## NOTICE OF COMPARABLE TAX RATES AND REVENUES

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provides \$ 11,424 per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides $\$ 6,024$ per student in state and local revenues.

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of $78.02 \downarrow$ for county education districts. State law does not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require a school district to adopt a tax rate that maximizes the receipt of state funds.

The board of trustees of the Allison School District hereby gives notice that it is considering the adoption o a tax rate of $36.5 \$$ that will provide $\$ 12.923$ per student in state and local revenues.
