 every day.

The tragedy is that virtually all this death and destruction is preventable--by making a habit of the simple rules of fire safety.

Score your knowledge of home fire safety on this check list. Then act to make YOURS a fire safe home. If you have questions, your Fire Department is a good place to go for help and advice. Be sure the whole family is in on the planning and the action - FOR FIRE SAFETY IS A FAMILY AFFAIR.

PRE-PLANNING FOR FIRE:  
Have you planned at least two ways to get out of every room in your house? Yes ( ) No ( )

Have you made-and do you rehearse regularly-exit plans with your family, including the children? Yes ( ) No ( )

## Farm Accident Injures Puryear

Harvey Puryear of Wheeler was released from High Plains Baptist Hospital in Amarillo Tuesday morning. Puryear was

taken to Amarillo by ambulance Wednesday afternoon, June 27, after being involved in a farm accident.

Harvey was working alone northeast of Briscoe Wednesday afternoon. He was applying anhydrous ammonia on some wheatland on his dad's place. While filling the tank, a hose or connection broke or came lose -- spraying Puryear in the face. It was necessary for him to disconnect the tractor from the equipment and drive himself to the house -- a distance of about a mile. Harvey's mother drove

him to Parkview hospital where he was treated and transferred to High Plains. Puryear received burns to the face, eyes and throat and was placed immediately in the intensive care unit of the hospital. He was taken from intensive care Sunday. At the present time it appears he will have no permanent damage from the accident, however his eyes are still sensitive to light.

## Tax Break For Wheeler Residents

The Wheeler ISD would like all of its taxpaying residents to take advantage of the new homestead exemption act.

A Homestead is defined as the place that you live whether you own the land it is on or not, i.e., a mobile home in a mobile home park. You must, of course, own the home. Anyone who files an application is entitled to receive an exemption a \$5,000.00 from the market value of their residence homestead for the purpose of school taxes. In addition, all persons who are 65 and over are disabled are entitled to an additional \$10,000 exemption from the market value of their residence homestead for a total of \$15,000.00 exemption.

To qualify for this exemption, you must sign a SIMPLE application form on or before July 16, 1979. These forms are available at the office Mr. Thurman Rives, Wheeler ISD Tax Assessor/Collector, located at the Rives Insurance Agency, 115 W. Texas, Wheeler, Texas. Phone 826-5224 for any more information or to answer any questions you may have.

Please take the small amount of time needed to sign up for this tax break. However, if you have already signed up there is no need to do so again.

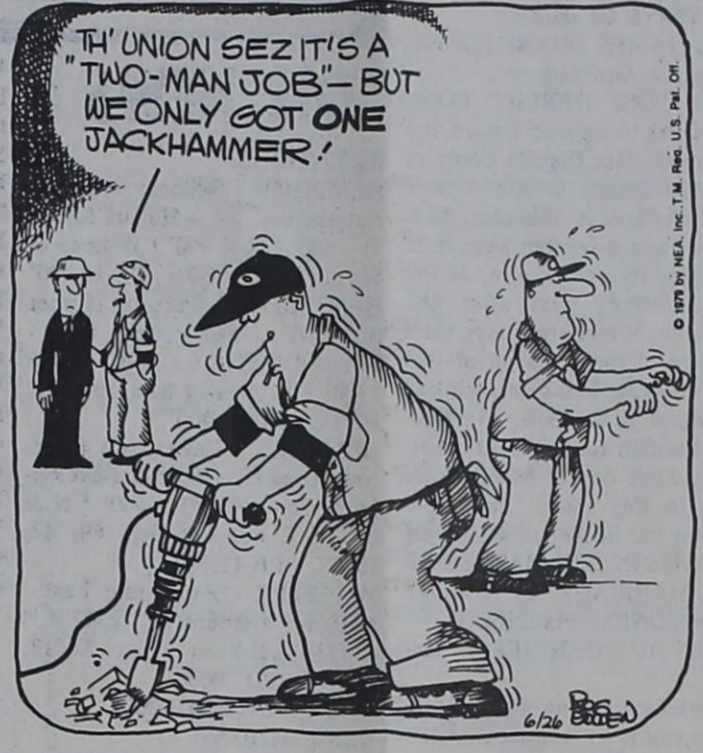

The high plains of the Texas Panhandle furnishes plenty of habitat for a wide variety of wildlife according to Stanley Brooks, Texas game warden, assigned to Moore and Sherman counties.

The biggest increase in game is the popular ring-necked pheasant that resides in the grain fields of Moore county. According to the P&WD warden, quail, dove, turkey, and deer are about normal in population. The warden has noted a decrease in the antelope herds during the last few months.

## TIMES FASHIONS

Very few landowners allow hunting of any kind in Moore county and Brooks stated that trespassing and road hunting are the two major problems.

Brooks has little public water in his area, but works the Lake Meredith Recreation Area where anglers find ample walleye, catfish, and white bass. The warden noted that smallmouth bass fishing is becoming very good at Meredith.

The Texas warden also works water safety on Lake Meredith and has found the lack of life preservers (PFD's) the most pressing violation.

The Moore county resident is a native of Roaring Springs and has been with the P&WD for 16 years upon graduating from the game warden school in June of 1963. Brooks has been stationed at Dumas for the past 12 years.

Brooks, along with his wife, Janie, and three children; 16-year-old James, 12-year-old Barry, and 8-year-old Quentin, reside in Dumas.
