County Agricultural Agent This week I discussd the wheat harvest with P. A. Martin of the Briscoe community and he seemed quite satisfied with his wheat yield Mr. Joyce Smith of Shamrock that we had during the critical and grade after the severe drouth spent Saturday night with Carolyn stage of the wheat growing period in addition to the hard freezes that occured during the winter. After diverting twenty per cent of his allotment to other use, Mr. Martin was left with 138 acres of wheat t plant and it was planted in Com nanche. It was then fertilized with 100 pounds per acre of twenty-one per cent ammonium sulphate. The cost of adding this nitrogen wa around \$3.50 per acre including th application cost. His average yield on the total acreage was 121/2 bushels per acre and all wheat ripened at the same time. No lodging occured on any of his acreage and all the wheat graded No. 1 at a weight of 60-63 pounds per bushel. This wheat was also sold for \$.08 per pound above government
