The chief appraiser of the district registered Dollar with the Board of Tax Professional Examiners (BTPE) in order to be in compliance with the Texas Civil Statutes, Article 8885, Sec. 11.

Dollar received her Class III Field Appraiser at this time last year she has now received the Class IV Registered Professional Appraiser (R.P.A.) with the State of Texas. She had to pass an extensive 8hour exam in order to receive this classification.

Before you can be registered with the Board of Tax Professional Examiners for the certification as an appraiser, you must be working for an appraisal district, or an appraisal firm that is under contract with an appraisal district for appraising properties for tax pur-

After certification as an R.P.A. you must be reclassified every five years to keep the certification. During this time period you must receive continuing education credits by attending state approved







Tree Topping Is Not Good For The Tree

A tree sometimes needs to be pruned to avoid interference with utility lines, buildings, or parts of the surrounding environment. Whenever pruning is required, it is important to avoid the practice of topping - the removal of all parts of a tree above a certain height with no consideration for its structure or health.

While long thought to reduce a hazard, topping is a temporary and ineffective solution that actually makes a tree more hazardous in the long run.

*Topping "starves" trees by robbing them of their food-creating

*Topped trees (in an act of defense) create shoots that grow quickly (up to 20 feet in one year) and are prone to breaking.

* Topping makes trees more susceptible to insects and disease.

*Topping creates "high maintenance trees" that are expensive to treat, repair, and care for.

Tree-trimming basics

*Reduction pruning is an effective alternative to topping. It reduces the size of longer branches by cutting back lateral ones. Some branches are removed at their point

* Avoid excessive thinning of interior branches. It can lead to rapid growth of upright interior shoots and limb breakage.

★The best way to learn to manage tree growth and maintain tree health is to consult a Certified Arborist. These tree care professionals know how to safely prune trees, and they can teach homeowners how to best maintain and care for
