### **Entrance Exam For** Voc. Nursing Prog.

Clarendon College is offering an entrance test for individuals interested in applying for admission into the Vocational Nursing

Program on Wednesday, July 7. Cost for the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) is \$40 and will be given at the Vocational Nursing Program classroom located at 313 South Kearney. Achieving a passing score on the TEAS is one of the admission requirements for the program and individuals may only take the test a maximum of two (2) times. Test times are by appointment only. Other test dates for the TEAS will be July 13 and August 23.

Vocational Nursing is a one-year program being offered in Clarendon. Satisfactory completion of the program entitles the student to receive a Certificate of Completion and to take the examination required by the State Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners to become a Licensed Vocational Nurse in the state of Texas.

land including natural prairie, improved pastureland, or native rangeland now have the opportunity to enroll their lands in the Grassland Reserve Program (GRP). GRP is a voluntary program that restores or protects these lands while maintaining their use as grazing lands. GRP is one of the conservation programs of the 2002 Farm Bill and is administered by USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the Farm Service Agency (FSA)

Applications for GRP are now being accepted at the local USDA Service Center at either the NRCS or FSA office. The last day for submitting an application for this year's funding is July 23, 2004.

The program emphasizes support for grazing operations, plant and animal biodiversity, and grasslands under the greatest threat of conversion. The minimum amount

Enrollment options are: Permanent and 30-year easements; 10year, 15-year, 20-year, or 30-year rental agreements. Restoration agreements are available in conjunction with easements or rental agreements to provide cost share for needed conservation practices.

Allowable activities include common grazing practices, haying, mowing, or harvesting for seed. Fire rehabilitation and the construction of firebreaks and fences are also allowed.

Prohibited activities are the production of crops, fruit trees, and vineyards that require breaking the soil surface. Also prohibited are any other activities that would disturb the surface of the land except those permitted by an NRCS approved conservation plan.












