



BY Max Hatter, CEA Take care of your beef cows during the winter. We've seen a lot of disappointed folks who tried to save money on feed. Most have found that the shortage of hay in the area, a number of producers will be using high energy feed such as grain sorghum. The requirements for protein, energy,

vitamins and minerals must be met to avoid delayed conception and delayed calving. The total digestible nutrient requirement is twice as high for a cow with a nursing calf than for a dry cow. A good practice is to separate cows with calves from dry cows and feed each group accordingly. Cows that can get a little green grazing, however short, are not likely to suffer from a vitamin A deficiency. This vitamin is necessary for successful growth and maturation of of the sex cells in bulls and proper conception in cows. If a cow has a serious deficiency of the vitamin, she will probably not settle. Vitamin A injection may be beneficial under some conditions, but the greatest deficiency is probably from inadequate total feed intake. Perhaps the greatest deficiency that we have in our area is an inadequate supply of phosphorus. This can be controlled by putting out high phos phorus mineral blocks containing 10-12% phosphorus. A few years ago, you couldn't buy a mineral block with that much phosphorus in it. Now you can buy them most any place. It's been a good year for

All the above varieties are included in our Northwest Texas Research Demonstration Peach Variety Plantings at Wheeler as recommended by our Extension Horticulturist at Texas A & M University. It's the time of year to be planting the peach trees for the home orchards.





Place half the beans in shallow 11/2 qt. casserole, then half the tuna. Spread half the sour cream sauce over top; sprinkle with half of Cheddar cheese. Repeat layers. Bake at 350° for 25-30 min. until heated through.
