Wheeler County Courthouse Re-dedication Is Sat., Oct. 16

The Wheeler County Courthouse will be dedicated on October 16, 2004, following its one year restoration, made possible with a \$3,756,508.00 grant from the Texas Historical Commission through its Texas Historic Courthouse Preservation Program.

Work began on the project in August 2003 in an effort to return the 1925 Wheeler County Courthouse to its former glory.

"We are now seeing the results of the hard work that has gone into this program," said THC Executive Director Larry Oaks. "Counties completing their restoration work serve as inspirations and examples of what can be accomplished."

To date, the THC has assisted in 49 county courthouse restoration and preservation projects. The THC has received 120 master plans, the first step required in the assistance process. Of those 120 plans submitted, 104 have been approved, requiring approximately \$214 million in state funds to re-

store those courthouses.

In May 2000, the THC awarded \$42.2 million to 19 counties. In October 2001, the THC awarded nearly \$7 million to 28 counties, which was the remainder of the original appropriation from the 76th Legislature. The 77th Legislature allotted an additional \$50 million dollars to the THC to continue the program that has now completed Round III, during which \$47.4 million was awarded to 22 Texas counties to help preserve their historic courthouses. The program received an additional \$45 million from the 78th legislature to continue the program.

"We're excited with the overwhelming response the program has received throughout Texas," said THC Architecture Division Director Stan Graves. "We have laid a strong foundation on which to build an even stronger program."

Several Wheeler County Children have received help from the Ronald McDonald House in Amarillo and what a blessing to have such a wonderful place to stay. Now the Medical Center League House of Amarillo is about to become a reality. This will be an adult version of the Ronald McDonald House for families that need a room for 30 minutes or 30 days. The House will provide a home away from home for those families with adult patients in the hospital and patients that are traveling to Amarillo for outpatient therapy. It will offer not only a comfortable and affordable place to stay, but also a place to gain emotional and physical support. There will be no charge for staying at the Medical League House; however, a modest donation will be requested. Check in will be available both day and night. The Home will be located in the Medical Center within walking distance of Baptist St. Anthony's Hospital, Northwest Texas Hospital, Don & Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and other facilities.

The House will be 16,000 square feet and include:
30 rooms, each with a private bath and television
2 rooms that meet Americans

with Disabilities Act requirements

A kitchen and dining room
A large living room
A manager's suite to allow for 24 hour access to and from the facility
An office for part-time help
A prayer garden
A laundry room
An opportunity for a second phase of development

Several Communities in the Panhandle are "buying a room" or "sponsoring a room" for their citizens to use. What a comfort for our home town families that need to stay in Amarillo for medical reasons to see "Wheeler" on a plaque above their door. Every family that needs help will know that their town had an impact in making this project possible and easing some of their burden. 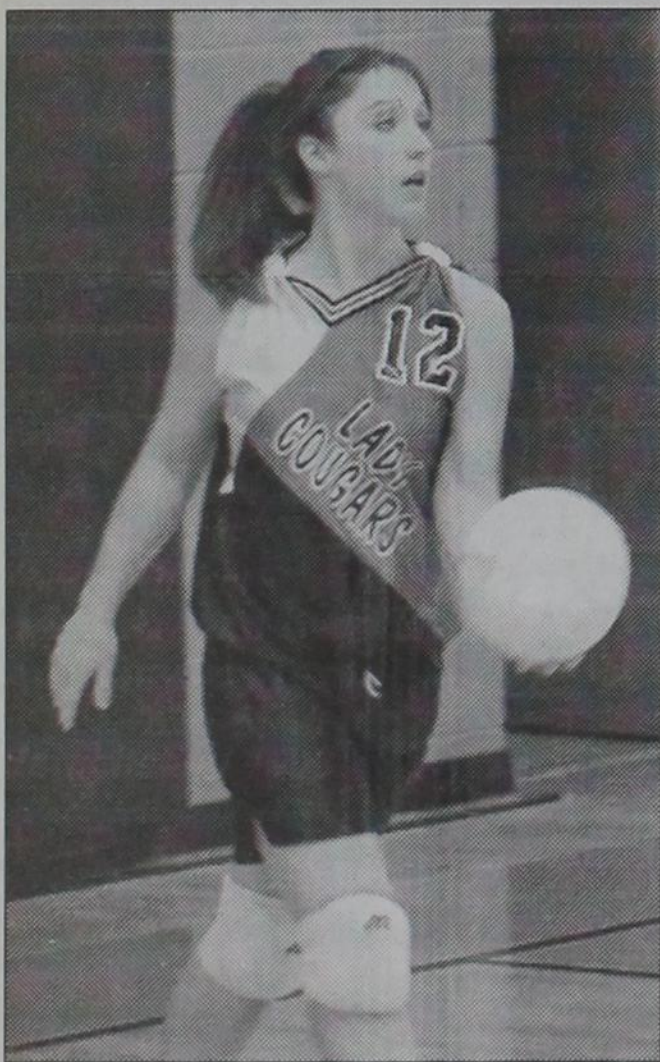

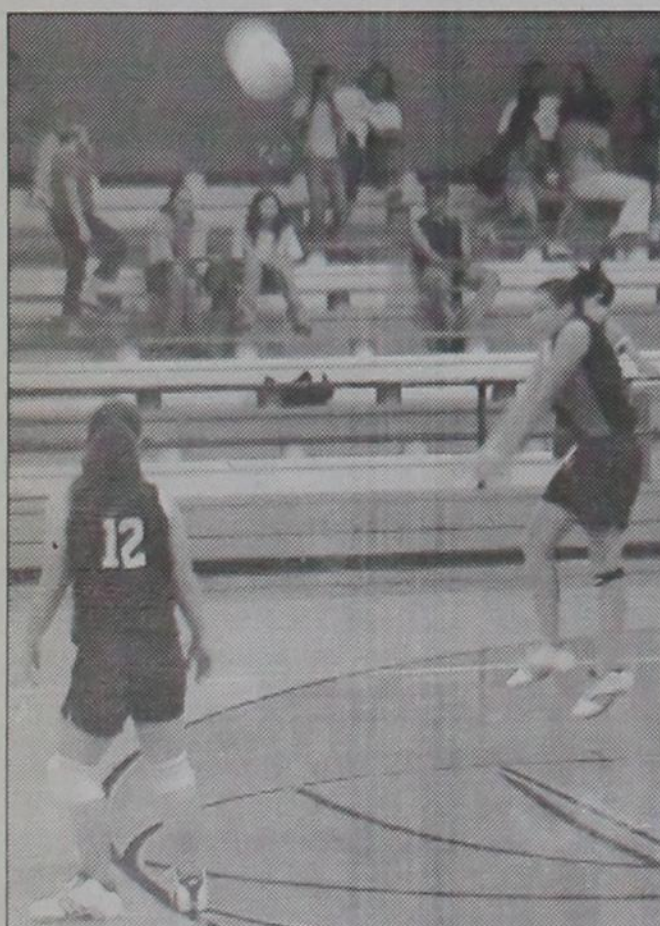

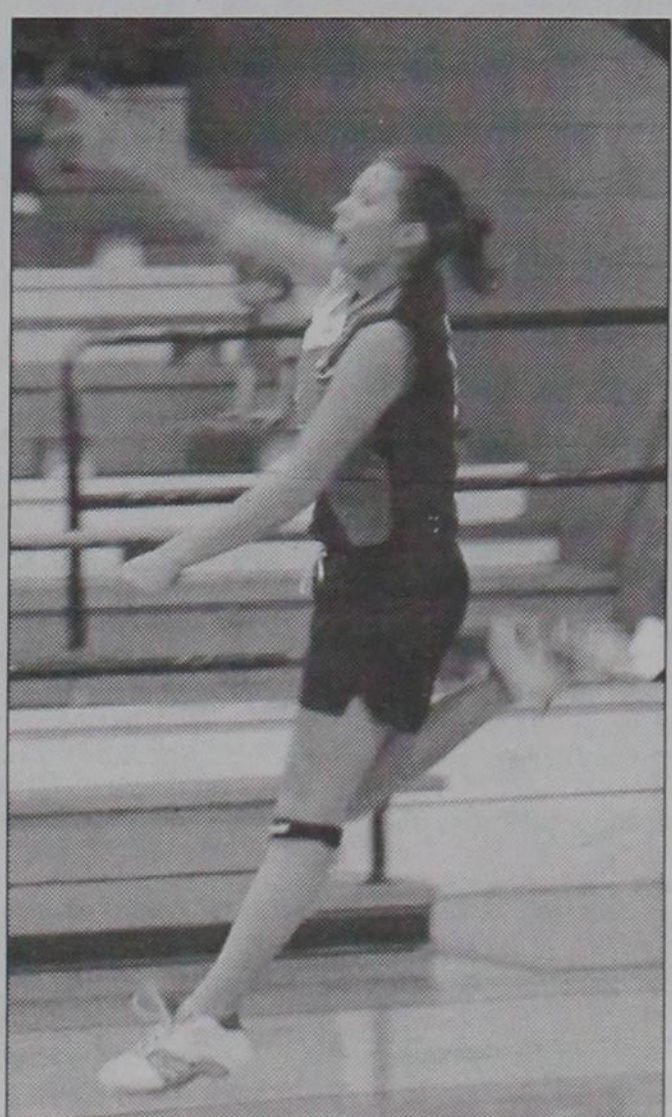

Listen to a few of these that might bring about a chuckle. 21:19: "Better to live in a desert than with a quarrelsome and ill-tempered wife." 11:22: "Like a gold ring in a pig's snout is a beautiful woman who shows no discretion." 12:4: "A wife of noble character is her husband's crown, but a disgraceful wife is like decay in his bones." 21:9 and 25:24: "Better to live on a corner of the roof than share a house with a quarrelsome wife," 27:15-16: "A quarrelsome wife is like a constant dripping on a rainy day; restraining her is like restraining the wind or grasping oil with the hand."

Yes, these verses presented do bring up a negative point in some women (and please don't think therefore that the book of Proverbs is anti-female - there are plenty of verses that talk about the foolishness of men, too). They claim that certain negative characteristics in women can overshadow any

positive attribute they might have. A beautiful woman might be admired by others, but if her character, integrity, personality, and godliness are not where they ought to be, then this is a woman who is lacking the most important attributes. Outside of the book of Proverbs, in I Peter 3:3-4 we are told that "beauty should not come from outward adornment, such as braided hair and the wearing of gold jewelry and fine clothes. Instead, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight." Now, back to the final chapter in the Proverbs. It concerns a truly beautiful woman. Proverbs 31:10-31 all speak of these details, but in verse 30 it says "Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised."

Knowing these verses, I can say without hesitation that the most beautiful women in the world are members of our congregation.

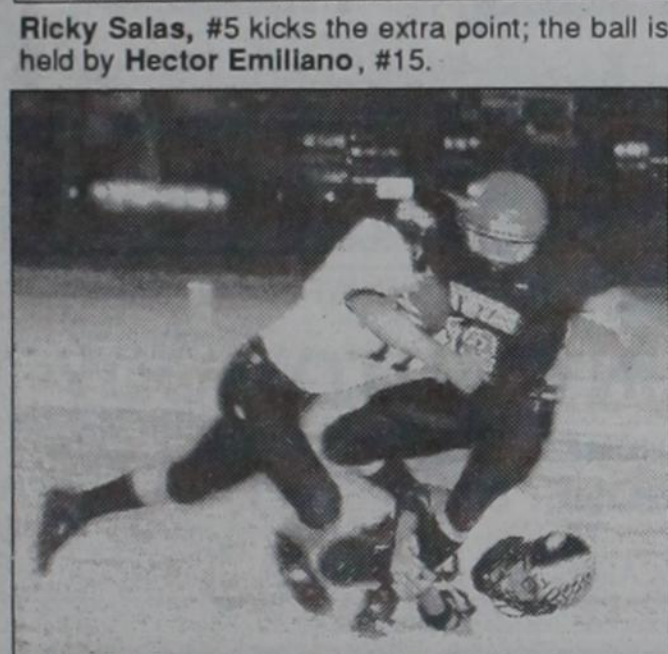

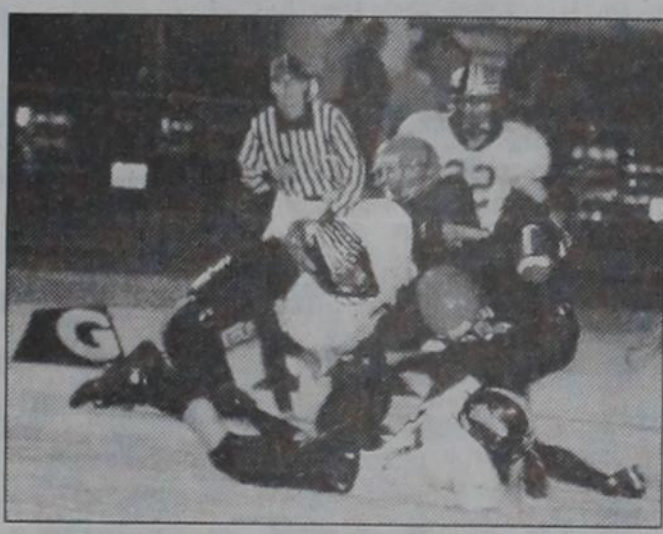

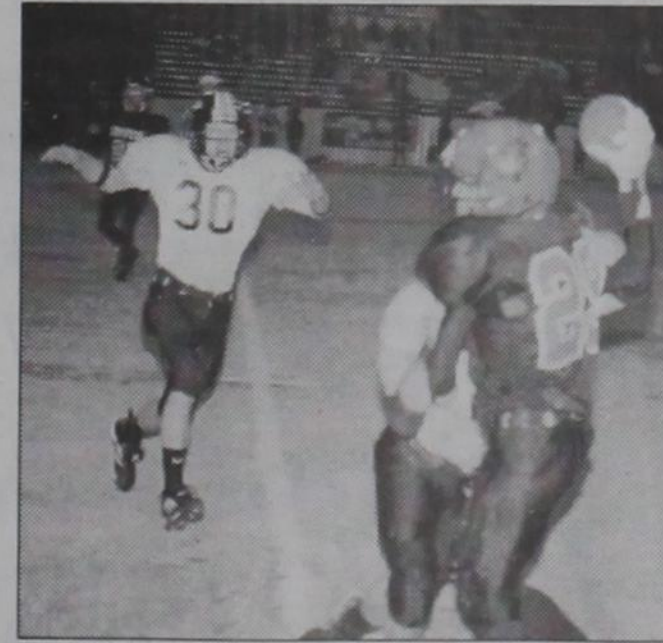

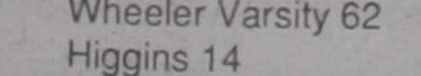

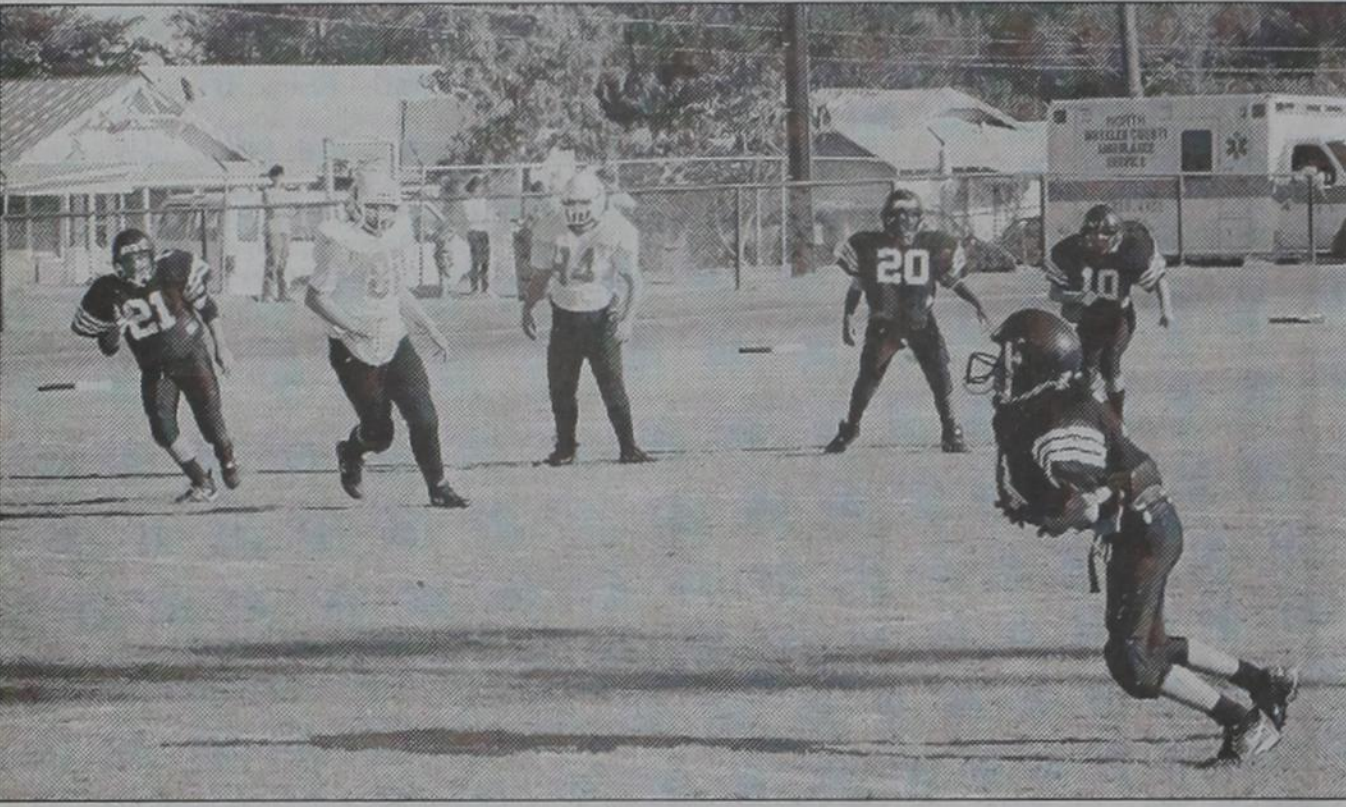

Seitz Reunion Held Sept. 5 At Lefors

On September 5th 2004, the 81st Annual Seitz Reunion was held in Lefors, Texas. About 50 people attended. Jane Seitz was recognized as the oldest present and the youngest was Cutter Seitz who was 9 months old. Deceased during the year were J.W. Seitz, Buddy Hodges and Zeldon Morris. Guests are always welcome at the reunions. This year it was an honor to have Roy and Helen Reeves Henrickson from Franklin, Texas. Helen taught some of the Seitz children in school at Mobeetie.

The book titled, "Seitz and Kindred Families" published in 1977 was extensively researched by Alma Totty Seitz and her mother-in-law Hollie Elliott Seitz. The book is in the Mobeetie museum and may also be ordered from Charles Seitz. The following is taken from "Seitz and Kindred Families" and gives us a glimpse of this family.

The Seitz family came to the United States from Germany in the 1700's and to Texas in the late 1800's. In the early years of immigration to the US, various spellings of the name appeared including Seitz and Sides. The first proven ancestor for this particular family was a George Sides (Seitz) of North Carolina. The Seitz men fought in the Civil war on both sides. The present day Seitz of the Panhandle of Texas are descendants of Abel Seitz. He and his wife, Catherine Gross Seitz had 9 children: Laborn (or Laban), Jones, Darius (possibly Darius David), George Pinkney, Eliza, Jane, Emeline, Katie, and Hester. Laborn married Susan Emeline Sherrill and they had nine children, 5 sons and 4 daughters. Their first three children, Julius Lafayette, born in 1865, Mary Jane born in 1867, and Sara Annie born 1869 were born while the family lived in Catawba County, North Carolina. Later in 1869 the Seitz family left North Carolina with plans to move to Texas. They reached Benton County, Arkansas and settled near Ratskin, Arkansas until 1877. Four children were born in Arkansas; W.J. (Bill) in 1871, B.P. (Pink) in 1872, L.J. (Jeff) in 1875 and Susan Belle in 1877. The family arrived in Texas in the early part of 1880 and lived in Collin or Denton County where A.G. (George) was born in 1880 and Hattie Pearl in 1882. Eventually the family moved to Montague County Texas. In 1900 sons Pink and Jeff moved to

Wheeler County Texas. A few years later their father Laborn Monroe and wife Emeline moved to this area.

There are numerous relatives of this pioneer family still residing in the Texas and Oklahoma area. The gathering of this family began with a big fish fry in 1907. Because many of the relatives lived nearby and contacts were numerous throughout the year, it was not until 1923 that the annual reunion was established. Today the custom of gathering on the Sunday before Labor Day continues. Several years ago a new custom was initiated with a church service before the potluck dinner. TxDOT Updates School Crossing Signs

Most everyone has driven through a school zone. It is very important that the signs at the crossing are uniform and visible, and not cause confusion among pedestrians and motorists.

Recently, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) changed the standards for school crossing signs. "The signs now all have a new fluorescent yellow green sheeting that stands out," said Kenneth Whitaker, Wheeler County Maintenance Supervisor.

As an added precaution, an arrow sign that clearly shows where the school crossing is located was recently added to the school crossing sign. "This was added to clearly mark where the school crossing is and to make the crossing more visible to the traveling public," continued Whitaker.

TxDOT works with school and city officials in all 13-counties in the Childress District to establish the best school zone routes and speed zones.

"TxDOT occasionally receives complaints regarding excessive speeds through school zones," said Bart Sherrill, Childress TxDOT's Traffic Operations Manager. "It is important that the public be aware that TxDOT is not in the enforcement business. We only install and maintain traffic control devices through school zones. Anyone wanting to make a complaint regarding excessive speed through a school zone should contact their local law enforcement agency," continued Sherrill.

The Texas Education Agency recently released school district accountability ratings based on the more rigorous Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS). These tests measure student performance on subjects such as language arts, writing, science, math, and social studies. Wheeler ISD received a rating of "Recognized" which places the district in the

upper 39 per cent state-wide. Thanks to all of the parents, faculty, and staff for their support and commitment to the students of this district. Obviously, our goal is to be an "Exemplary" district. To achieve this highest rating, the district is required to have a 90 per cent passing rate for all students, as well as African American, Hispanic, White, and economically disadvantaged student sub-groups. Wheeler ISD scores ranged from 72 per cent to 99 per cent who met the standard in each sub-group with the average being 87.77 per cent. While we are excited and proud of this rating, a new challenge has already begun. The bar has been raised (TAKS) and it will be very difficult to maintain or move up the ratings without a lot of determination and effort. Get involved in a child's education. Jennifer commented that we had all forgotten their first wedding anniversary on Sept. 20. How time flies. **Late Congratulations!**

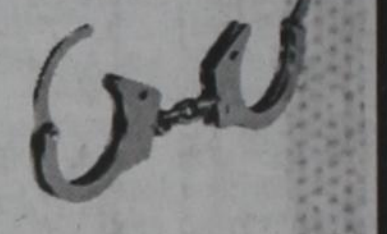
We had dinner Sunday in Hinton with the Meriwether clan.

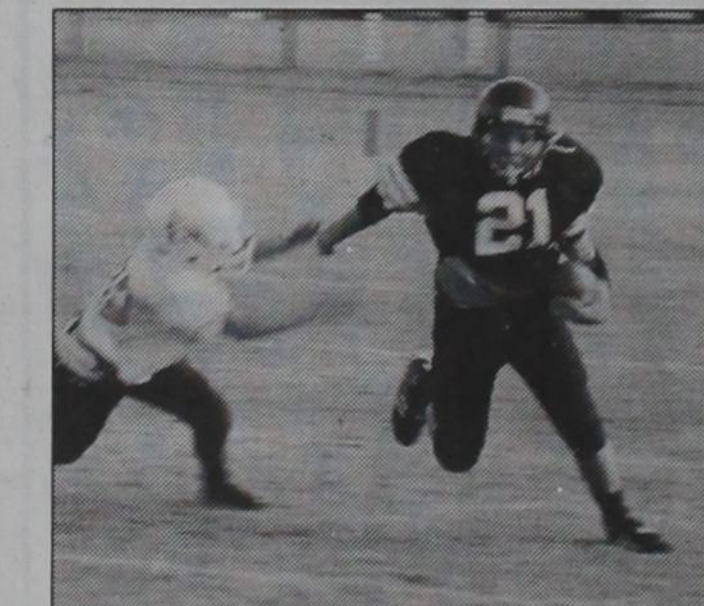

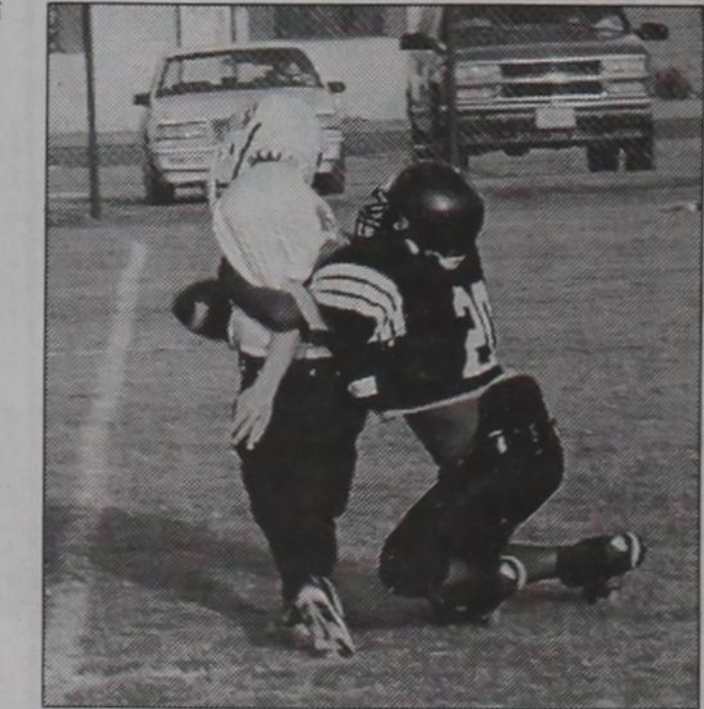

Mike Gaines, #21, attempts to move the ball downfield.



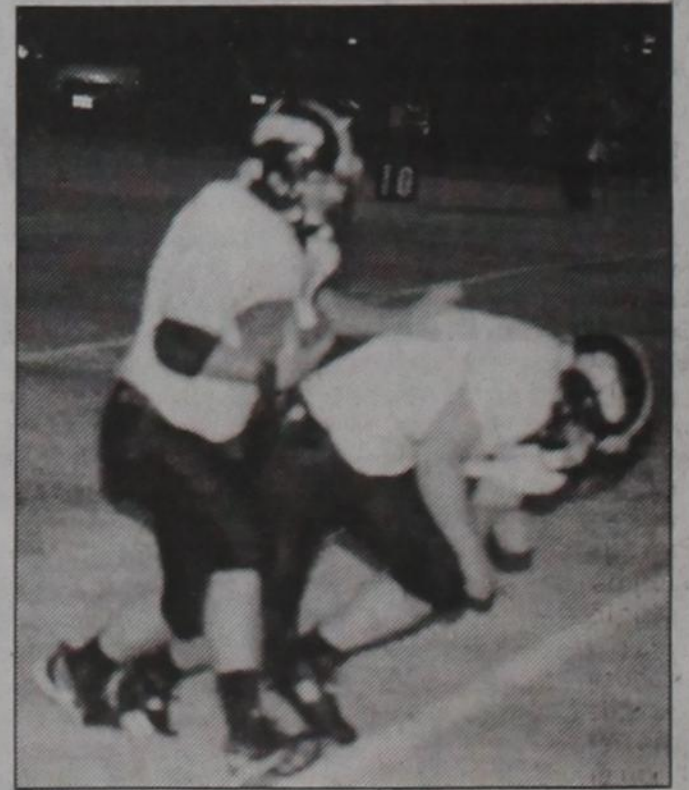
Johnny Venzor, #23, tries to get past a Higgins player.
