In Travis County on a Chevrolet 4door sedan from 1938 to 1961, insurance coverage for non-business private passenger automobiles, without a male operator under 25 years of age, have increased a total of 69% while the list price of the automobile has increased 179%

Increased costs in the fields of hospitalization, medical expense, repair costs and other items for which automobile insurance pays have also contributed to increase

The recent hearing by the State Board however, demonstrated that insurance can be and is priced with as much accuracy as any product sold today. It was also pointed out that more careful driving and reduced number of accidents and fair claims will do more to hold down insurance cost than anything else that might be done.
