FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK: saved by the grace of God, not their Will Rogers once observed that there are three stages of American historythe passing of the buffalo, the passing of the Indian, and the passing of the buck.

It is fairly obvious that the passing of the buck is a prominent characteristic of the twentieth century. It is easier for people to blame someone else than it is to accept responsibility for their own life. And since this characteristic is so prominent, it is not surprising that Christianity has been affected.

Perhaps this affect can best be illustrated by a question. This question is: "Who will be responsible if you are not saved?" There are two possible answers to this question. These answers are: . . .

1. God will be responsible. One of the most popular religious beliefs is predestination which advocates that God has predetermined the people who will be saved and the people who will be lost. But the New Testament says that God is "-Not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance." (II Peter 3:9)

It is extremely hard to understand how anyone could truly believe that God is responsible if someone is not saved. The New Testament clearly describes the costly provision that God has made for the salvation of people. He gave His son, people, but it is the responsibility of Jesus Christ, as a substitutionary sacrifice each person to accept or reject this for their sins (Romans 3:21-30)

2. The church is responsible. It is extremely important for the church to remember the Biblical admonitions against being "-a stumbling block-" to someone. (Matthew 18:7-10), Romans 14:13) But is also important for people to remember the nature of the church. The church is composed of people who are

sinless perfection. (Ephesians 2:4-10, Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-8) To expect sinless perfection from the church is an expectation that God

Himself does not have. He does not want the church to sin, but He knows that the church will. And for this reason, the church has "-an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and He Himself is the propitiation of our sins; and not ours only, but also those of the whole world." (I John 1:8-18; 2:1-2)

With the sacrificial death of Jesus, God has provided forgiveness for the sins of forgiveness.

Do you want to be saved? Then do not "pass the buck". Accept through an obedient faith the forgiveness of your sins which is provided by the death of Jesus Christ.




