



SEEP TYPE POND: This is a picture of a seep type pond on the T. J. Cole farm about 5 miles southeast of Wheeler. This particular pond is 60 feet wide, 100 feet long, and 10 feet deep. It was installed under the Great Plains Conservation Program. As you can see it is standing full of water. This is an excellent source of stock water and is good for fishing. This type of pond can usually be built in an area where the water level is within four feet of top of the ground. Many farmers and ranchers in the Wheeler Soil Conservation District are fortunate in having seep areas on their places on which a pond of this type can be built. About fifteen have been built within the last year in the district.


