\$400 of \$1,500 To Be Given Away Sat.; Drawing To Be At 11:00 On The Square

The second of the \$1500 Chamber of Commerce Christmas drawings will be held Saturday, December 11, 2004. \$400 will be given away. The first three drawings will be on Saturday and the final drawing will be on Christmas Eve.

The drawings will be at 11:00 A.M. Seventeen individuals will be called forward for the second and third drawings. The division of the money will be 10-\$10, 4-\$25, 2-\$50 and 1-\$100.

The annual Christmas Drawing will again be offered by the progressive merchants of Wheeler. Certificates will be given away during December totaling \$1500. The merchants of Wheeler feel this is one way they can thank you, their customers, for the support you have given them during the year and are giving you a chance to share the profits.

Merchants began giving tickets on November 29, 2004. You are eligible for a ticket each time you enter a sponsoring business; with each five dollars spent, you will receive an additional ticket—up to 100 tickets per purchase.

Four drawings will be held. The drawings will be held on Saturdays, December 4, 11, 18 and Friday 24 Christmas eve. The drawings will begin at 11:00 A.M. again this year. 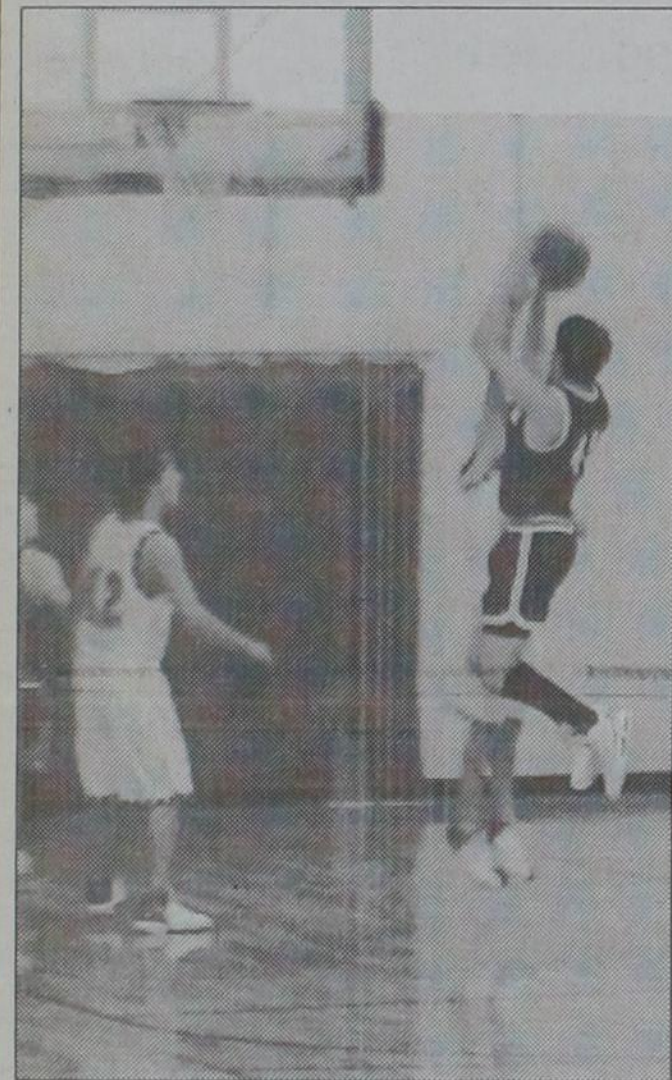
Shealee Coulter, #5, takes a shot for two points in the Miami tournament. Sarah Zybach, #15, is ready for the rebound.

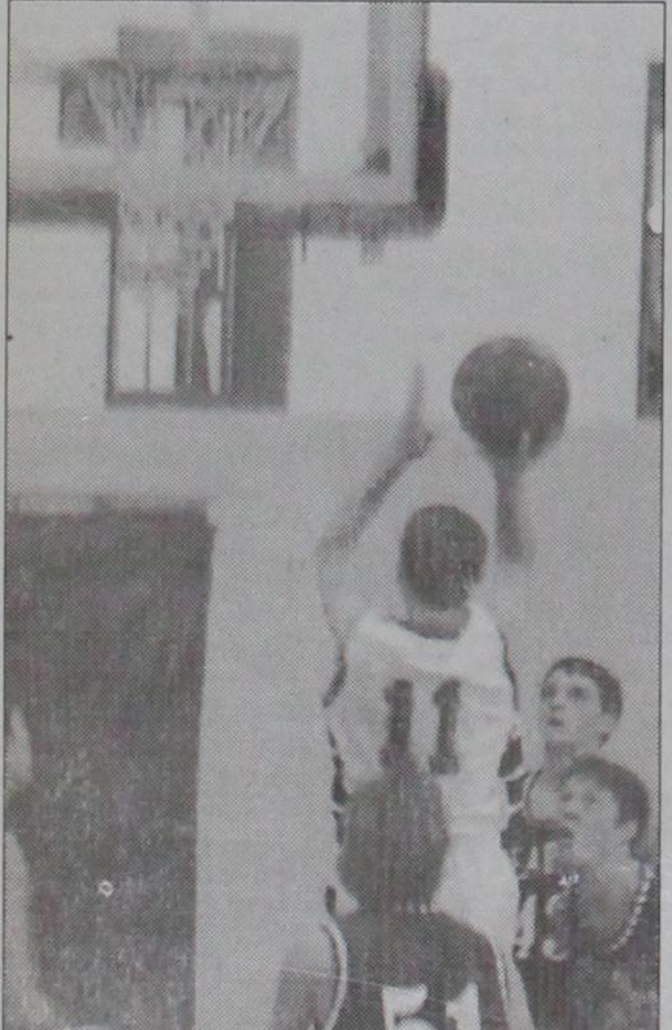

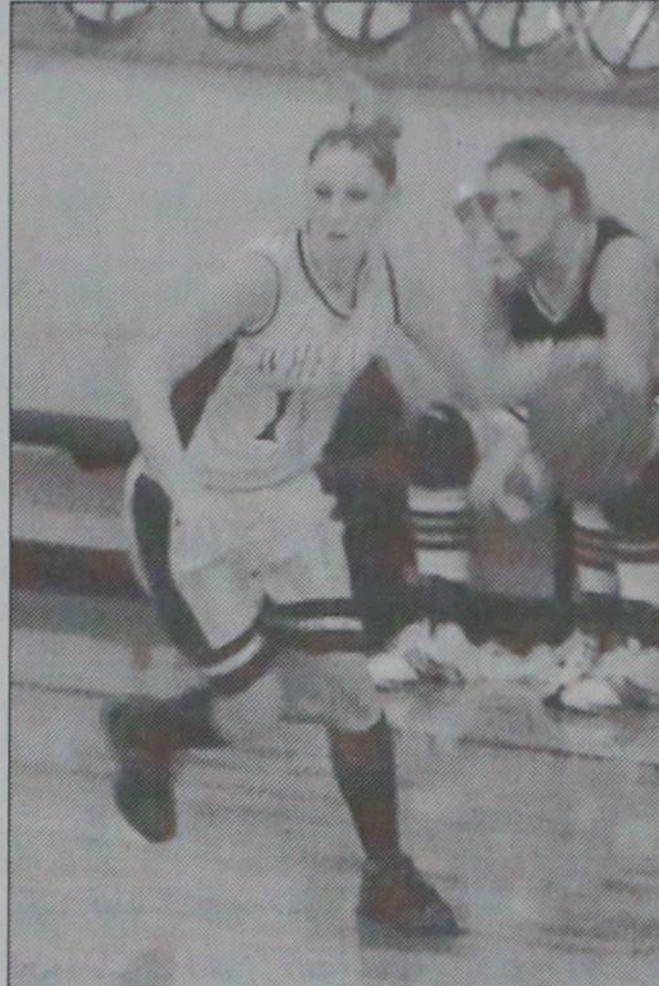

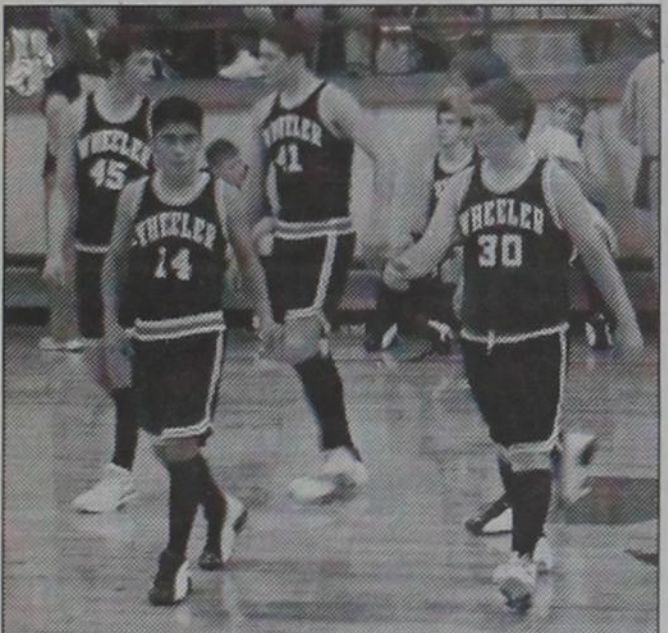

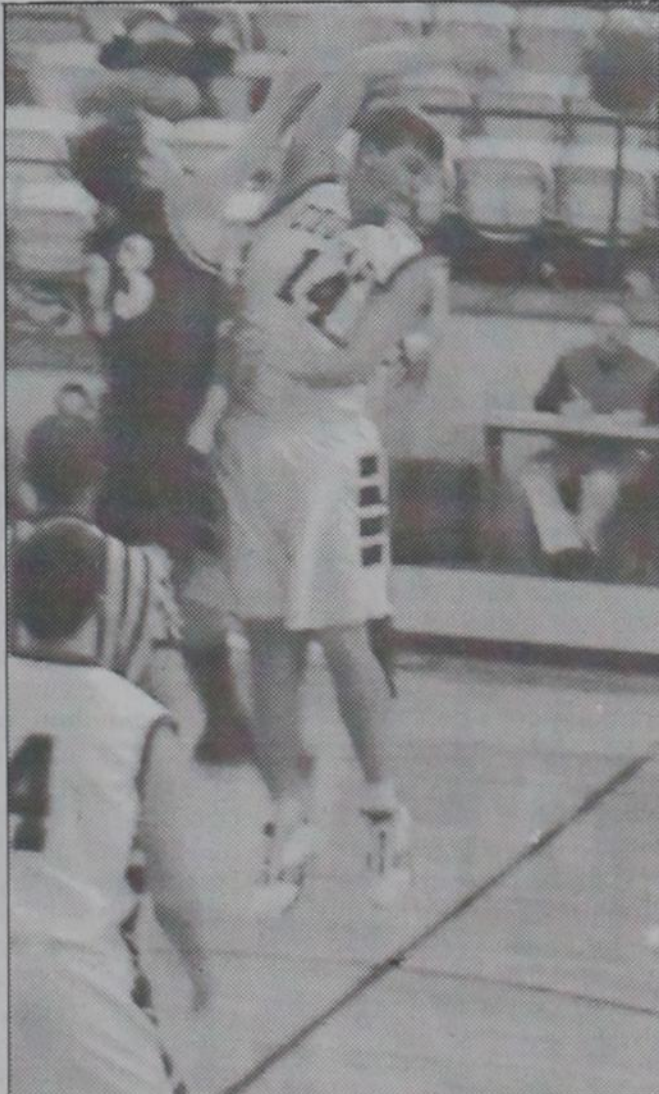
