## Rites Are Monday For Irene Rogers

Irene Lois Switzer Rogers, 87, died Friday, December 24, 2004, at Amarillo, Texas.

Services were at 2:00 p.m. Monday, December 27, 2004, in the Church of Christ in Wheeler with Dr. Shawn Johnson, minister officiating.

Burial was in the Wheeler Cemetery under the direction of Wright Funeral Home.

Mrs. Rogers was born January 14, 1917, in Koskonong, Mo., to Alva Benton and Mary Viola Johnston Switzer. She moved to San Diego, California, during WWII and worked in an aircraft plant, then she moved to San Francisco, California and worked in the shipyard until she moved to Pampa in 1945. She met and married Lewis Rogers on December 12, 1945, in Pampa. He died in 2000. They moved to Wheeler in 1949 and she was employed by Shamrock Nursing Home and Parkview Hospital in Wheeler. She was a member of the Church of Christ, American Legion Aux., and the '54 Study Club. Mrs. Rogers' hobbies were crafts and baking for people, who needed her help.

She was preceded in death by her husband, her parents, 3 brothers and 2 sisters.

## Dollar Is Certified Reg. Prof. Appraiser

Donneta R. Dollar, has been on staff with the Wheeler County Central Appraisal District for three and half years. The chief appraiser of the district registered Dollar with the Board of Tax Professional Examiners (BTPE) in order to be in compliance with the Texas Civil Statutes, Article 8885, Sec. 11.

Dollar received her Class III Field Appraiser at this time last year she has now received the Class IV Registered Professional Appraiser (R.P.A.) with the State of Texas. She had to pass an extensive 8-hour exam in order to receive this classification.

Before you can be registered with the Board of Tax Professional Examiners in the certification as an appraiser, you must be working for an appraisal district, or an appraisal firm that is under contract with an appraisal district for appraising properties for tax purposes.

After certification as an R.P.A. you must be reclassified every five years to keep the certification. During this time period you must receive continuing education credits by attending state approved courses.

The Chief Appraiser and the Board of Directors of the Wheeler County Central Appraisal District want to extend their congratulations to Donneta and recognition of the fact that she has fulfilled all the necessary requirements for the designation as a Registered Professional Appraiser with the Board of Tax Professional Examiners.

Wheeler, Texas-Parkview Hospital announced today that they have added a state-of-the-art multi-slice Computed Tomography (CT) scanner to their facility. The new Brilliance CT scanner from Philips Medical Systems features advanced technology that produces split-second high quality images, permitting doctors to see more anatomical detail in a fraction of the time needed for other tests. With this new CT scanner, Parkview Hospital's doctors will be able to more effectively detect and treat a range of life threatening illnesses, including heart disease, cancer, stroke, and lung disease. The possibility of discovering disease in an early stage, when a wider array of effective treatment options may be available, will help doctors make an accurate diagnosis, and recommend appropriate treatment for their patients.

According to Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, CEO, "We can use the extensive image information we get from the Brilliance CT scanner to generate very detailed 3D images which can be used for diagnosis and also shared very quickly with referring physicians and surgeons, where needed, for pre-surgical planning and for treatment evaluation and follow up."

The unmatched speed and sub-millimeter detail of the new CT scanner will also contribute to more rapid assessment and decision making in trauma cases, where physicians may have to make life and death decisions within minutes.

Patients needing a CT scan will find that Parkview Hospital's new scanner offers a much more pleasant experience. Having different parts of your body evaluated using a CT scanner reduces the time needed to have a scan done and get important clinical information for the doctors. And there is no hospital stay required. With much faster scan times patients will usually be asked to carry out one brief breath hold during each scan.

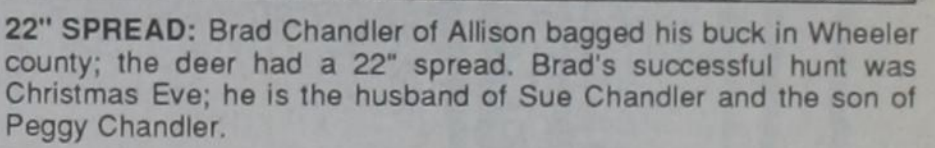
"Older patients and those with breathing difficulties or some other distress will really appreciate the shorter exams," says Ms. Fagan Cook. "We'll have them in and out much faster, and their doctors will be able to access detailed, definitive results within minutes."

All CT scanners use X-rays, however the new Brilliance scanner uses a significantly lower amount of X-ray energy than many of the other CT systems on the market.

"While we need the critical anatomical information we get from a CT scan, we always want to limit the X-ray dose to the patient to the absolute minimum possible, especially for children," says Lucretia Davis, MRT, Director of Radiology. "Our new Brilliance scanner features unique technology that ensures we get exceptional images with significantly lower dose to the patient. And, it has specific built-in pediatric protocols that further minimize the dose to children," she says.

Another advantage the hospital anticipates is the ability to provide more large patients with a CT scan option. The new Brilliance scanner has a table weight capacity of up to 440 lbs.

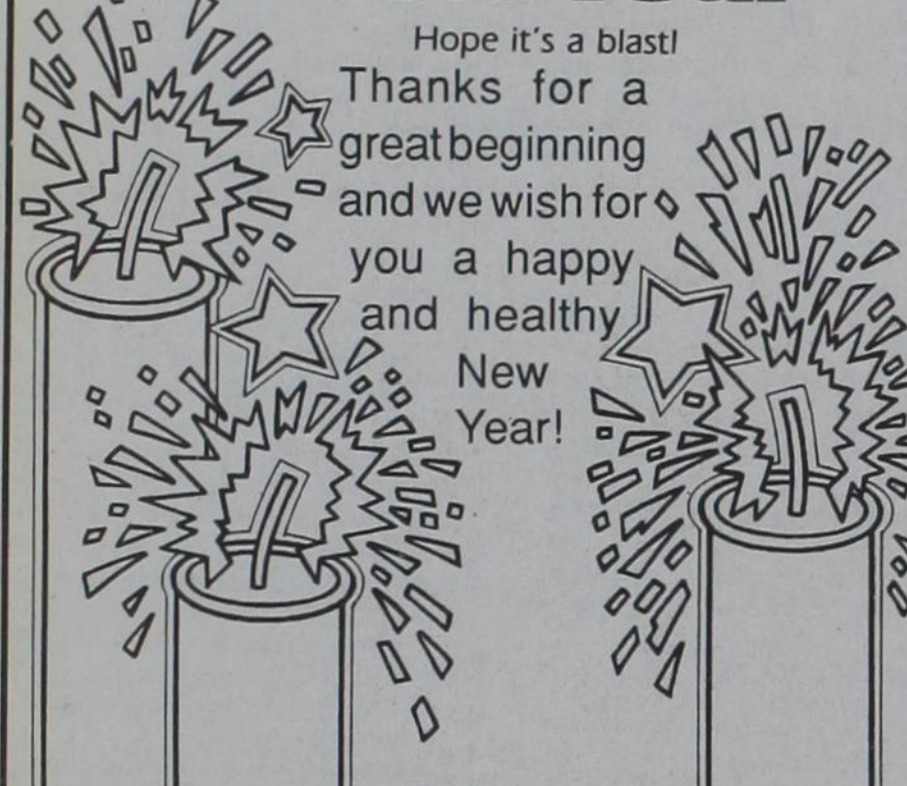

**Tree Topping Is Not Good For The Tree**

A tree sometimes needs to be pruned to avoid interference with utility lines, buildings, or parts of the surrounding environment. Whenever pruning is required, it is important to avoid the practice of topping - the removal of all parts of a tree above a certain height with no consideration for its structure or health.

While long thought to reduce a hazard, topping is a temporary and ineffective solution that actually makes a tree more hazardous in the long run.

\* Topping "starves" trees by robbing them of their food-creating leaves.

\* Topped trees (in an act of defense) create shoots that grow quickly (up to 20 feet in one year) and are prone to breaking.

\* Topping makes trees more susceptible to insects and disease.

"Topping creates "high maintenance trees" that are expensive to treat, repair, and care for.

**Tree-trimming basics**  
\* Reduction pruning is an effective alternative to topping. It reduces the size of longer branches by cutting back lateral ones. Some branches are removed at their point of origin.

\* Avoid excessive thinning of interior branches. It can lead to rapid growth of upright interior shoots and limb breakage.

\* The best way to learn to manage tree growth and maintain tree health is to consult a Certified Arborist. These tree care professionals know how to safely prune trees, and they can teach homeowners how to best maintain and care for them.

The International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) is a nonprofit organization supporting tree care research around the world. Headquartered in Champaign, Ill., ISA is dedicated to the care and preservation of shade and ornamental trees.
