

## SPS Seeks Rate Increase

Southwestern Public Service Company announced today that it has filed for a general retail rate increase in the cities and counties served by the company in Texas.

The request was made with the cities and the Public Utility Commission of Texas on or about May 12, 1978 and the company is requesting that the increase become effective 35 days after the filing date.

It is expected that the proposed new rates will result in an increase of approximately 10 per cent for residential, commercial, industrial and school customers. This would result in an increase of about 8.8 per cent in the company's total revenues from Texas, or about \$22 million annually. Rates to wholesale customers and for retail service to municipal customers would not be affected.

Increased costs of building new power plants, as well as the increased costs of labor, material and fuel, are the major factors in the rate increase.

President Carter's signing of the Resources Conservation Act last November, which requires an appraisal and evaluation of the state's and nation's soil and water conservation program.  
 "The RCA act authorizes and directs the Secretary of Agriculture to develop a national soil and water conservation program in cooperation with the public, our local soil and water conservation district, the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board, and the Soil Conservation Service," said Zybach.

"This program will establish new direction for future soil and water conservation efforts in Texas, based on current soil, water and related resource appraisals," Zybach continued.  
 "One point I want to make clear is that districts in their 40-year history have always assisted landowners with voluntary conservation programs on their farms and ranches. We do not advocate any other approach since farm and ranch land is privately owned and that the interests and welfare of the owners must be served, and that programs must be acceptable to them," Zybach added.

Actions required by the RCA act include gathering data to appraise the condition and qual-

ity of Texas and the nation's soil and water resources by 1979.

The act also outlines a 5-year plan for the USDA's conservation assistance to districts and requires an evaluation of the effectiveness and progress of ongoing programs. Reports will be made to the public and to Congress.

"Our first meeting will primarily deal with discussions on soil and water resources in the district and how to conserve them," Zybach said. "The public will also have the oppor-

tunity to learn more about the RCA act and the mission, relationship, and responsibilities of the district, and of the Soil Conservation Service.

"I want to emphasize that a grass roots, bottom-up approach is the key to this act. Our district and the Soil Conservation Service will need to identify specific resource concerns and associated problems. We urge anyone with an interest in natural resource conservation to attend and air their views," Zybach concluded.

morning.

Performance classes will feature Western Pleasure, Horsemanship, Reining, Trail, Western Riding and Bareback Horsemanship. Performance books will close at 11:30 in the morning on June 3. Classes will start at 1:00 in the afternoon.

The entry fee will be \$2.00 per class. Gate admission is free and everyone is welcome. The judge will be Bob Wallace of Canyon.

The Hemphill County 4-H Riding club, will sponsor the horse show.





## WHEELER PUBLIC LIBRARY BOOK REVIEW

In "Margaret, the Tragic Princess", James Brough explores the childhood of Princess Margaret, her reign as the star of the glittering whirl of post-war London, the private heartbreak of her two star-crossed romances—and uncovers the cruel secret that has transformed the beguiling little princess into a truly tragic princess—and an unexpectedly gallant woman. She was the impish charmer who captured the royal heart of a nation at war, the madcap princess who danced and flirted her way through the postwar years, the heartbroken young woman who renounced a dashing suitor out of royal duty, who struggled bravely in the shadow of her royal sister. Her family and the nation rejoiced when she found a loving and celebrated husband in Anthony Armstrong Jones, gave birth to a son and daughter, and settled into a life of unobtrusive domesticity. But no marriage, it seemed, could survive between the millstones of Margaret's royal duty and Tony's creative imperatives. The story book romance was broken beyond hope or desire of repair. With courage unrecognized by the press, Margaret has sought to fill her life once again with private personal pleasures. But the Princess's behavior, friends, and appearances have become a favorite subject of London's scandal sheets. Despite a stringent press barrier, her face often appears in the tabloids, puffy, tired and lonely, along with stories of her pursuit of expensive escape.

ials, money and taxes were cited by the company as the major reasons for proposed increase.

1972, SPS made the commitment to switch from gas to coal as the primary fuel for their generating plants. This decision was made due to a long-range forecast which indicated increases in the cost of gas and diminishing availability. The present cost of new gas is about 70 per cent higher than the cost of coal. Government regulations have restricted the use of gas as a boiler fuel.

Southwestern's first coal plant, a \$100 million, 356.7 megawatt facility located in the north part of the company's system, went of the line in 1976. The total cost of this plant was almost three times more than a gas-fired plant of the same size. The second 356.7 mw coal unit is scheduled to go on the line in June of this year. This new unit will also help stabilize fuel costs.




