



Parkview Hospital Cancels Election

James Batton made a motion to approve the consent agenda (minutes, payment of bills, financial statements and statistics. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Helton moved to agenda items 6A and 7 so that make their presentations. Mrs.

Stiles reported that we had our trauma redesignation survey on April 7 with a recommendation that we be approved. There was a recommendation that when a patient requires intubation the physician in charge of the case proceeds with the procedure in a more timely manner. Dr. Lavelle reported that the use of a new piece of equipment called a Glidescope Video Laryngoscope would be an asset to physicians who do not do the procedure frequently. A bid from Verathon was presented for the equipment.

After considerable discussion regarding the issue, Ray Hudson made a motion to purchase the scope with the adult and small blades with the understanding that all physicians and staff must Mrs. Stiles and Dr. Lavelle coulc attend documented in-service programs at frequent intervals to keep up their skills. Mrs. Stiles then presented some issues involved with recruitment of Registered Nurses for the facility. We have been forced to use agency nurses during this time to cover the night shifts and that is very costly. It was determined that we were below the average wage/hour as well as the dollars paid for shift differentials. There was also discussion regarding department managers who are not within the range of average salaries in similar hospitals. Mrs. Stiles reported that she had figured out if we gave an increase to RNs and LVNs, were able to hire another RN and increased the differential for nights and weekends and quit using





As State and Federal increase the donation to \$2.00 laws change, they necessitate per month. This is a voluntary changes in training requirements

donation that is included on your for local fire departments. At this point in time the State Board of Insurance requires "ISO Rated" volunteer fire departments to have a minimum of 4 hours of fire service training per month. This training covers all phases of fire prevention and fire suppression. An additional minimum of 8 hours per year of hazardous/material training is required by the Federal government. In the future, a given percentage of the fire department membership will be required to hold state certification as a "Basic Firefighter". This certification will require a minimum of 162 hours of training in 31 subject areas. Certification training, as well as training currently required, will compound the need for training materials such as videos, slides, lesson plans, workbooks,

handouts, etc. Training materials are available from numerous sources, (I.E., National Fire Prevention Association, Texas Firefighters and Fire Marshals Association, International Fire Service Training Association), but they are expensive.

This training is valuable for our present firefighters, but is even more important for future firefighters in this department.

All the "dollars" go directly into a special fund administered by the department for training and Personal Protection Equipment only.

The Wheeler Fire Department has 29 members, conducts training classes on the first, third and fifth Thursday of each month and donates approximately 3,000 hours per year to the fire protection and safety of the Wheeler community. No member of the department receives personal compensation for his time involved in fire suppression, fire prevention, training, public education programs, tours of department facilities and educational programs for youth, storm watch activities, maintenance of firefighting equipment, apparatus or assisting various county officials in emergency situations. In the above activities, members furnish their

own radios, vehicles and fuel. If it is your desire to make this Voluntary donation to the fire safety and protection of your community, we thank you and the firefighters of the future thank you.
