# County-wide Burn Ban Approved In Special Meeting

In a special meeting of the Wheeler county commissioners' court the following county-wide burn ban was enacted STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF WHEELER

**EXECUTIVE ORDER PROHIBITING OUTDOOR BURNING** WHEREAS, by declaration issued February 4, 2008, the County

Judge of Wheeler County, Texas, declared a state of disaster for Wheeler County, resulting from the potential threat of wildfires due to drought and adverse weather conditions; and

WHEREAS, said state of disaster requires that certain emergency measures be taken pursuant to the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 relating to Emergency Management, specifically '418.108(a) of the Government Code:

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, by majority vote, have authorized the Wheeler County Judge to sign this order for the benefit of the citizens of Wheeler County, Texas;

BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED that the following emergency requlations be hereby established for all areas of Wheeler County, Texas, and shall take effect and immediately upon issuance of this order and shall remain in effect until the state of disaster is terminated (2) THE USE OF COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS IN AN OUTDOOR

**ENVIRONMENT BY ANY PERSON IS PROHIBITED** (1) Combustible materials include, but are not limited to the use of all fireworks (aerial and non-aerial), discarded cigarettes, cigars or other flammable materials, materials used in activities such as welding and any other activity that could result in a fire.

(2) Agricultural burning is strictly prohibited. This prohibition includes all burning to clear land of trees, stumps, shrubbery, and other natural vegetation.

(3) Ground fires, campfires and bonfires are prohibited. (4) The burning of household waste, including trash, garbage, leaves, grass, brush and other yard trimmings is prohibited.

(1) (3) WELDING IS ALLOWED BY COMMERCIAL/PRO-FESSIONAL WELDERS UNDER THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES ONLY:

(5) A spotter is required for each welder, each cutter, each grinder, or for any activity that causes or my cause a spark.

(6) A diameter across the welding area shall be a minimum of 25 feet and clear of vegetation, if possible, and kept wet. The welding diameter must be three times the height of the actual welding. Example: if the welding is occurring ten (10) feet off the ground, a diameter of thirty (30) feet must be protected.

(7) A minimum of 200 gallons of pressured water must be available on site.

10 lb. Class ABC chemical fire extinguisher on site (9) If the work area cannot be cleared of vegetation, proper pre-

cautionary measures must be taken (example: protecting brush, etc., by utilizing fire resistant tarps). (10) Each site will have cellular telephone communications for emer-

(11) Welding in an enclosed area is acceptable.

(12) A charged water hose must be present in the immediate vicin-

(13) Cookers must be on non-combustible surfaces, such as gravel,

concrete or bare dirt. (14) Cookers must have a lid and be closely monitored while the lid

(15) Use of wood or charcoal fueled cookers is prohibited.

(5) ENFORCEMENT

(A) Upon notification of suspected outdoor burning, the fire department assigned to the location of the fire shall respond to the scene and take immediate measures to contain and/or extinguish the fire.

(6) As soon as possible, a duly-commissioned peace officer shall be sent to investigate the nature of the fire. (1) (7) At the discretion of the peace officer or Fire Chief, violations of this order may be prosecuted in accordance with the statutes and

procedures governing misdemeanors. (8) In accordance with the Local Government Code '352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C Misdemeanor, punishable

by a fine not to exceed \$500.00. (9) BE IT ALSO ORDERED that this order may be enforced by any duly commissioned peace officer and that the venue for prosecution of this Order will be the Justice of the Peace Court, Precinct No. 1 or No. 2, Wheeler County, Texas.

(10) Persons in violation of this order may also commit an offense if the person intentionally or knowingly violates the General Requirements for Allowable Outdoor Burning or any other rule promulgated by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality regarding out-

An offense under these rules is punishable for an individual by a fine not less than \$1,000 or more than \$50,000, confinement in the county jail for a period not to exceed 180 days, or both [Section 7.177 Texas Water Code].

2. An offense is punishable for a person other than an individual by fine of not less than \$1,000 or more than \$100,000. [Section 7.177 Texas Water Codel

3. Under '111.221 of the Texas Administrative Code, a person in violation of the Outdoor Burning Rule may be held liable for the consequences, damages, and/or injuries resulting from outdoor burning.

(11) A person may be responsible for the criminal conduct of another under the provisions of Section 7.02, Texas Penal Code, as for example where he/she solicits, encourages, directs, aids or attempts to aid the other person to commit the offense.


THE PURPOSE OF THIS ORDER IS THE MITIGATION OF THE (8) Each welding vehicle must have at least one (1) fully charged PUBLIC SAFETY HAZARD POSTED BY WILDFIRES DURING THE CURRENT DROUGHT AND SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS BY CURTAILING THE USE OF ALL COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS.

This Order Prohibiting the use of Combustible Materials Outdoors shall expire on June 30, 2008, or upon such date as the Wheeler County Commissioner=s Court by Order determines that circumstances present in Wheeler County, Texas, no longer create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning, whichever oc-
