## THREE DIRECTORS TO BE ELECTED FOR HOSPITAL

The deadline for filing for director of the North Wheeler County Hospital District is March 12, 1973. Three districts will elect directors this year. They are Allison, Briscoe and Mobeetie. This district are currently represented by Lewis Grayson, Allison; Herbert Finsterwald, Briscoe; and Lester Leonard, Mobeetie.

This election will be held in conjunction with the school and city election on April 7, 1973.

Any qualified taxpayer desiring his or her name to be placed on the ballot as a candidate for director shall file a petition signed by not less than five qualified voters residing in the candidates voting precinct, asking that the said name be printed on the ballot with the secretary of the Board of Directors. Such petitions shall be filed at least twenty-five days prior to the date of the election.

## BAPTIST CHURCH WILL HOLD REVIVAL MAR. 11-18

Directing the music for the Revival will be Bill O'Brien, brother to Chester. Bill is a native Texan also and graduated from Hardin-Simmons University and Southwestern Seminary. He served as Minister of Music for several Texas churches before he was appointed by the Foreign Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention in 1962, as Missionary Musician to Indonesia. There he served as Teacher in the Indonesian Baptist Theological Seminary, was Director of the Seminary Choir touring throughout Java, and was Director of Radio-TV broadcasting services of Indonesian Baptists. At the present, he is on Study Leave, working toward the degree of Doctor of Musical Arts, at Southwestern Seminary in Ft. Worth.

The time for the services on Sunday will be at the usual time, 11:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. Throughout the week, the morning services, Monday through Friday will be scheduled for 10:00 a.m. and the evening services will begin at 7:30 p.m. and be held Monday through Saturday. The congregation of the Church would like to extend a cordial welcome to our friends and neighbors to attend these special services of March 11-18.

## Holt and Rives on Tech Deans List

Carol A. Holt, Freshman and Donald E. Rives, Senior were among a total of 2,377 students in the College of Arts and Sciences who qualified for the dean's honor list for the 1972 fall semester at Texas Tech University, according to Dean Lawrence L. Graves.

To qualify for the honor list, a student must be enrolled in 12 hours of courses, excluding pass-fail courses, and have at least a 3.0 grade point average. Texas Tech uses a 4.0 grading system. The College of Arts and Sciences is one of six colleges and two schools at Texas Tech University, which will be observing its Fiftieth Anniversary 1973-75. The fall enrollment was more than 21,400.

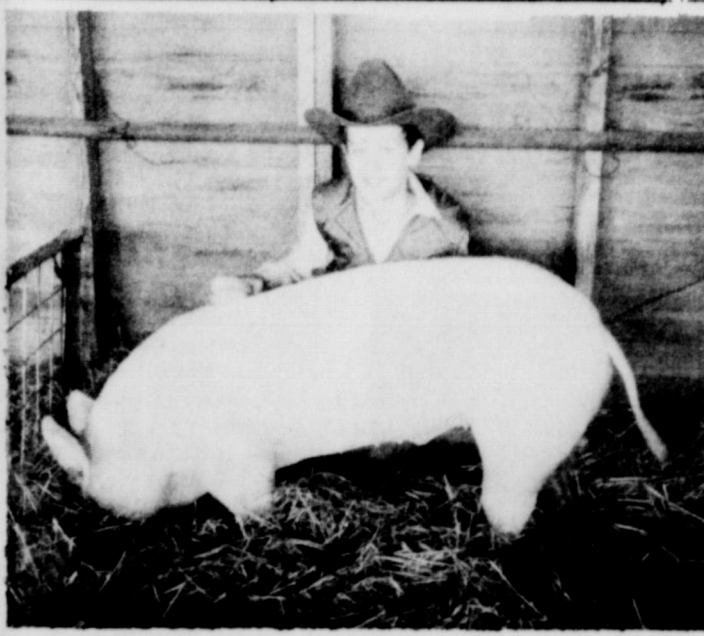

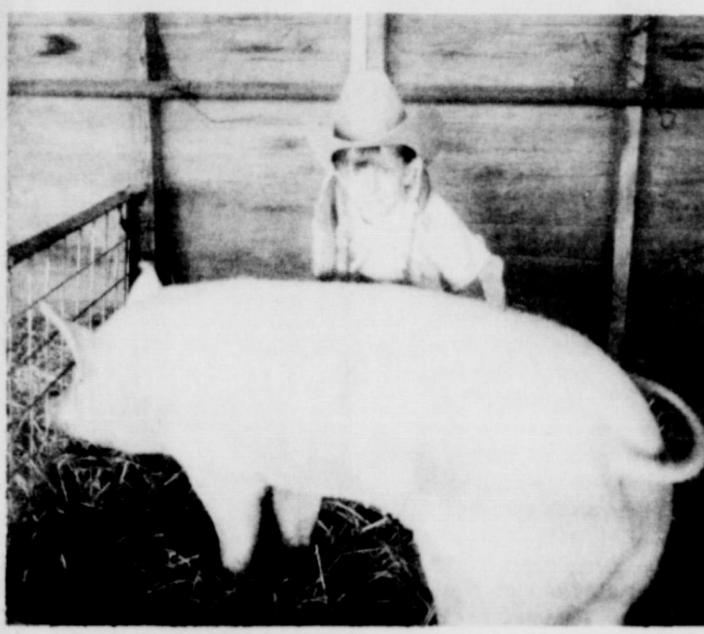
**Services are Held For Zack Miller**

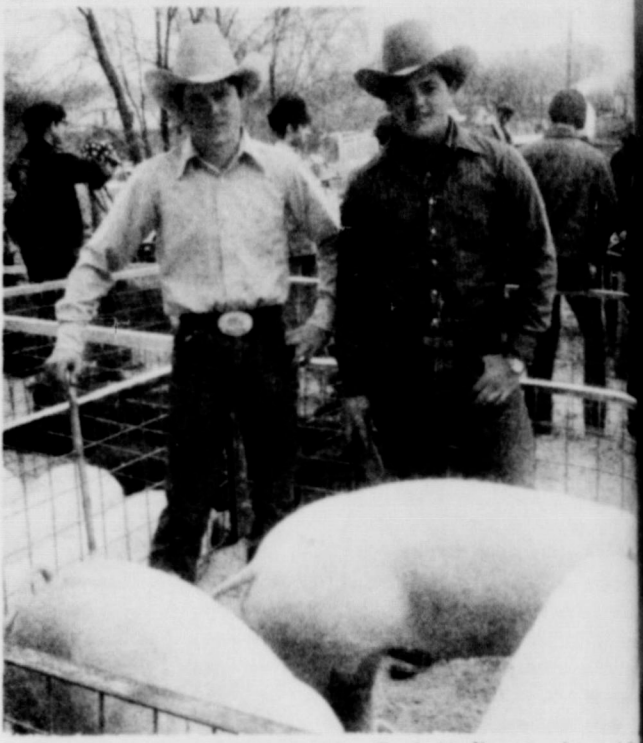

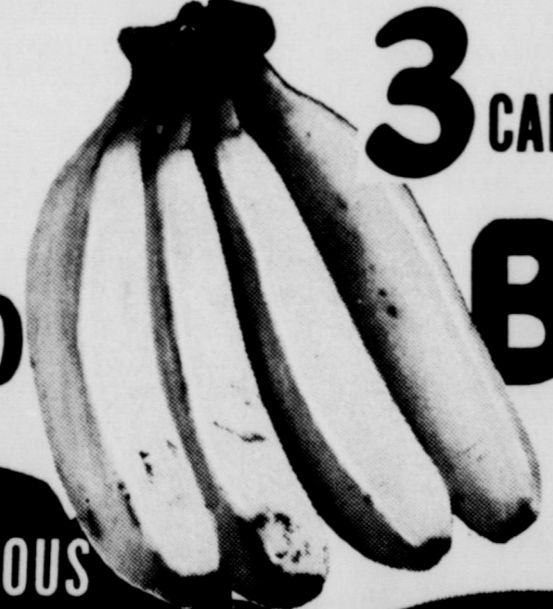

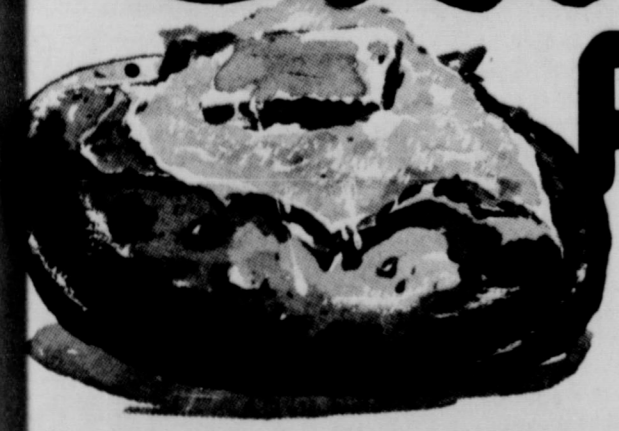

A. D. Ware, who lives near Clovis, New Mexico and owns a farm near Mabeette says that people in

New Mexico are getting a lot of mileage out of Jose Wheat grass. He reported that he carried 60 pairs of cows and calves on 38 acres from April 10 to Oct. 15. He uses 100 pounds of anhydrous ammonia, 100 pounds of 18-46-0 and 150 pounds of sulfa-mag (Costs \$45 a ton) for his fertility program. We have been observing Jose Wheat grass here for 2 years. To my knowledge, there isn't any under production here. Since most folks here graze weeping lovegrass from April through October,

there's a possibility that its use period would dovetail that of lovegrass to the point that there'd be no advantage to growing it. However, it looks like Mr. Ware is sure getting some good from his Jose Wheat grass.

Please don't bite the hind-quarter that's feeding you! Looks like cows stand accused, in the public press and in the minds-eye of the consumer, as Public Enemy No. 1. Cows have been pictured as "turcoats" who have twin calves every year, one for beef and the other for inflation.

A gallop pool, which you can do either on foot or horseback, reveals the following truths: "It wasn't the cow that voted higher taxes, signed the mortgage on the house, bought a car on contract, picketed for higher wages, bought a swimming pool on time, used a credit card for a vacation, insisted on build-in maid service by buying oven ready foods or a whole host of other things that has built inflation into the economy. When it's all said and done, the old cow feels pretty bad about having the hind quarter bitten that's been feeding all of us; at least while she's wearing it!"

Bill Gentry at Hereford got close to 1200 pounds of beef to the acre on an irrigated alfalfa grazing demonstration conducted from July 18 to Nov. 8, 1972. A molasses Poloxalene mixture was used exclusively to control bloat. He used 35 head of freshly shipped cattle on 7 acre of irrigated alfalfa. He had no death loss. We believe that a number of these type programs, utilizing irrigated alfalfa will be done right here in Wheeler County this summer. Several producers here got a taste of it last summer. It looks good if the death loss can be kept to a minimum. We have further information on this demonstration at our office.

### Grandson Receives Comendation
