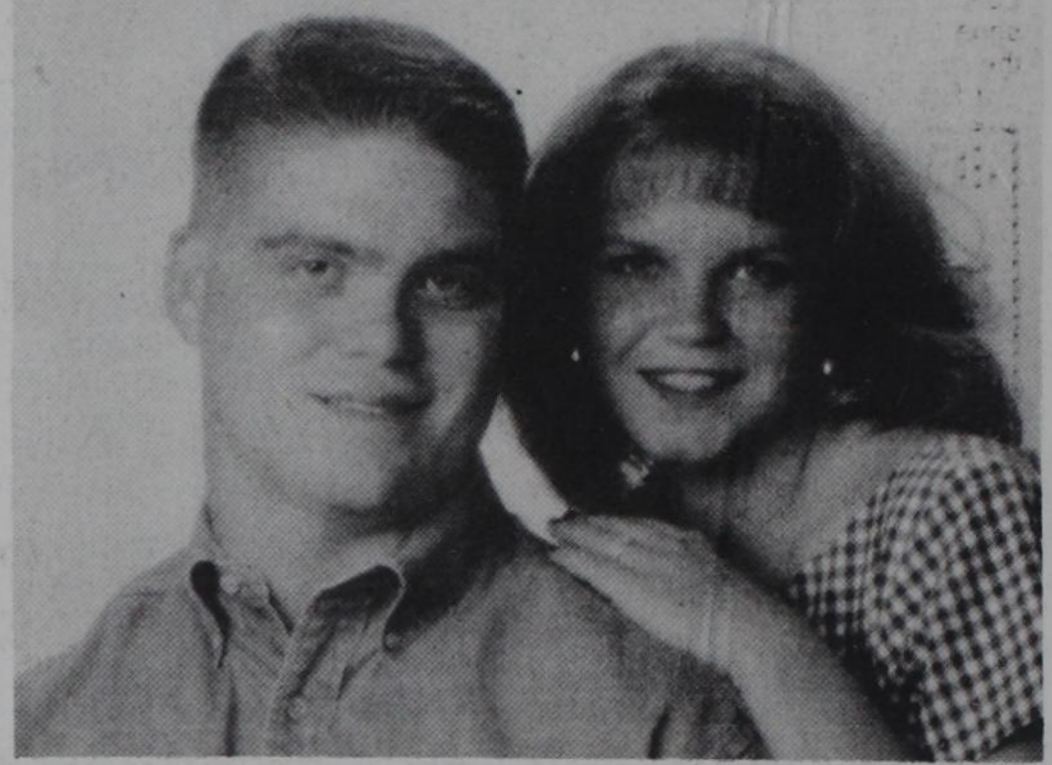

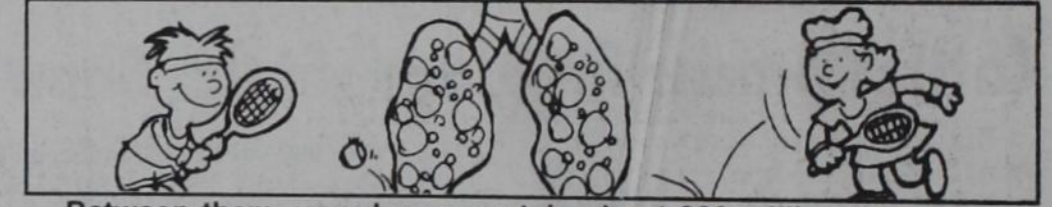

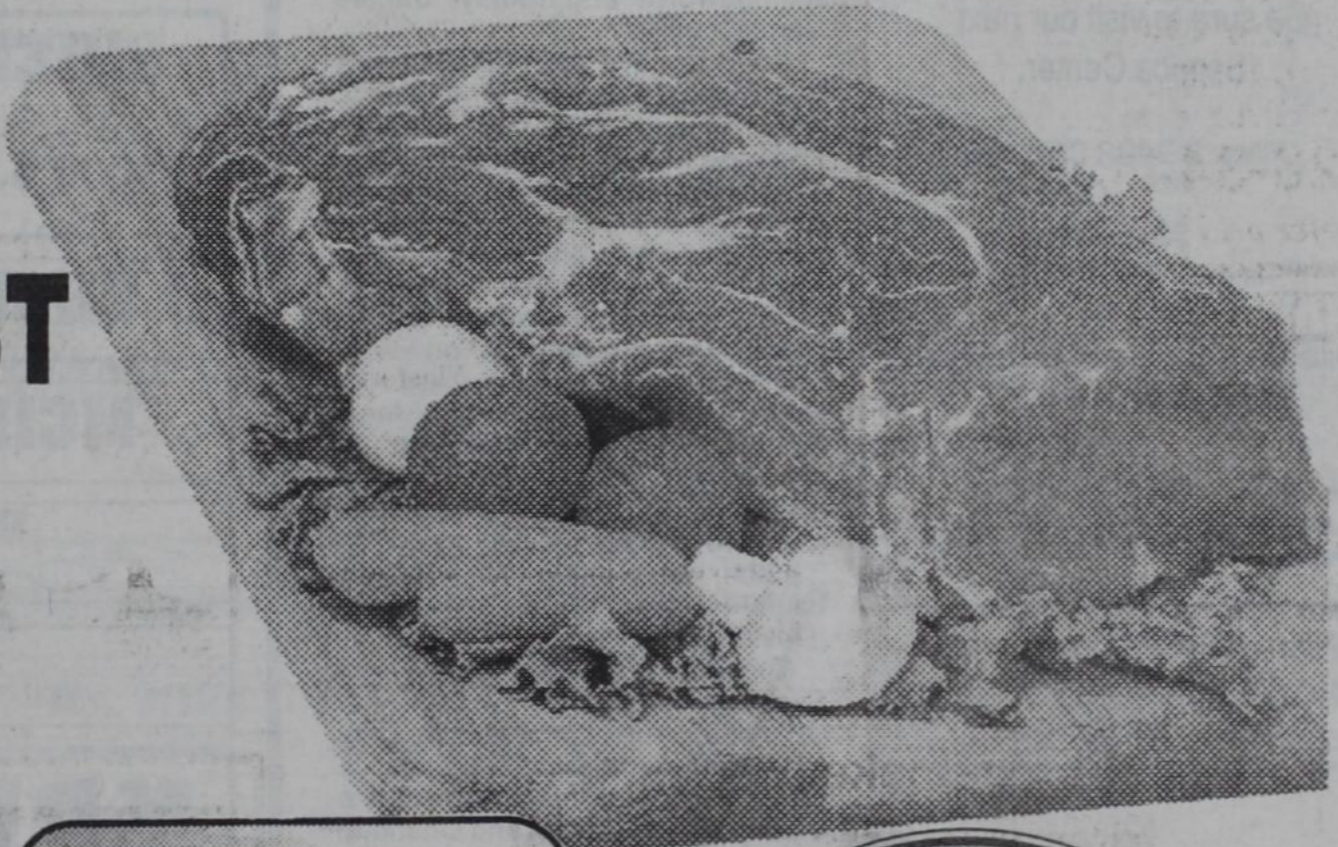

Now Is Time To Rebuild Or Construct Terraces

While much of the state of Texas endured a droughty summer, the Texas panhandle was blessed with above normal summer rainfall. The rangeland has responded with an increase in the amount of tall grasses such as Sand Bluestem and Indian Grass. Field crops are also looking well. As fall approaches, preparations are being made to plant wheat and rye. One preparation that should not be overlooked is the repair or construction of diversions and terraces.

Diversions and terraces are similar with only minor differences. Terraces occur as a system consisting of at least three while diversions are usually solitary. Terraces are smaller in size, approximately 15 inches of height, while diversions may be up to 3 feet high. Consequently, larger earth moving equipment is often required for constructing a diversion.

Design procedures are different for diversions and terraces. Diversions are designed based on drainage area, while terraces are designed based on distance from the top of a hill or between terraces. Diversions are used in conjunction with terraces when outside water is a problem.

a business entity, the office that serves its main office or headquarters.

County Extension offices may only fill requests for absentee ballots from August 26 through September 17. Completed absentee ballots must be received in the county Extension office by the close of business on September 27. Ballots will be counted on October 16.

If the referendum is approved, the program would be funded by a mandatory assessment of domestic producers, feeders and exporters of live sheep and greasy wool. The assessment would be one cent per pound on

live sheep sold and two cents per pound on greasy wool sold.

No one is authorized to register or to vote on behalf of an individual voter.

From The Minister's Desk:

An important admonition is given to parents in Proverbs 22:6. This famous Old Testament text says: "Train up a child in the way he should go, even when he is old he will not depart from it."

But how should parents "train up" their children? Perhaps the best answer to this question can be found in some suggestions that were recently made by the famous columnist, Ann Landers. Her suggestions were: ---

1. Remember that a child is a gift from God, the richest of all blessings. Do not attempt to mold him in the image of yourself, your father, your brother or your neighbor. Each child is an individual and should be permitted to be himself.

2. Do not crush a child's spirit when he fails. And never compare him with others who have outshone him.

3. Remember that anger and hostility are natural emotions. Help your child to find socially acceptable outlets for these normal feelings or they may be turned inward and erupt in the form of physical or mental illness.

4. Discipline your child with firmness and reason. Do not let your anger throw you off balance. If he knows you are fair, you will not lose his respect or his love. And make sure the punishment fits the crime. Even the youngest child has a keen sense of justice.

5. Remember that each child needs two parents. Present a united front. Never join with your child against your mate. This can create in your child (as well as in yourself) emotional conflicts. It can also create feelings of guilt, confusion, and insecurity.

6. Do not hand your child everything his little heart desires. Permit him to "know the thrill" of earning and

the joy of achieving. Grant him the greatest of all satisfactions, the pleasure that comes with personal accomplishment.

7. Do not set yourself up as the epitome of perfection. This is a difficult role to play 24 hours a day. You will find it easier to communicate with your child if you let him know that Mom and Dad can err, too.

8. Do not make threats in anger or impossible promises when you are in a generous mood. Threaten or promise only that which you can live up to. To a child, a parent's word means everything. The child who has lost faith in his parents has difficulty believing in anything.

9. Do not smother your child with superficial manifestations of "love". The purest and healthiest love expresses itself in day-in, day-out training, which breeds self-confidence and independence.

10. Teach your child there is dignity in hard work, whether it is performed with calloused hands that shovel coal or skilled fingers that manipulate surgical instruments. Let him know a useful life is a blessed one and a life of ease and pleasure-seeking is empty and meaningless.

11. Do not try to protect your child against every small blow and disappointment. Adversity strengthens character and makes us compassionate. Trouble is the great equalizer. Let him learn from it.

12. Teach your child to love God and to love his fellow men. Do not send your child to a place of worship. Take him there. Children learn from example. Telling him something is not teaching him. If you give your child a deep and abiding faith in God, it can be his strength and his light when all else fails.

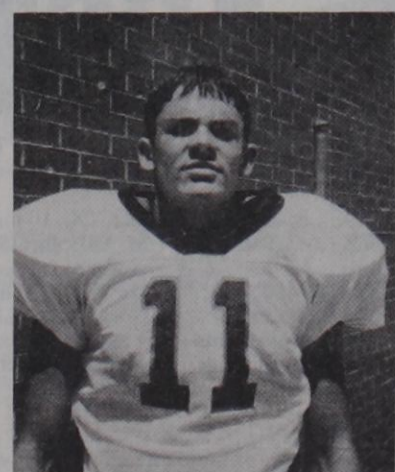

PACKING SAFE SCHOOL LUNCHES

Most kids like sandwiches, but you have to be careful what you pack. Don't pack anything that will spoil unless you have a way to keep it cold. Joan Gray, County Extension Agent — Family and Consumer Sciences says lunch meats hold up well in a lunch box. Include cheese for a dose of calcium. She suggests packing the lettuce and tomato separately and including these little packets of mustard and mayonnaise instead of putting it on the bread. And by all means, add chips. Children need a certain amount of fat. Children also need fruits and vegetables. Send them whole or cut with ranch dressing for dipping. Most children aren't getting the five recommended daily servings. To help keep sandwiches and yogurt cold, you can freeze juice boxes and include them in the lunch box. Or you may want to invest in one of the new insulated lunch boxes. Keeping the lunch box clean is just as important. Wash it daily, and once a week give it a really good cleaning with water and baking soda.

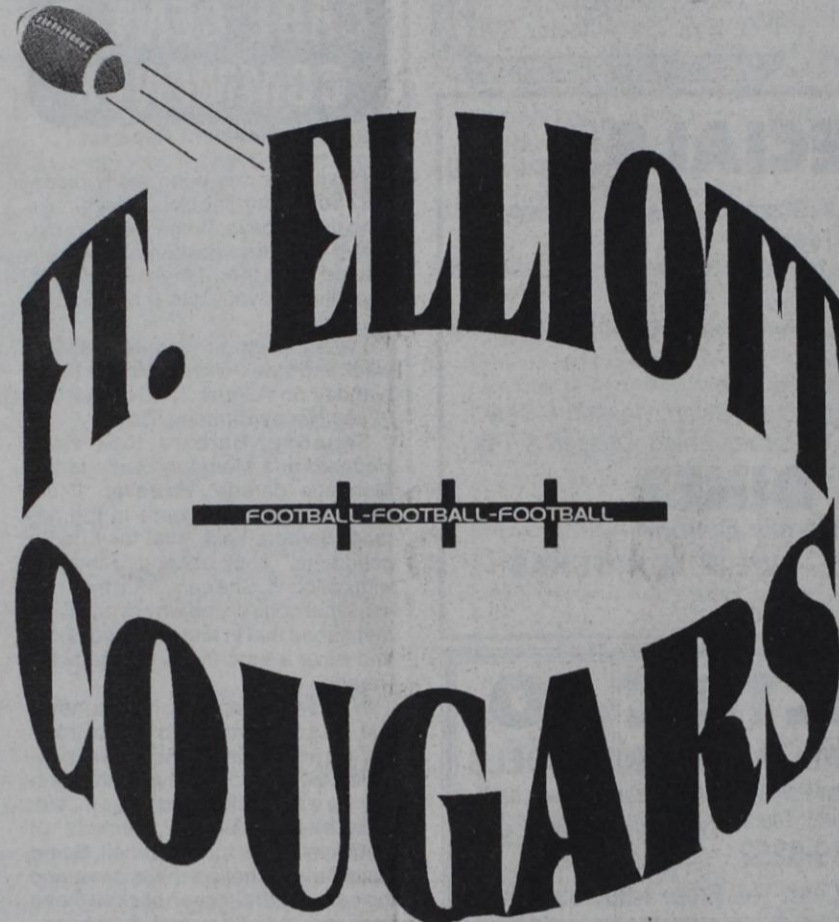

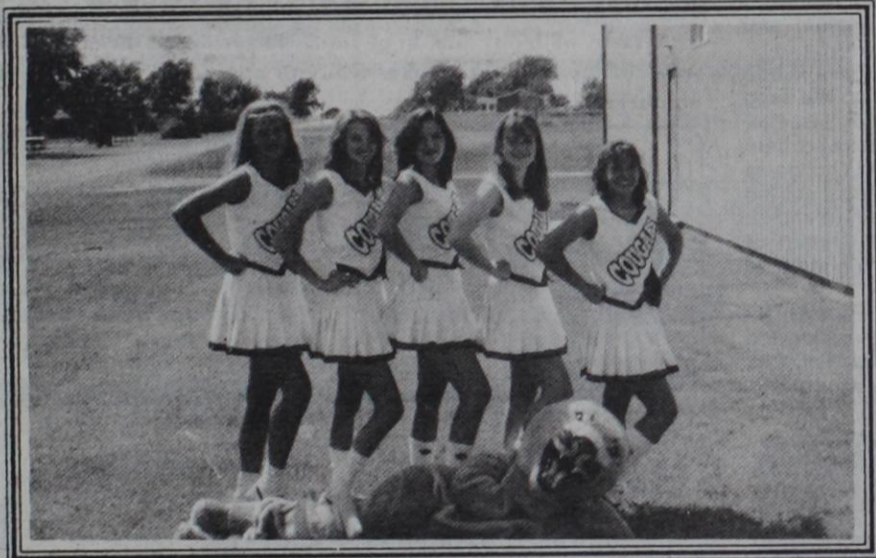

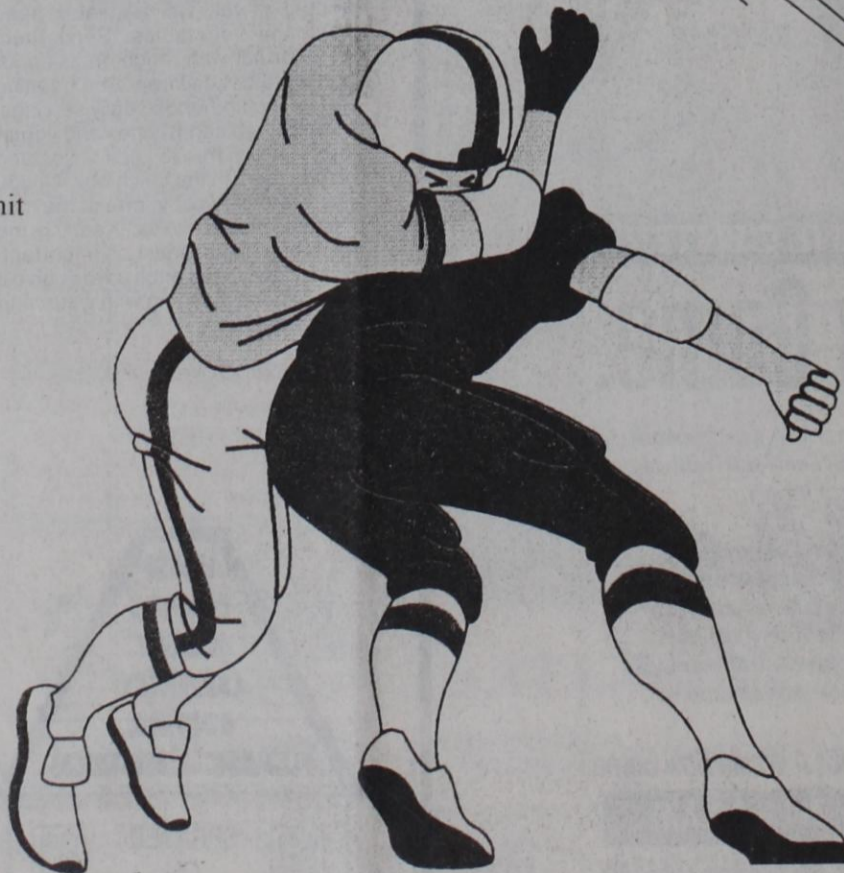
