Our sympathy to the Meriwether family in the loss of 'Grandma Meriwether'.

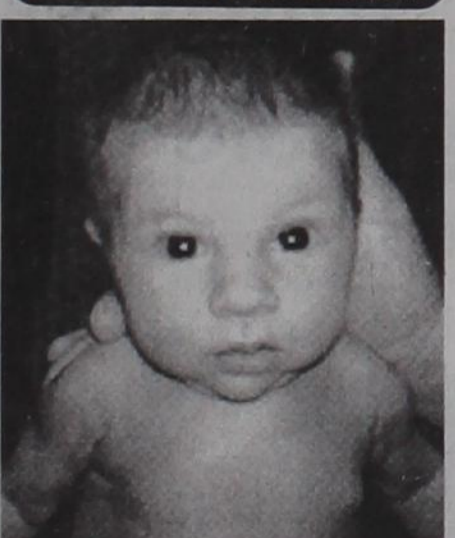

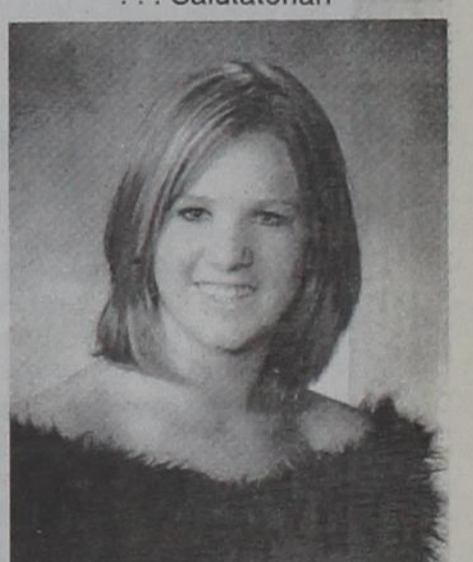

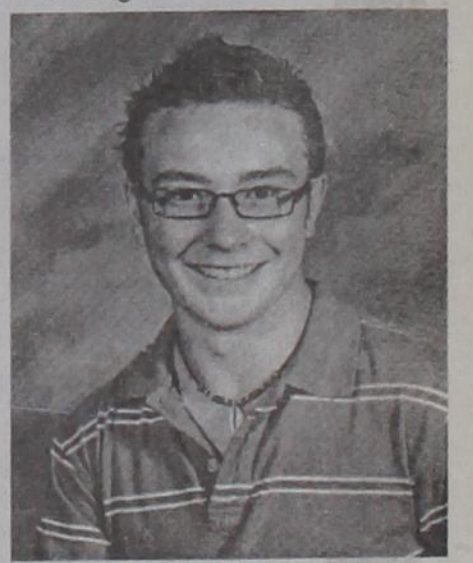

The View of a Southern Woman

... Southern California that is.

We hit Spring Creek for a day of fishing and caught 31 fish in 2 hours. Of course, I hooked most of them. Took 30 minutes to clean them with both of us working on it. On the way home, I saw some pretty iris (they are called flags in this part of the country) blooming along a fence on the road near a deserted barn, so Glenn Forrest Frosty did one of his famous U-turns and got the shovel out for an iris dig. I have always loved iris and have many colors. There were millions of plants in several different colors so I asked Glenn to dig a few hundred. He hears one thing and does another, so he got me about 16 plants. Many years ago in California, my mother had a large iris garden and every year I would buy her two or three new ones that she picked out. These award-winning iris usually cost \$25 to \$35 each and this was in the 1960s, but they were beautiful. I still remember some of their names. Iris do very well here and this year they are huge. I have a lot of giant white ones that a lady in Elk City, OK, gave me last year, so I took some down to the Oklahoma lake house. Two giant trees in the front yard down there have loads of rose and tan/pink iris in full bloom.

We planted tomatoes at the lake house and, of course, some flowers. It rains more there than in Texas, so I do not have to worry about watering so often. Kelton brought me some giant tadpoles for my pond after I begged him not to use them for fish bait. I have probably made another mistake with the tadpoles as I still have many, many frogs near the fish ponds from that tadpole-raising a few years back. Every time I get near my Koi and goldfish ponds, a few frogs jump into the water from all angles. Kind of frightening when you do not expect it.

Kelton, our 13-year-old grandson, can really fish but, of course, he started when he was 2 years old! That is when his dad, Robbie, and grandpa, Glenn, started taking him on all-night fishing trips. I think he will be a great baseball player someday for he is good at that, too.

Robbie's uncle Roy has a huge barn that he uses just for entertaining purposes so we had a big Mother's Day dinner/lunch there. Those Oklahoma ladies do some fancy cooking and they really are wonderful cooks. The boys played ball on the large lawn and retained many shades of mud and grass stains. Robbie, SaRita and Kelton spent the rest of the day with us in our boat on Fort Cobb lake. We caught fish and SaRita worked on a tan and manned the camera. While on shore, Kelton was showing me how far he could skip stones across the water. Now, I have done that many times on the Colorado River in California, but now discovered that the shoulder no

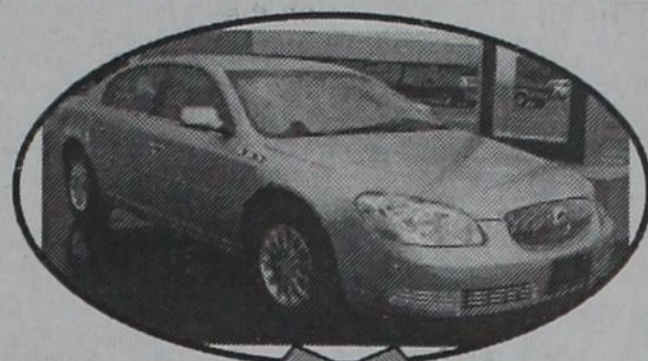

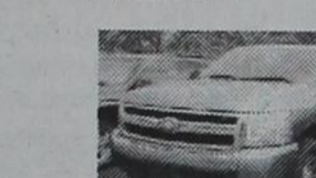

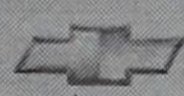

Notice of Application Requesting An Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor and Related Relief

On May 1, 2008, Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO) filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to authorize SWEPCO to implement an Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor (EECRF) effective as of December 30, 2008, the commencement of SWEPCO's January 2009 billing month.

Section 39.905 of the Public Utility Regulatory Act and Section 25.181 of the Commission's Substantive Rules provide for the Commission to authorize a utility to implement an EECRF to ensure the timely and reasonable recovery of the utility's costs to satisfy energy efficiency goals established by the Texas Legislature. SWEPCO has requested that the EECRF recover approximately \$3.8 million in energy efficiency costs which it will incur to satisfy the energy efficiency objectives for 2009. SWEPCO proposes that the EECRF apply to all retail customers in its Texas service areas who take service below 69,000 volts.

The proposed EECRF will include the following charges for electric service to the following categories of customers:

Under the requested EECRF, the amount billed to a residential customer using 1000 kilowatt hours (kWh) per month will increase by \$0.70. The effect of the EECRF on other customers will vary depending on the rate schedules under which they take service and on their usage of electricity.

In its application, SWEPCO also requests that the Commission include in its final order a finding that expressly confirms that SWEPCO will be permitted to recover through and include in the EECRF to be set in a future proceeding, its reasonable energy efficiency expenditures incurred in 2008 that are in excess of the amount of \$400,000 that SWEPCO currently recovers through the purchased power and conservation factor (PPCF) previously approved by the Commission. SWEPCO projects that such excess 2008 amount will be approximately \$2.3 million. SWEPCO further requests the Commission to confirm in its final order that it is in the public interest to encourage an electric utility to incur energy efficiency expenditures up to the expenditure limits set forth in the statute and Commission rule for cost effective energy efficiency and achieve as much demand and energy savings as reasonably possible with the objective of exceeding the minimum goals set forth in the statute and Commission rule.

Persons who wish to intervene in or comment upon these proceedings, Docket No. 35625 Application of Southwestern Electric Power Company for an Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor (EECRF) and Related Relief pursuant to PURA § 39.905(b) and P.U.C. SUBST. R. 25.181(f), should notify the Commission as soon as possible, as an intervention deadline will be imposed. A request to intervene or for further information should be mailed to the Public Utility Commission of Texas, P. O. Box 13326, Austin, Texas 78711-3326. next regular meeting of the court to Tuesday, May 27, as Monday, May 26, is Memorial Day, a holiday.

No action was taken of item #10, which was for the commissioners to consider opening of County Road 1A—1 1/2 miles East of the Gray County Line, south of I-40.

Elk City, Oklahoma Pipeline, L.P., was given permission to cross County Road T for installation of an oil and gas pipeline.

Enbridge Pipelines (Texas Gathering), L.P., was given permission to cross County Road 23 for installation of oil and gas pipeline.

The court voted to approve a

resolution to support the Precipitation Enhancement program operated by The Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District. That resolution reads:

THE STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF WHEELER A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE PRECIPITATION ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM CURRENTLY BEING OPERATED BY THE PANHANDLE GROUND-WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, our semi-arid region of the State of Texas receives an average of only twenty-one inches of rainfall per year, and

WHEREAS, this program is one tool that an agricultural-based rural area can utilize to maximize the positive economic effects of

rainfall; and

WHEREAS, this program has shown for eight years to be very cost-effective for the amount of additional rainfall received; and

WHEREAS, good science has indicated that current methodology and technology has enabled this Precipitation Enhancement Program to be a safe and effective means of enhancing natural rainfall,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Wheeler County Commissioners Court does, by adoption of this resolution, give its support to the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District's Precipitation Enhancement Program.

SIGNED this 12th day of May, 2008, by each of the commissioners and county judge.

The court also passed a resolution for a county increase in purchase limit. This will allow commissioners to make purchases, not exceeding \$50,000, to be made without action of the court.

The resolution reads: THE STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF WHEELER RESOLUTION COUNTY INCREASE IN PURCHASE LIMIT

WHEREAS, Texas Counties are currently required to utilize competitive bidding or competitive proposal procedures for contract expenditures exceeding \$25,000; and

WHEREAS, the competitive purchase limit for Texas cities was increased from \$25,000 to \$50,000 by the Legislature, effec-

tive September 1, 2007; and WHEREAS, the county bid limit has not been changed since 1999; and

WHEREAS, due to the effects of inflation and costs of implementation of current purchasing procedures, the present bid limit has been rendered inefficient and burdensome; and

WHEREAS, the difference in bid limits between cities and counties has caused confusion among citizens, vendors, and public officials;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, does hereby request that

the State Legislature increase the county purchase limit to \$50,000, consistent with the limit for cities.

SIGNED this 12th day of May, 2008, by the county judge and each of the commissioners. The next regular meeting of the court will be Tuesday, May 27, at 10:00 A.M. Any items to be placed on the agenda must be in the office of the county judge by Thursday, May 22, 2008, at 5:00 p.m.
