MUSTANGS WIN BI-DISTRICT TITLE

NAZARETH FALLS 42-26

Between the two programs, Nazareth and Wheeler own enough playoff hardware to construct a battleship.

Unfortunately for Nazareth, this is football season, not girls' basketball season.

Wheeler flexed its muscles to the tune of a 42-26 bi-district win before about 1500 fans Friday at frigid Bucks Stadium.

With the win, Wheeler (7-4) advances to the area round of the Class 1A playoffs and will face Springlake-Earth (8-2) next week at Dick Bivins Stadium. Nazareth ends its season at 9-2.

Wheeler running back Caleb Finsterwald ran with abandon in the first half as the Mustangs built a 28-6 lead. In the second half, Nazareth made some headway but could not dig itself out of the deep first-half hole.

"That's what the coaches told us to

do, come out and get on top of them early," Finsterwald said.

Finsterwald ran 34 times for 298 yards and five touchdowns in the game. In the first quarter alone, the 6-foot-2, 210-pound senior carried 12 times for 102 yards and two touchdowns.

"I kept hearing the plays and I was thinking, 'Man, I'm getting tired,'" Finsterwald said. "It doesn't matter that I'm getting the ball so much, just as long as we win."

Wheeler set the tone early, scoring on four of its first five possessions. The Mustangs also forced two turnovers in the first half that led to touchdowns.

"They got the breaks early," Nazareth coach Rick Price said. "They were winning up front and they got the better of us up there. Quite frankly, the better team tonight won."

Wheeler repeatedly broke down Nazareth's offensive line and gained penetration into the backfield and dis-

Hill and Wendell Morgan, City of Wheeler representative, Harrison Hall, City of Shamrock representative, Sonny Hilburn, and City of Mobeetie representative, Joe VanZandt. Meeting was called to order by Harrison Hall, President.

Minutes were read by Bobbie C. Hill, Secretary and approved.

The meeting with Oklahoma Representatives was discussed and the board agreed it was a positive meeting.

"We just played hard," Finsterwald said. "Kelby (Ledbetter) and the offensive line had some awesome blocks and the guys up front did a great job. On defense, we knew we had to do something about their passing, but we were more worried about their passing."

Wheeler cracked the scoreboard first when Finsterwald took a veer handoff off left tackle 49 yards for a touchdown. The Mustangs were facing a fourth-and-2 situation when Finsterwald burst through the line behind Kelby Ledbetter and raced almost untouched for a touchdown.

SWOSU Sayre Will Offer Scuba Diving

Have you ever wondered what the bottom of the ocean was really like? Are you planning a summer vacation near the water? Why not enroll in the Scuba course offered at Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre? 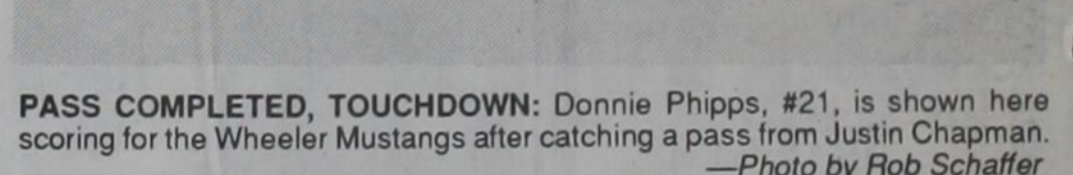
