He married Ida McCormick in 1976 at Shamrock; she died in 1985. He also was preceded in death by two sons, Percy Hendrick, in 1980, and Dink Hendrick, in Jan, 1990.

Survivors include three sisters, Curtis Lynch of Porterville, Calif., and Jewel Dayberry and Nettie Fay Vinyard, both of Shamrock; a brother, Dale Hendrick of Spearman; four grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

Barbra Koelzer made the motion, seconded by Mark Frankenberg to move the regular meeting to 7:00 beginning with the April meeting. The motion carried.

Perhaps this affect can best be illustrated by a question. This question is: "Who will be responsible if you are not saved?" There are two possible answers to this question. These answers are: . . .

1. God will be responsible. One of the most popular religious beliefs is predestination which advocates that God has predetermined the people who will be saved and the people who will be lost. But the New Testament says that God is "Not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance." (II Peter 3:9)

It is extremely hard to understand how anyone could truly believe that God is responsible if someone is not saved. The New Testament clearly describes the costly provision that God has made for the salvation of people. He gave His son, Jesus Christ, as a substitutionary sacrifice for their sins (Romans 3:21-30)

2. The church is responsible. It is extremely important for the church to remember the Biblical admonitions against being "—a stumbling block—" to someone. (Matthew 18:7-10), Romans 14:13) But is also important for people to remember the nature of the church. The church is composed of people who are saved by the grace of God, not their sinless perfection. (Ephesians 2:4-10, Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-8)

To expect sinless perfection from the church is an expectation that God Himself does not have. He does not want the church to sin, but He knows that the church will. And for this reason, the church has "—an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and He Himself is the propitiation of our sins; and not ours only, but also those of the whole world." (I John 1:8-18; 2:1-2)

Hypocrisy must not be sanctioned in the church, but is must constantly be remembered that the church is justified by its faith in Jesus Christ, not by its sinless perfection. Ant it is wrong for anyone to use the church's imperfections to justify their failure to obey and serve God.

If God is not responsible and if the Church is not responsible, who, then is responsible if you are not saved? The only possible answer is you! The personal pronoun "I" is included in life's most important question which is "What must I do to be saved?" With the sacrificial death of Jesus, God has provided forgiveness for the sins of people, but it is the responsibility of each person to accept or reject this forgiveness.

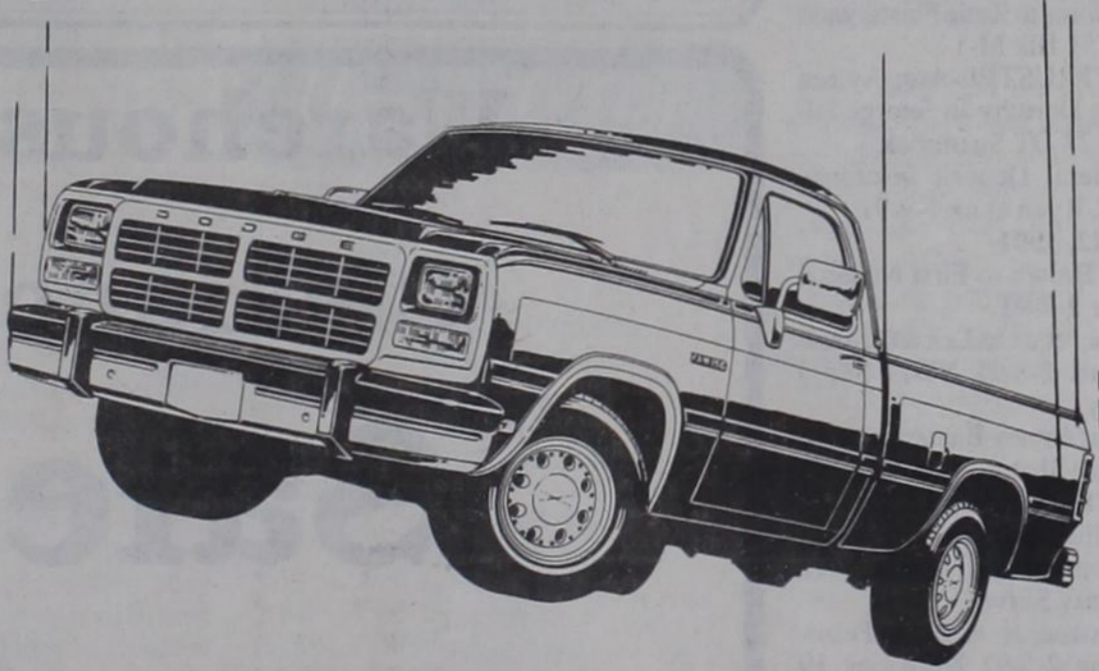
Do you want to be saved? Then do not "pass the buck". Accept through an obedient faith the forgiveness of your sins which is provided by the death of Jesus Christ.

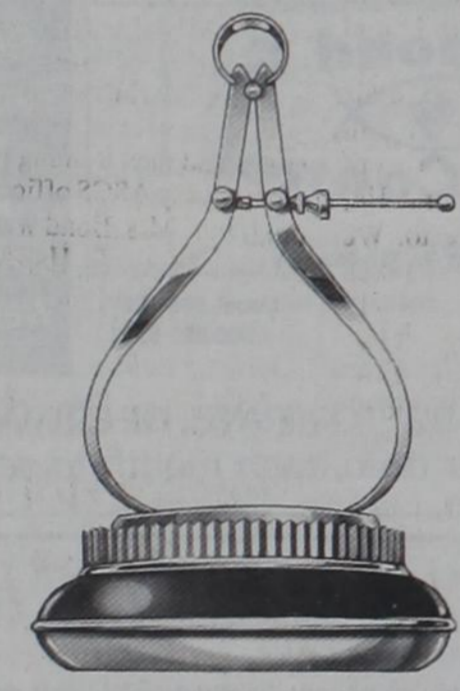
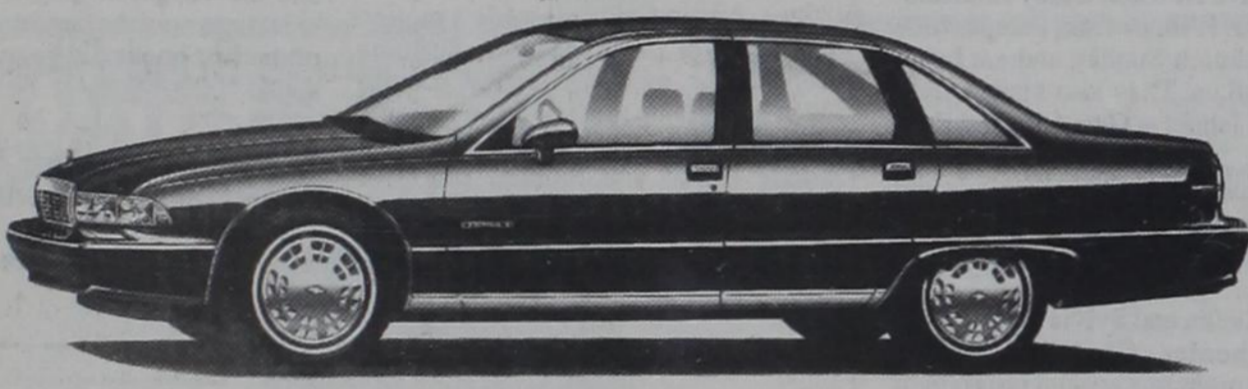

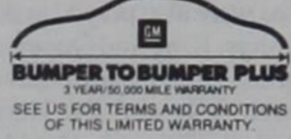
