Santa Will Be in Wheeler Sun. and Mon.; Businesses To Be Open For Shopping

The Christmas Season will officially begin in Wheeler this year on Sunday, Nov. 30 from 2:30 until 5:00; the first day of Wheeler Chamber of Commerce Christmas Open House. The Open House will continue Monday, December 1, 2003 from 5:30 until 9:00 P.M..

Several businesses on the square will be open for their customers to shop.

There will be a stew dinner Sunday afternoon sponsored by Wheeler Chamber of Commerce with proceeds going to purchase of folding tables and chairs. Mon-

day evening Sausage on a stick will be sold by Knights of Columbus.

Santa Claus has arranged his schedule to be in Wheeler on Sunday afternoon and Monday evening; his location will be marked with signs. Due to the courthouse

restoration, he will not be in the gazebo on the square. Santa will arrive on a fire truck and he will have a stocking for each child. Picture will be available.

The city's Christmas lights will be in place and lighted on Sunday evening.

Wheeler Flower Shop will have their annual Christmas Open House on Monday evening from 4:30 until 8:30.

A Mini Crafts Mall will offer locals to display and sell their craft and/or other items. West Texas Christian School on the south side of the square will be the location. Booths include crafts, wood projects, home interior, candles, purses, jewelry, toys, clothing, bake sale, and other great Christmas items. The Wheeler senior class will be selling raffle tickets on half a hog.

Wheeler Banking Center will be giving \$250.00 in cash to some lucky shopper at the Christmas Open House; a purchase from any booth will enter you in the drawing.

These tickets will be placed in a hopper for a drawing to be held at the close of the event. Wheeler Banking Center is making the drawing possible; the drawing will be Monday evening at the end of the open house.

Reservations for a space in the Crafts Mall can be obtained by contacting the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce at 826-3408—the sooner, the better. The cost for a space is \$10 for a non-chamber member. There is no charge for members to operate a booth.

The Open House is for the purpose of giving Wheeler shoppers an opportunity to see what Wheeler merchants have to offer in the way of Christmas gifts.

Sheriff Jimmy Adams' Retirement Date; Cannon To Remain On Courthouse Square

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session at the Courthouse Annex on Monday, November 24, 2003. Twenty items were on the agenda. The payroll time sheets were approved for payment, the bills were paid and the treasurer's report was accepted.

No action was taken on the budget.

No action was necessary on the Courthouse Restoration project.

The burn ban for the county was left in place.

A representative of Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins and Mott, L.L.P. met with the court to present a proposal for the collection of unpaid court fines for Wheeler County. Changes in the law allows a penalty for late payment to be added up to 30%. The firm would charge 20% for the collection of fines. The county has some \$46,000 in uncollected fines. The commissioners agreed to the contract; this will also allow the collection of J.P. court fines.

Sheriff Jimmy Adams met with the court to inform them of changes in the personnel at the jail. Pat Childress will be retiring in January; Carrie Gaines has expressed an interest in taking the job of Jail Administrator. Sheriff Adams was given permission to hire a new person to fill a position as dispatcher/jailer.

The court was petitioned to keep cannon on Courthouse lawn. They voted in favor of petition; the cannon will be left in place.

Sheriff Adams also met with the commissioners to announce his retirement as sheriff. He will have held the office for the past 15 years and 102 days. The retirement will be as of December 31, 2003.

Adams also recommended the commissioners appoint Deputy Rick Walden as Sheriff to fill in until the voters decide on a new sheriff.

Daryl Snelgrooves reported Randy Finsterwald is to be removed from the county payroll as of November 15, 2003.

Daryl Snelgrooves has employed Ed Hennig as a full time employee as of 12/01/2003 at a salary of \$1,933.92 per month.

The commissioners approved the designation of 206 E. Texas St., in Wheeler as Temporary Court for the 31st District Court in Wheeler, Texas.

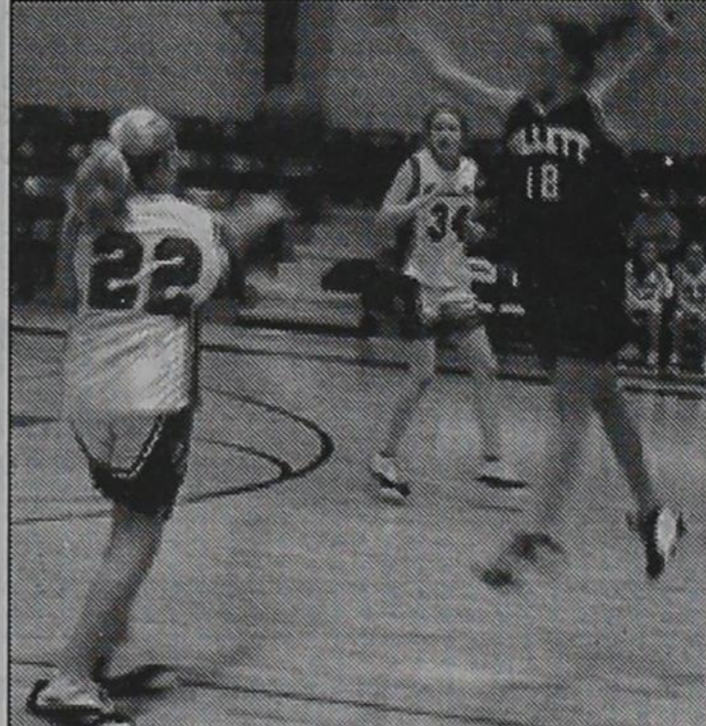
The First United Methodist Church Fellowship Hall in Wheeler was designated as Auxiliary Court for the 31st District Court.

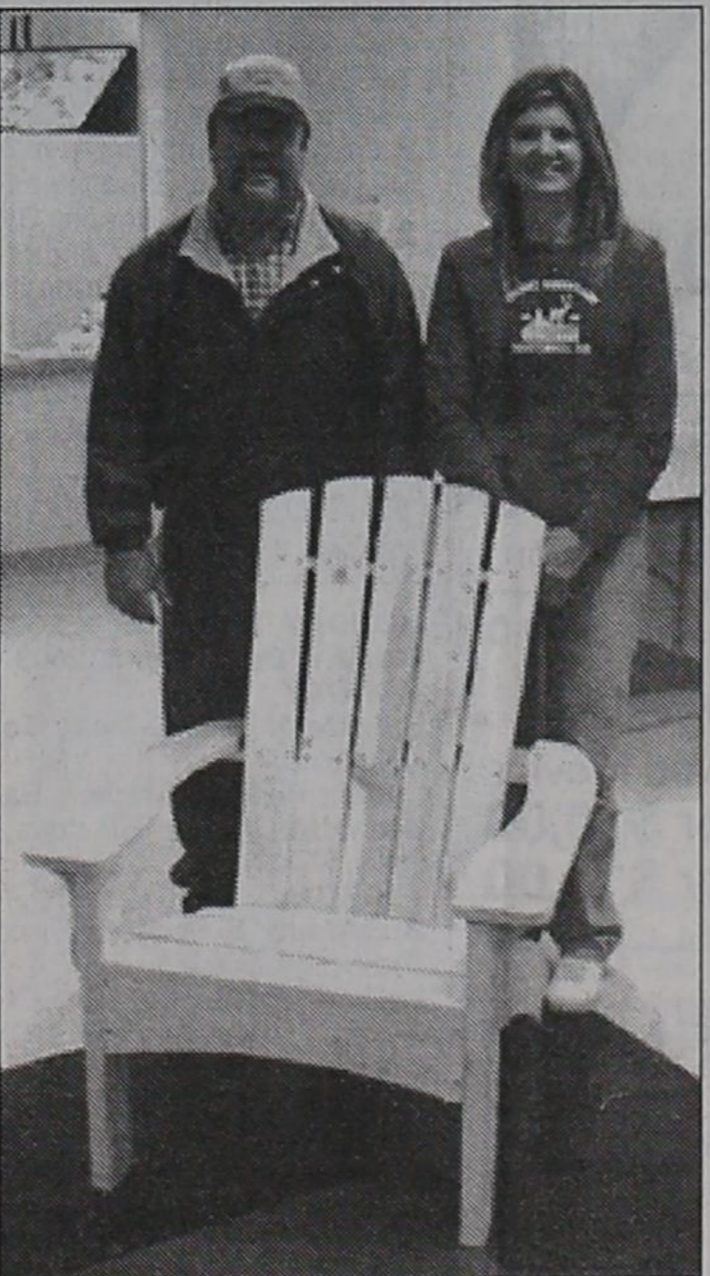

It is the Thanksgiving time of Year. For the past few weeks, and at least for one more Sunday, I have been preaching sermons related to a few different Psalms of Thanksgiving that are recorded for us in the Old Testament book of Psalms. If you want an easy explanation of what precisely a Psalm of Thanksgiving is, read Psalm 136. In this unique Psalm each verse begins with a statement of something great God has done or a voice of thankfulness - and then each verse concludes with a repetitive phrase: "His love endures forever." So what is the point of Psalm 136 or any other Psalm of Thanksgiving? Simple, it is just a way of showing gratitude, appreciation, and thankfulness for what God has done and who he is.

God is worthy of praise. He has done marvelous things. Listen to a few of these quotes from the Psalms (I won't identify the locations, you can look them up yourselves - or call me if you can't find them). "When I called, you answered me; you made me bold and stout-hearted." "You turned my weeping into dancing; you removed my sackcloth and clothed me with joy." "Shout with joy to God, all the earth! Sing to the glory of his name; offer him glory and praise!" "May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face shine upon us." "For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations." "Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; bring an offering and come into his courts."

By the way, there are a lot of other verses that can also be used to bring forth the idea of praise and thanksgiving to the Lord. During this week of Thanksgiving, let's truly find many reasons to offer thanks, and then let's go the distance and give thanks to God.

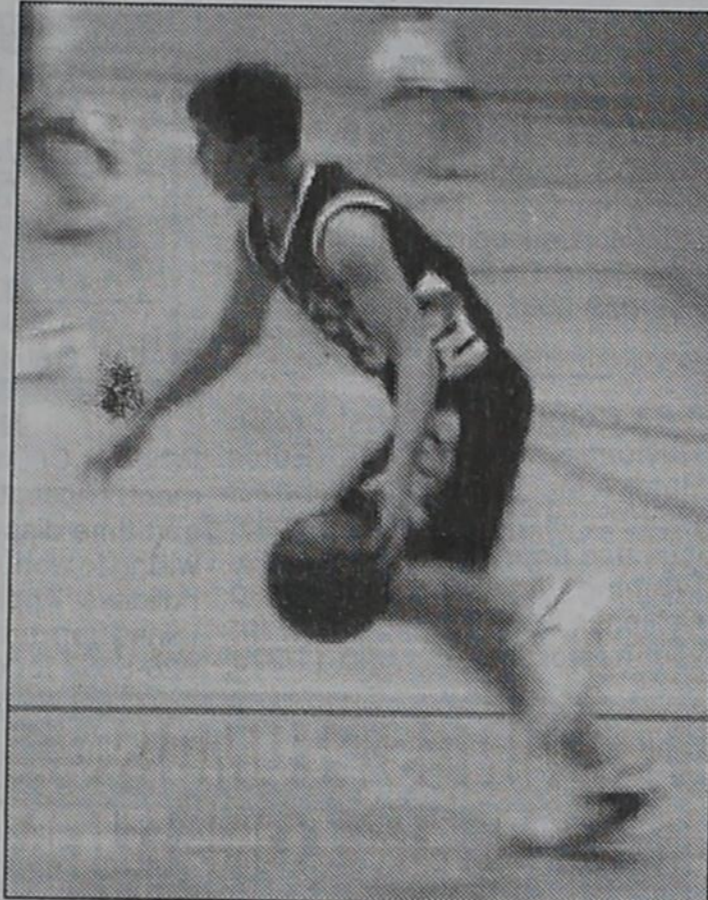

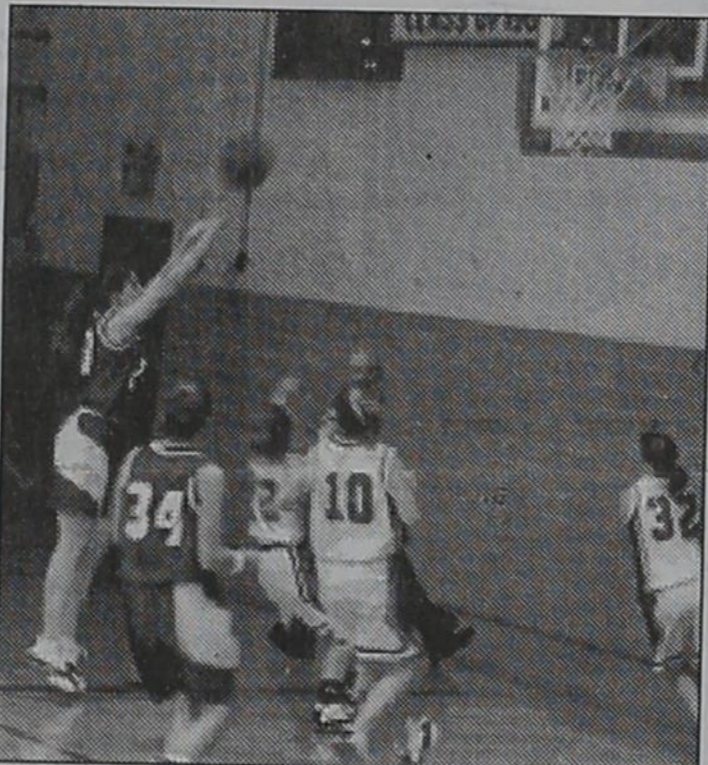

Jason Boydston, #4, brings down rebound.



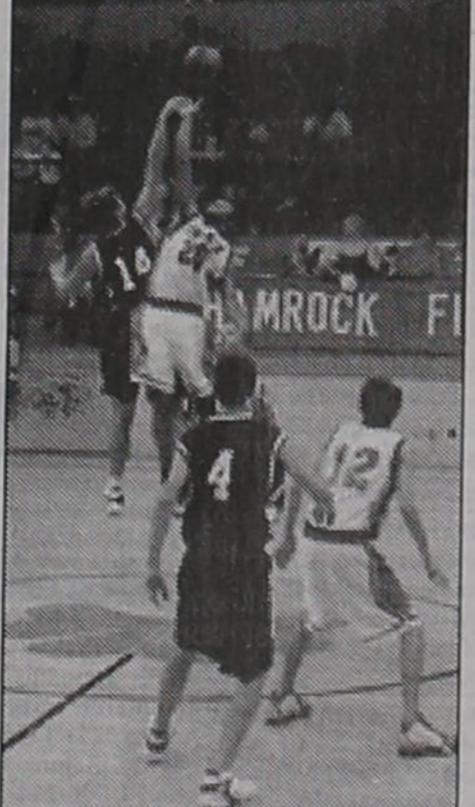

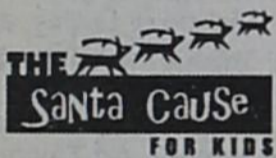
