The purpose of the program is to promote international understanding while building leadership skills among America's youth.

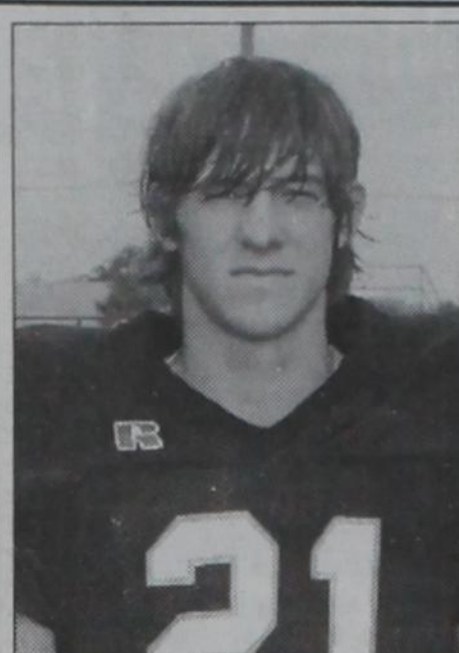

Christie Jones met with the commissioners to get their approval for the Chamber of Commerce to use the gazebo for Santa Claus' visit the latter part of November. Permission was granted.

This was the last commissioner's court meeting to be held in the Courthouse Annex. With the completion of the courthouse project, the commissioners will be moved back into their courtroom for the Monday, November 8 meeting.

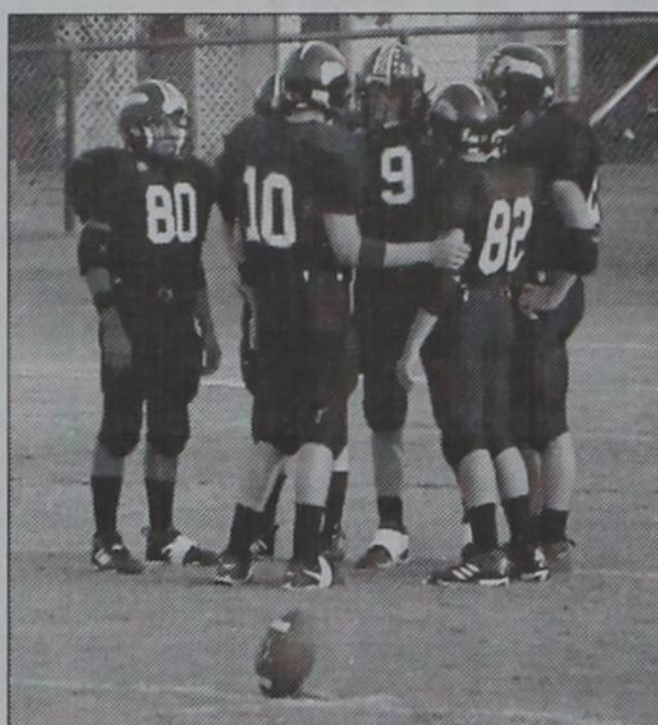
out. They don't know when or if they'll be getting anymore.

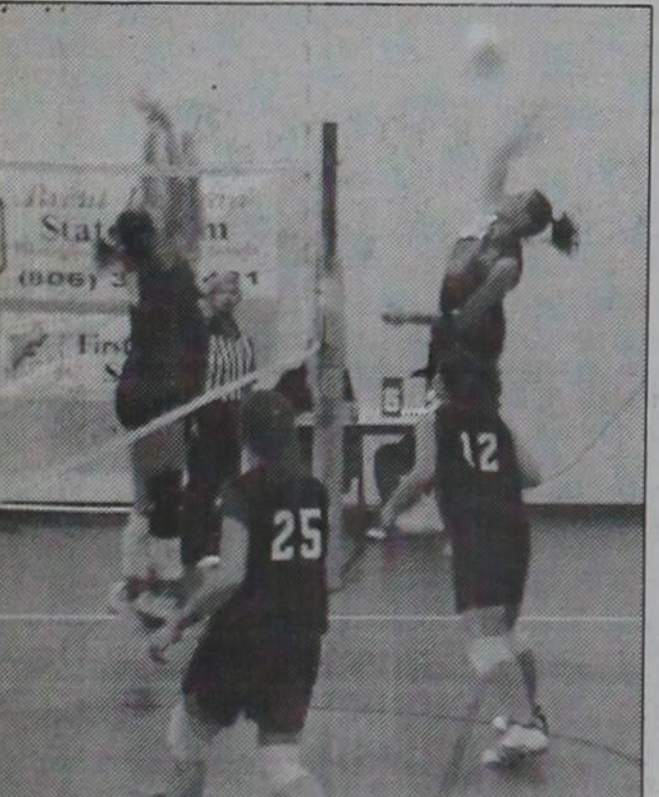

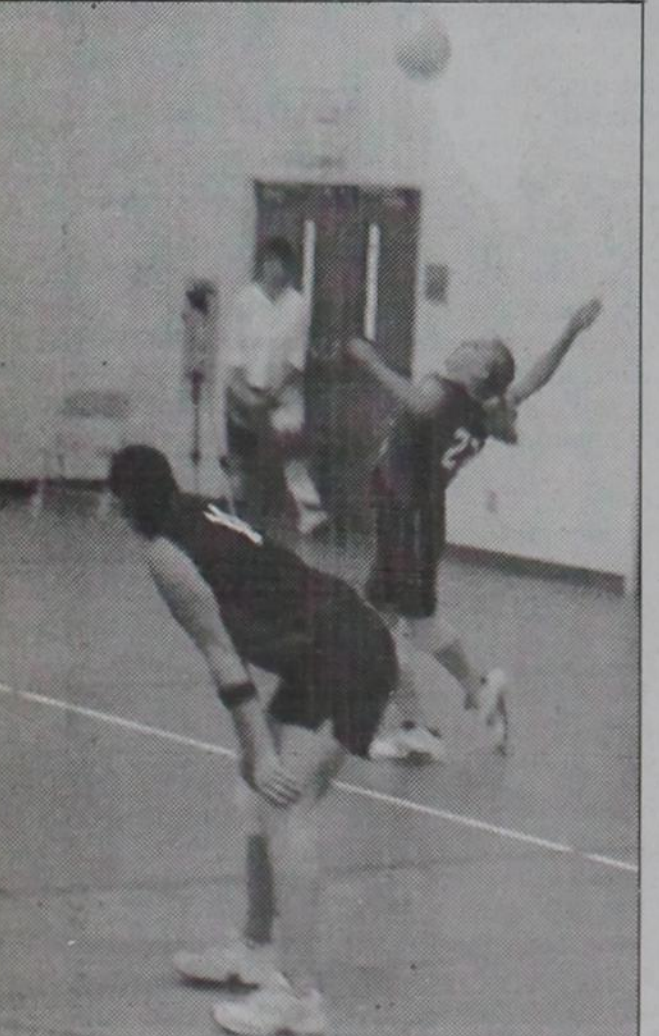

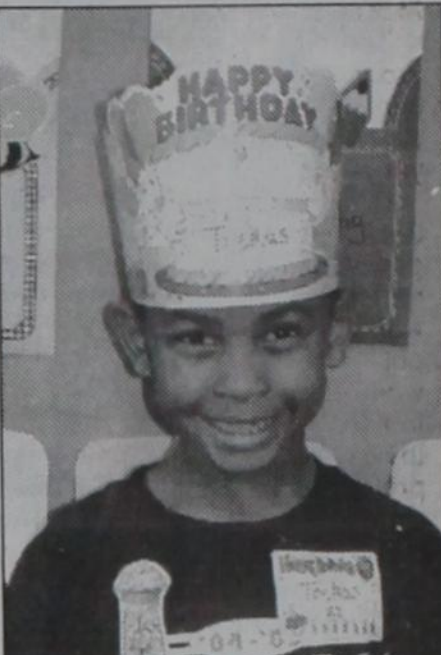

 The tree order forms are available at the local Soil and Water Conservation District office at: 1410 S. Alan Bean Blvd. in Wheeler, Texas or you can call (806)826-3565 ext. 101 and we can mail an order form to you.  
 All trees ordered must be pre-paid. The last day for ordering is March 11, 2005. Trees will come in the last part of March. We encourage everyone to order trees early since there is a limited supply. Orders will be filled in the order they are received.
