When he went to turn the windmill off the electricity was running up the wire and down fences so bad he never did get the windmill off.

It was 4:00 in the afternoon when the cloud struck and came rolling in at 40 miles an hour with complete darkness and sand as fine as salt.

The worst thing most remember was the shortage of oxygen therefore the kids lay on the floor covered with wet sheets. When Ernest turned the calves into the cows they couldn't tell which was mama.

Looking at our lovely grain fields today we realize we have a lot to be thankful for.







Mrs. Aycock was born in Higgins and moved to Guymon from New Mexico in 1919. She married Dick Aycock in 1934.




