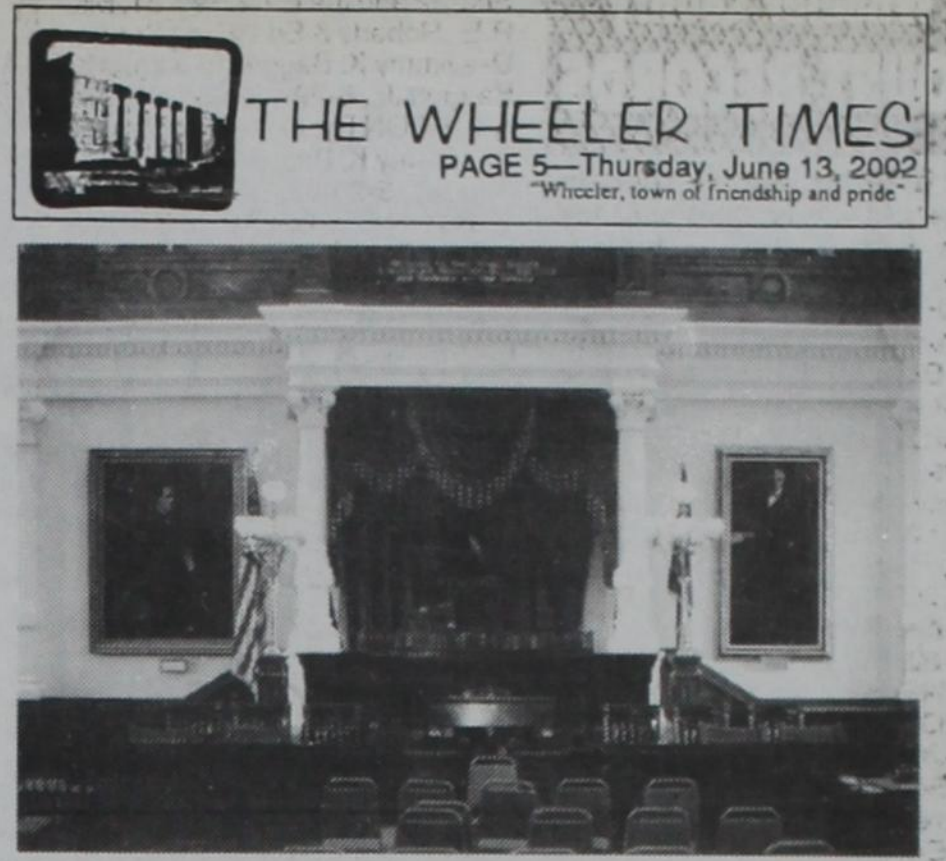
Extension Service Has Summer Activities

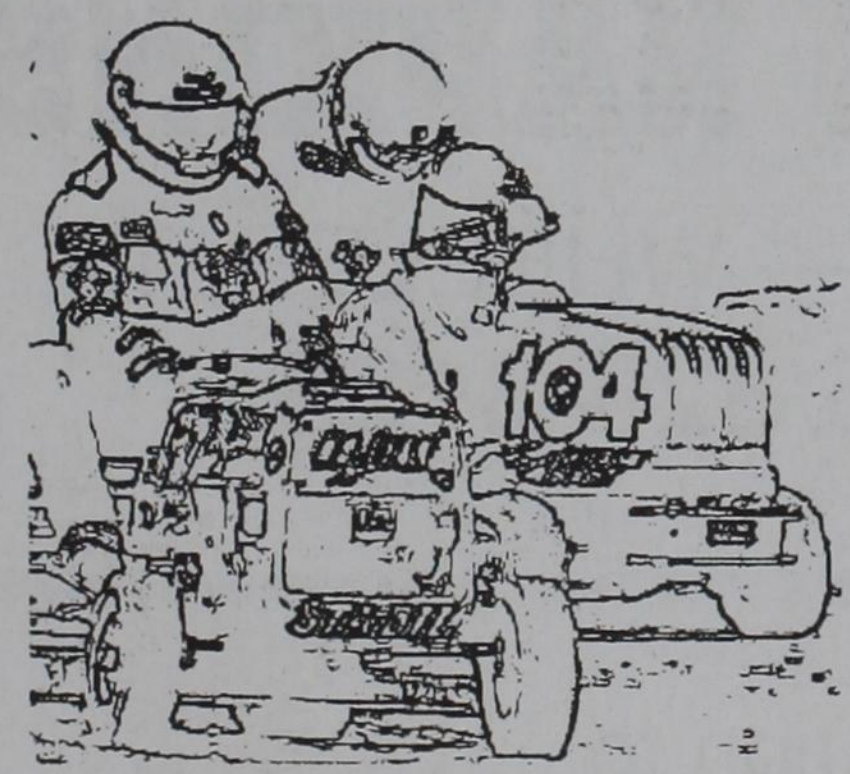
