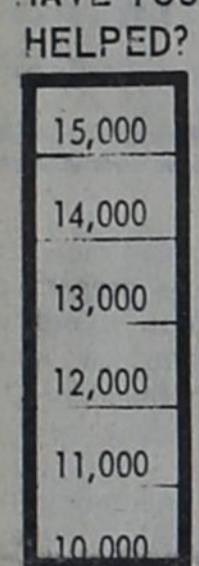
Cross Car Center offers all the services of a service station plus body work, wheel alignment, wheel balancing, minor radiator repair, glass installation and tune-up work.

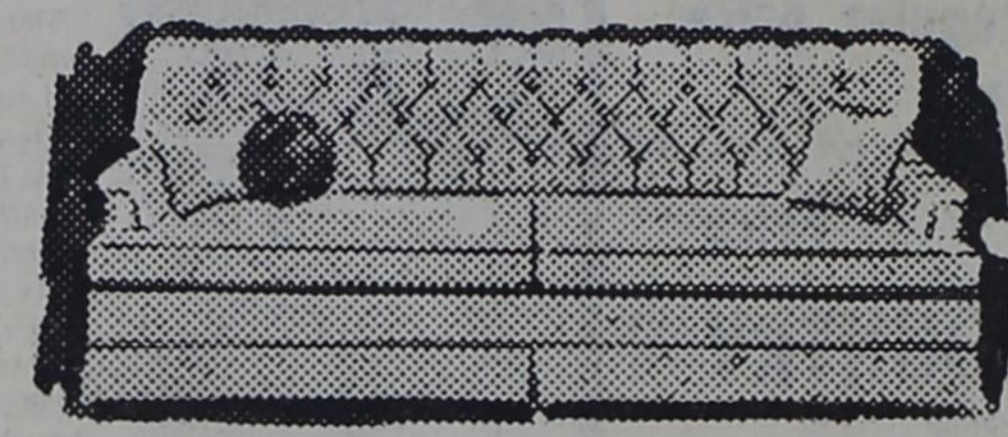

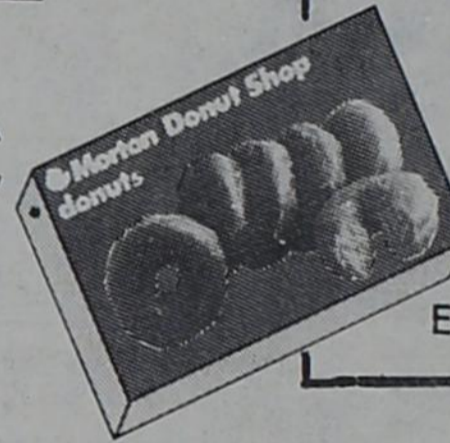

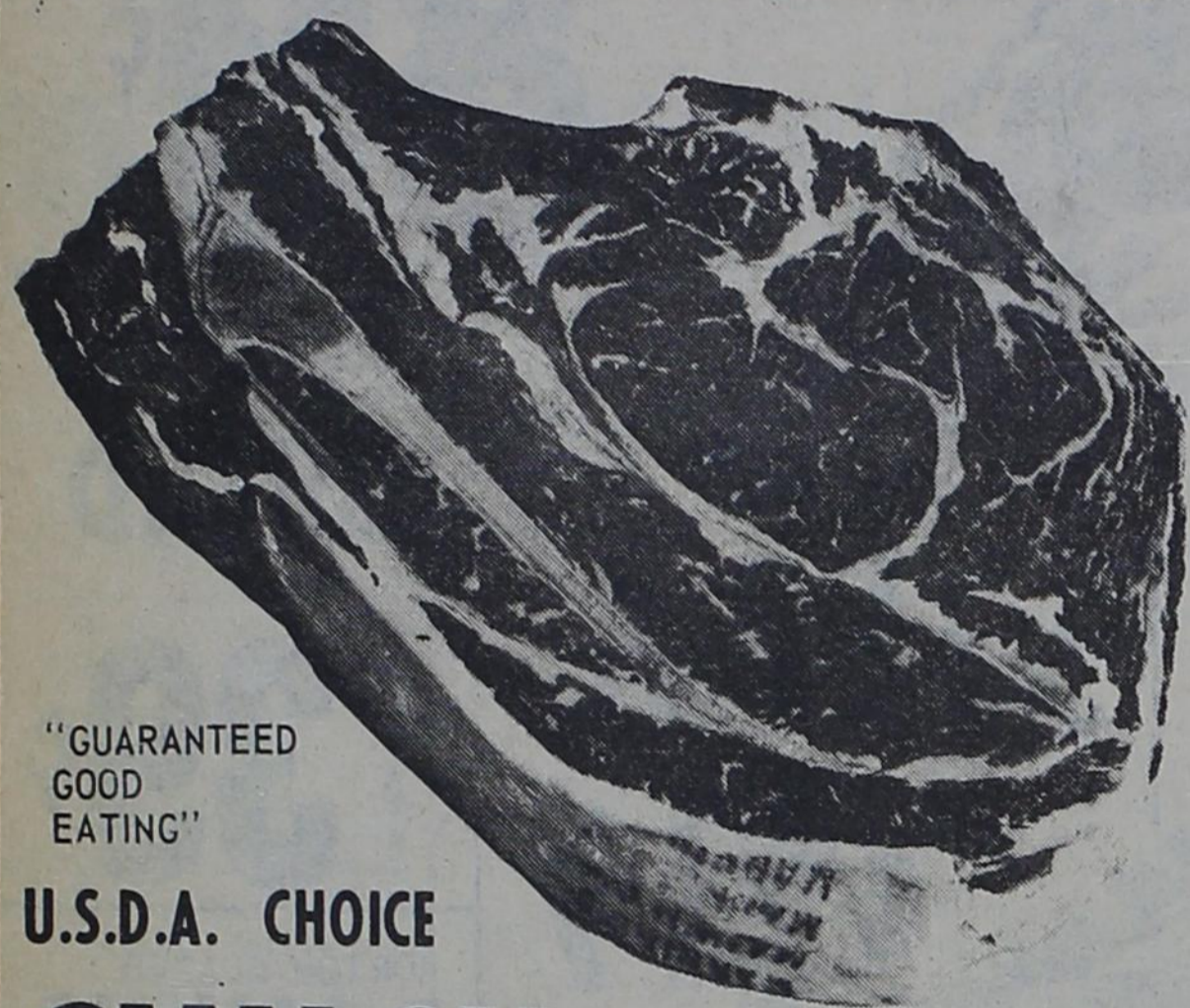
