Overcoming first game mistakes ditions enabled the Mustangs to gain the second quarter and proceeded to Broncos to a paltry 54 yards rushing. rout the Clarendon Broncos 48-6 last Friday night.

Wheeler outplayed the Broncos decisively and gave the head coach, Ronnie Karcher, his first win as the Mustangs head mentor.

It was evident after the first series they had the ball that the Mustangs meant to keep their winning tradition rolling along.

Moving from wingback to running back was just what the doctor ordered for Shane Guest as the 170 lb. tailback tore his way for 214 yards and three touchdowns on the night.

Going to the air only six times, the Mustangs completed a couple but they were big ones as junior quarterback Shawn Bradstreet passed to Guest for a 16 yard scoring toss on a screen and hit Tommy Velasquez on a 17 yarder for 6 points with 25 seconds to play in the first half.

Bradstreet had another pass slip through the receiver's hands that had six written all over it.

The Mustangs put the game away with 20 points in the second quarter for a 27-0 halftime lead and increased their margin to 41-0 before the Broncos tallied their lone TD on an 85 yard pass and run with 4:37 remaining in the game.

Even though they had the better team and better coaching, it was still a real big win for Wheeler and gives them a lot of momentum for their tough schedule ahead.

Clarendon missed a 32 yard field goal on their first possession and that was it offensively for the Broncos in the first half.

Using their patented running game, the Mustangs rode the runs of Guest to move 80 yeards in 10 plays and Guest hit the end zone from 2 yards out at 1:13 of the first quarter.

Sammy Zepeda booted his first of 6 extra points and the Mustangs were on their way.

Michael Kenney bolted 24 yards for the Mustangs fourth running TD of the game with four minutes to play in the opener for both clubs.

Early in the third quarter, Clarendon was passing from inside their 10 and Kyle Sword ran back on interception 22 yards to paydirt.

#### **Pork Referendum Vote** Ends Today, Sept. 8

Pork producers in Wheeler County will have an opportunity to vote in a special referendum Sept. 7-8 as authorized by the Pork Promotion, Research, and Consumer Information Act of 1985.

Purpose of the referendum is to determine the continuance of the 100 percent checkoff program which provides funds for pork research and promotion to enhance the pork industry according to Don King, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. The checkoff is at the rate 25 cents per \$100 on all hogs and pigs as well as on all imported hogs and pork products.

Referendum voting will be conducted in the county Extension office during normal business hours Sept.

All pork producers who produced and owned porcine animals in the U.S. for sale in commerce and who are subject to assessment during the representative time period of Nov. 1, 1986, through Sept. 6, 1988, are eligible to vote. Importers who imported porcine animals, pork or pork products during the representative time period also are eligible to vote. Also, eligible are 4-H, FFA and other youth who owned porcine animals and are subject to assessment during the representative time period.

The Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service will count ballots, determine the eligibility of challenged voters and ballots, and report referendum results, said King.
