Wheeler Mustangs Defeat Gruver 20-8 In Season Opener

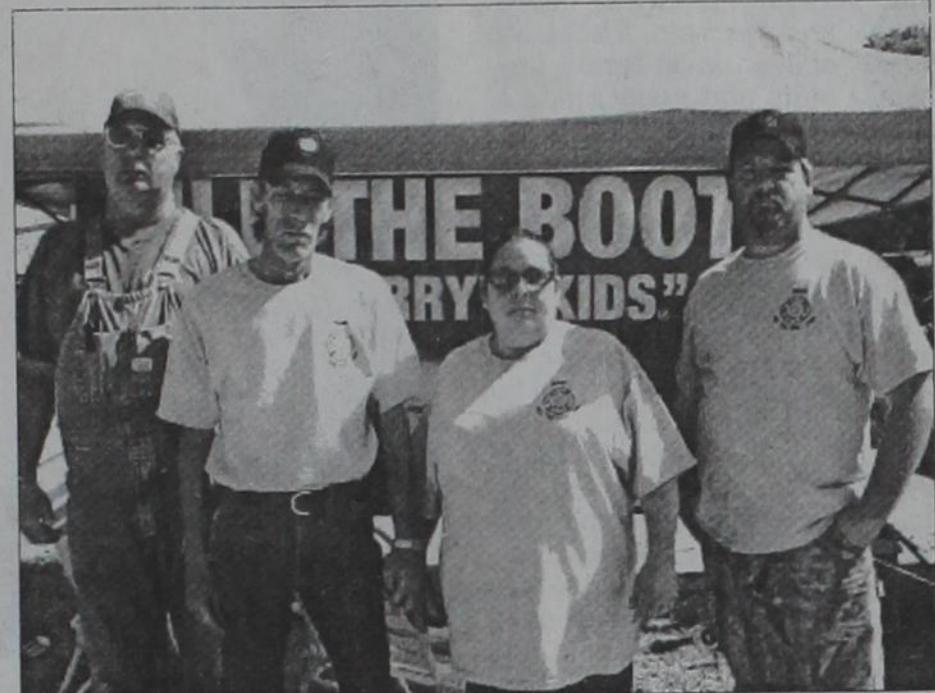
With 11:42 left to play, the game Friday night, August 31, 2008 was called due to lighting. The score at the time the game was called was 20-8 with the Wheeler Mustangs in the lead; defeating the Gruver Greyhounds.

The Mustangs Terry Menefield ran for 124 yards on nine carries and three touchdowns and also

passed for 82 yards, spoiling the debut of Gruver head coach Fred Tucker

Gruver took an early 8-0 lead on a 35-yard fumble return by Taylor Williams, but that would be it for the Greyhounds, who committed four turnovers for the game. Wheeler ran off 20 unanswered

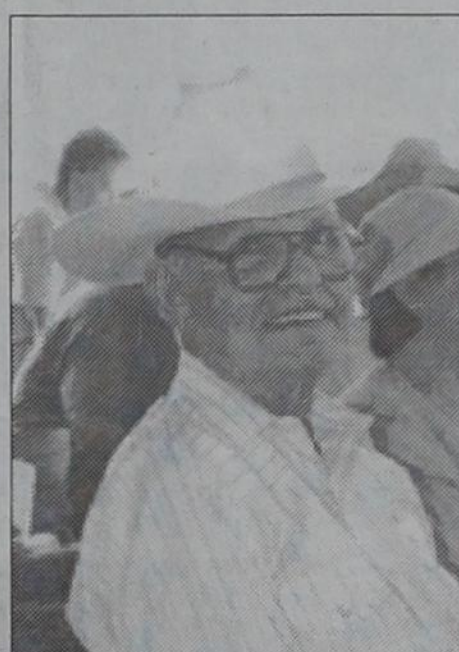

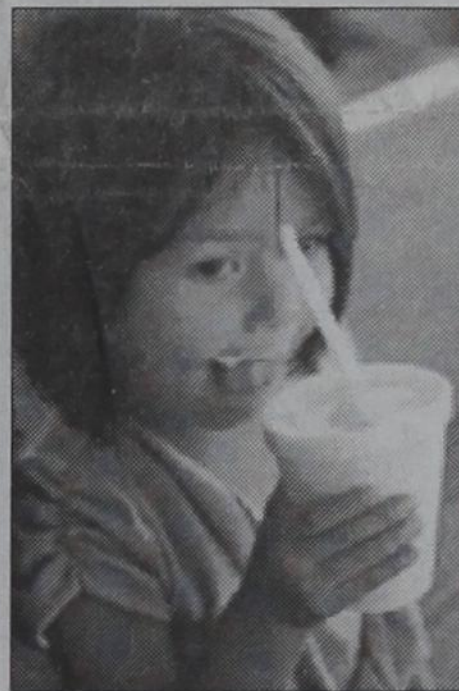

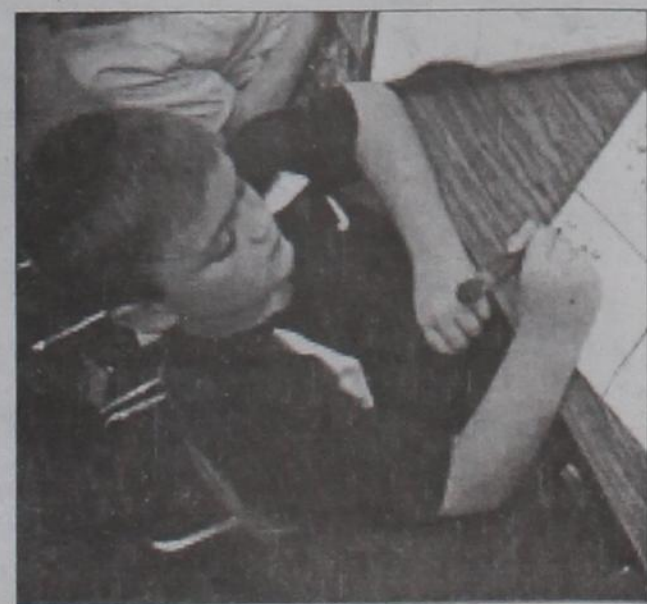

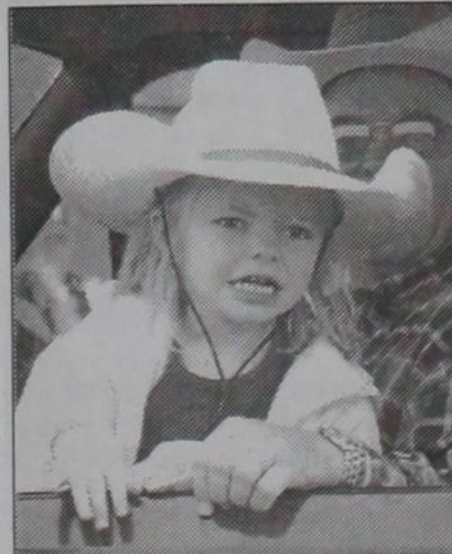

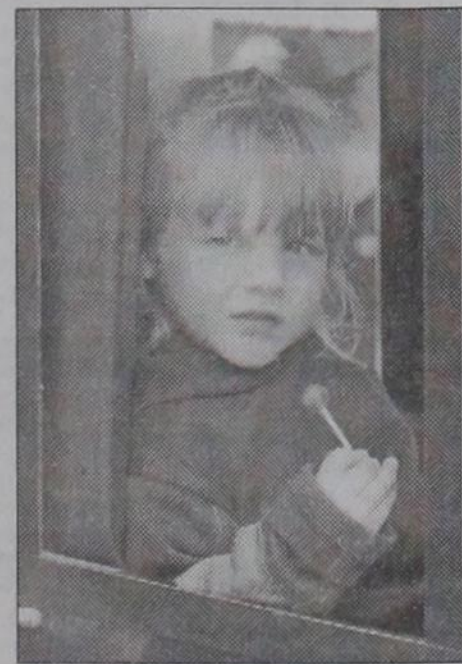

JULY PERMITS TO DRILL

The Commission issued a total of 2,183 original drilling permits in July 2008 compared to 1,854 in July 2007. The July total included 1,934 permits to drill new oil and gas wells, 66 to re-enter existing well bores, and 183 for re-completions. Permits issued in July 2008 included 412 oil, 480 gas, 1,254 oil and gas, 41 injection, three service and two other permits.

JUNE CRUDE OIL PRODUCTION

Texas preliminary June 2008 crude oil production averaged 880,380 barrels daily, up from the 872,514 barrels daily average of June 2007.

The preliminary Texas crude oil production figure for June 2008 is 26,411,409 barrels, an increase from 26,175,423 barrels reported during June 2007.

JULY OIL AND GAS COMPLETIONS

In July 2008, operators reported 453 oil, 1,065 gas, 30 injection and five other completions compared to 342 oil, 794 gas, 42 injection and five other completions during July 2007.

Total well completions for 2008 year to date are 9,312 up from 8,541 recorded during the same period in 2007.

Operators reported 395 holes plugged and four dry holes in July 2008 compared to 750 holes plugged and seven dry holes in July 2007.

JUNE NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION

DUCTION

Texas oil and gas wells produced 500,369,686 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas based upon preliminary production figures for June 2008, up from the June 2007 preliminary gas production total of 475,027,747 Mcf.

Texas production in June 2008 came from 134,598 oil and 81,960 gas wells.

TxDOT Set To Begin Seal Coat Project

Various roadways will be getting a fresh, new look this summer as highway construction crews start putting down a new rock and asphalt [seal coat] surface.

Work got underway on August 5, 2008 and weather permitting, the estimated completion date is October 6, 2008.

According to Rickey Gonzales, TxDOT Chief Seal Coat Inspector, this \$7.7 million project is part of an annual preventive maintenance program across the 13-county Childress TxDOT district. "Seal coat" is a rock and asphalt layer put down on the highway to reseal the surface and keep moisture from damaging the road

Again in the third quarter, after carrying the ball for a third time to the goal line, a distance of 38 yards, his try for the extra points failed.

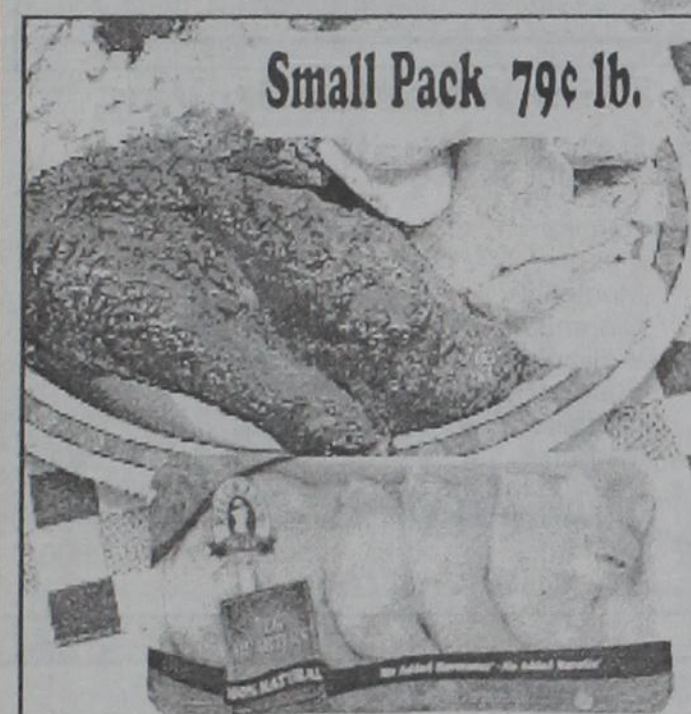

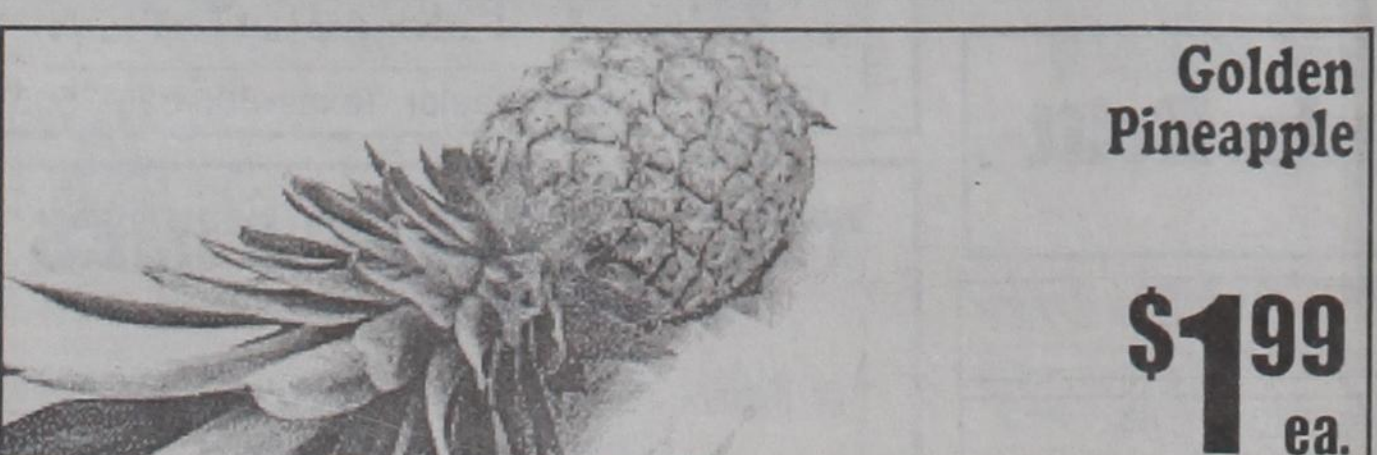
