High Cost Of Gas Hurting Fire Dept.

With a record number of fires along with high gas prices our local fire departments are feeling the pressure. The Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department has made over 100 fire calls since the first of the year. For every fire call it takes the department approximately \$300.00 for fuel. Cost of fuel and repairs for the department has been over \$9,000.00; this does not include the cost of soap, safety equipment, travel expenses, meetings, and trainings.

The department's county budget so far for this year has been \$7,375.00, which averages out to be \$73.75 a fire call. The only way our department has been able to pay all or our bills are through generous donations from local citizens and gas companies.

Most of the time we try to set aside the money made from donations to help with equipment upgrades. Right now we are trying to upgrade our rescue vehicle, after doing some research a new rescue will cost about \$60,000.00. The department had saved \$12,000.00 for a new rescue vehicle, we currently have \$9,000.00.

The department is sponsoring a Team Roping and Timed Event Rodeo on June 21, 2008 to try to get some funds to help with getting a new rescue vehicle.

Services Held For Herbert Mayfield

Herbert E. Mayfield, 87, died Thursday, May 29, 2008, in Amarillo. Celebration of life services were held at 2:30 p.m. Sunday in First Baptist Church, Dimmitt, Texas, with the Revs. Windell Taylor, Pete Curtis and Howard Quiett officiating. Burial was in Hart Cemetery in Hart by Colonial Funeral Home of Dimmitt, Texas.

Herbert was born December 20, 1920, in Erick, Oklahoma, to William and Penelope Mayfield and moved to the Dimmitt area in January 1931. He attended school in Dimmitt and graduated from Dimmitt High School. He was awarded a college basketball scholarship. He served in the Air Force during World War II in Europe and he participated in troop drops during the Normandy invasion and Battle of the Bulge.

In 1951, he married Dorothy McLain in Hart. Herb came from a strong musical background where his family all played musical instruments. He and his brothers, Ed and Smokey, traveled all around playing bluegrass music and opening for Tennessee Ernie Ford, Maddox Brothers and Rose and many other outstanding country and bluegrass bands. Eventually, Ed dropped out of the family band and signed on with Bill Monroe for 10 years. Until his death, he continued to play music and enjoyed every minute of it. Musicians and music lovers in this area were acquainted with Herb as he appeared on the Mobeetie stage many times.

Herb had been involved in several community service organizations such as Fair Board Association, president of the Rodeo Association for many years and a member of Panhandle Bluegrass Association.

Two weeks prior to his death, the International Bluegrass Music

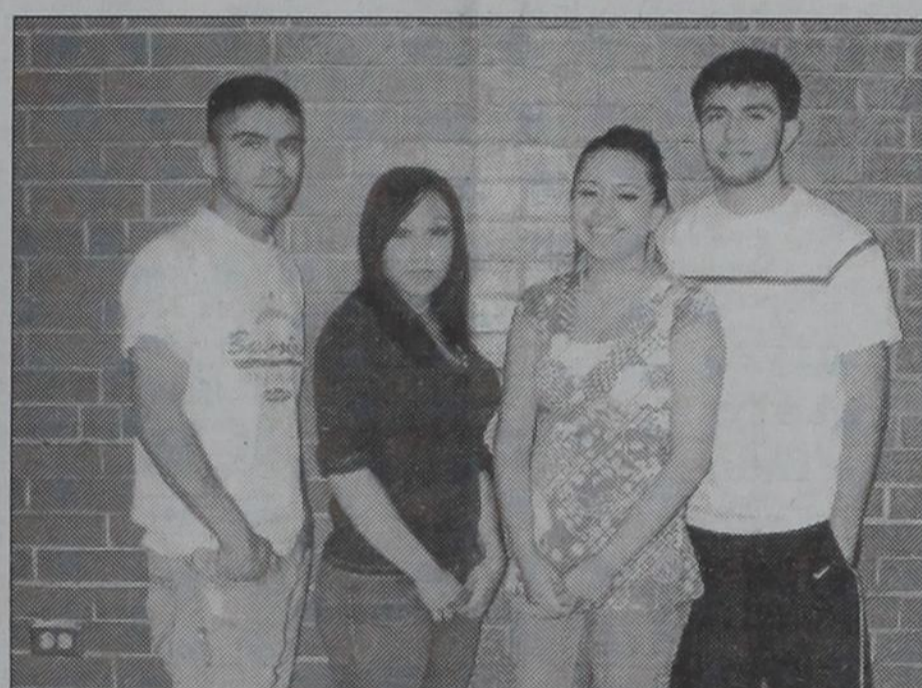

The Hunt Family, an award winning and nationally known bluegrass band, will make their first appearance at the Old Mobeetie Music Festival this July. Dates for the festival are July 25, 26 and 27.

Bluegrass Music has always been a part of the Hunt family's life. Terry Hunt, the father of the group, grew up in the Ozarks of North Arkansas and was bitten by the Bluegrass bug at an early age. Leanne, better known by the group as “Mom”, grew up in a very musical family on a dairy farm in Central Missouri.

Their love of bluegrass soon took root with their sons. Andrew started taking fiddle lessons when he was 7 and Jonathan started at about the same age. In a home where bluegrass and Gospel music were playing on the stereo most of the time, they progressed pretty quickly. Andrew's interest expanded to include the mandolin and Jonathan took up the banjo shortly thereafter.

When a job change included a move from Missouri to Oklahoma, playing music together took on a much larger place in their lives. In 2004, they're evening pastime took on a life of it's own as they began playing music in their church from time to time. This eventually led to other churches and then more events and engagements and then festivals and larger venues such as Silver Dollar City in Branson, Missouri.

The year 2005 was a great year for the band. Terry Hunt proudly shares the group's accomplishments, “We won the band contest at the Oklahoma International Bluegrass Festival and really solidified our skills as a band. We came out with our first CD later that year “Hunt Family Bluegrass” that included Andrew and Jonathan's original song-“Blue and All Alone”. In 2006 we won

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protect actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- The value placed on your property
- Any exemptions that may apply to you
- The cancellation of an agricultural appraisal
- The taxable status of your property
- The local governments which should be taxing your property
- Any action taken by the appraisal district that adversely affected you.

Informal Review

If you have any questions, you may contact the Wheeler County Appraisal District at 402 S. Main St., Wheeler, Texas 79096, or telephone (806) 826-5900.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 402 S. Main Street, Wheeler, Texas 79096 or (806) 826-5900.

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at \$1,000,000 or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

You can also get a pamphlet describing how to prepare a protest from the appraisal district or from the State Comptroller's Property Tax Division, PO Box 13528, Austin, Texas 78711.

Deadline for Filing Protest with the ARB

Usual deadlines

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later). The Protest deadline for this year is July 7, 2008.

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond our control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

Special deadlines

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of the land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or Holiday.

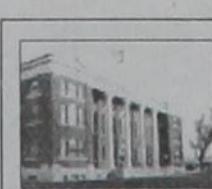

Be Ready For Fishing In Heat

By Boyd Duckett

Some people think that the summertime is not the best time to catch bass - much less big bass. The hotter and higher the sun gets, the better sitting in front of the air conditioner begins to sound. It's during this time of year that too many anglers opt for sipping iced tea instead of fishing.

I fish for a living, so retreating to the climate-controlled house when it gets hot simply is not an option. I have to be able to catch

"Texans deserve a clear, straightforward explanation of what we are doing to solve our transportation challenges and how we are doing it."

The Texas Transportation Commission is a five-member board appointed by the Governor to oversee the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT).

The Commission reaffirmed its commitment to meet or exceed the requirements of state law on five key issues:

- All state highway facilities, including the Trans-Texas Corridor, will be completely owned by the State of Texas at all times.

- All Comprehensive Development Agreements will include provisions that allow TxDOT to purchase or "buy back" the interest of a private developer in a CDA at any time if buying back the project would be in the best financial interest of the Texas Transportation Commission.

- The initial toll rates charged for the use of a toll project on the state highway system and the methodology for increasing the amount of tolls.

- All rate-setting actions will come after consultation with appropriate local metropolitan planning organizations.

- Only new lanes added to an existing highway will be tolled, and there will be no reduction in the number of non-tolled lanes that exist today.

- Comprehensive development agreements will not include "non-compete" clauses that would prohibit improvements to existing roadways.

- The Department and any governmental entity can construct, reconstruct, expand, rehabilitate or maintain any roadway that is near or intersects with any roadway under the CDA.

In recognition of the Texas Legislature's commitment to protecting landowners' property rights and in following the department's long-standing practice with other transportation projects, the commission affirmed two additional principles:

- TxDOT will always consider the use of existing right of way that satisfies the purpose and need of the project as a possible project location when conducting environmental studies.

- To the extent practical, TxDOT shall plan and design facilities so that a landowner's property is not severed into two or more separate tracts and the original shape of the property is preserved.

"These principles will help guide TxDOT as we work to improve our state's traffic congestion and air quality problems," said Delisi. "The Texas Legislature shares our commitment to improving highway safety and creating economic opportunity, and they expect us to meet these goals in keeping with our state's tradition of protecting the rights of property owners."

Delisi said that the Trans-Texas Corridor implementation plan "Crossroads of the Americas," should be updated to reflect changes in the state's transportation challenges since it was first released in June of 2002.

"As we work to develop important projects like a parallel corridor to I-35 and the long-awaited I-69, we will work toward meeting our goals with these important principles in mind," she said.

bass in the wind, rain, sleet, snow and the heat. In fact, I really like to catch big fish during the summer. When it's hot and sunny, bass - like a lot of anglers - like to get in under the edge of a shade line and will feed looking out. The fish will suspend under cover, so what I like to do is get up close and pitch right down the edges, letting the bait free fall.

In the heat, I will target both structure and vegetation. In these environments, I like to pitch a Berkley 4-inch Power Flippin' Tube or a Berkley Gripper Football Head Jig. In heavy wood, I might go with a 10-inch Berkley Power Worm with a big half-ounce sinker. The big weight is critical at this time to help sink the bait pretty fast, which can go a long way towards making a sometimes sluggish summer bass excited enough to strike.

If the bites slow down, try downsizing your bullet weight and do some "finesse flipping" from close range. By flipping smaller weights, you minimize the amount of splash upon your bait's entry and are less likely to spook the fish. By pitching in front of your boat and staying quiet, you can target bass that are hiding in grass that other anglers couldn't catch or don't realize they are there.

When targeting summer bass with these presentations, make sure to keep an eye on your line. When you pitch a big worm and a sinker into heavy cover, you have to watch the line, because when it stops, you want to immediately lift up on it and see if there's tension or weight. I almost always use Berkley Trilene 100% Fluorocarbon for most of my summer presentations (except topwater lures) because of its manageability, strength and it has little or no stretch so you can strong-arm that big bass out of its shady hangout more easily.

There's no sure-fire way to catch big bass once summer rolls around. Different presentations work in different places at different times, regardless of season. But being on the water is the first step towards a successful and memorable summer fishing trip. So if you're out there, find the cover and make sure that you have the gear you need to be able to get them out of it.
