Virginia Pettit, 75, died October 13, 2004 at Pampa, Texas.

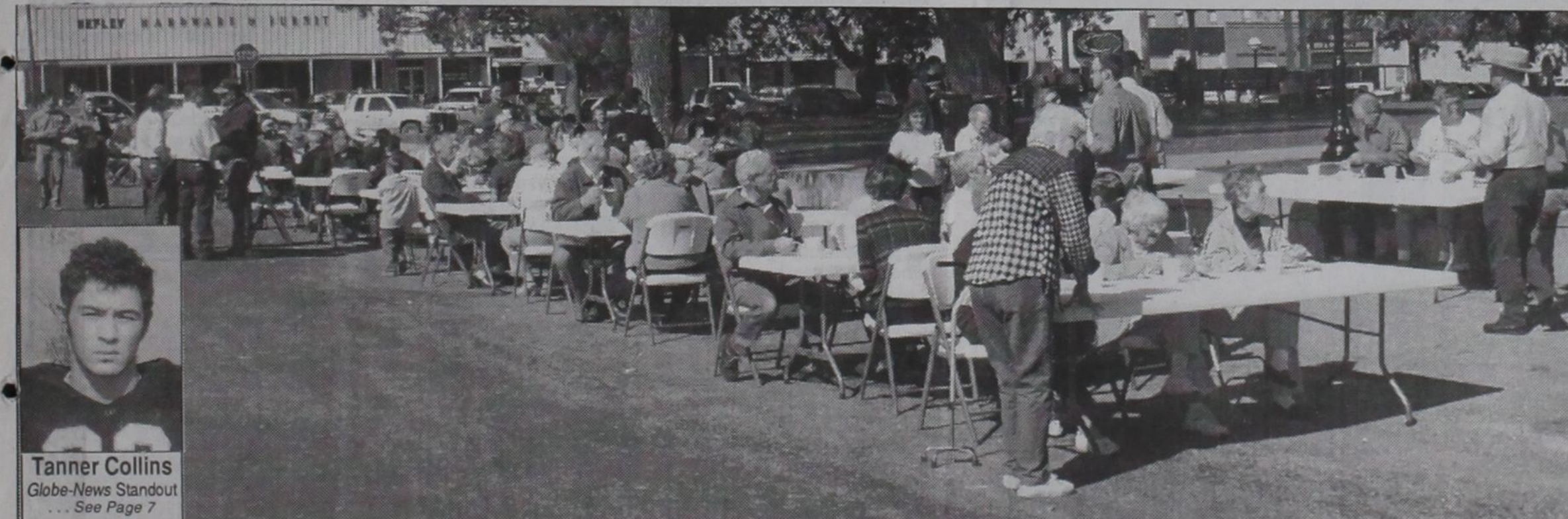

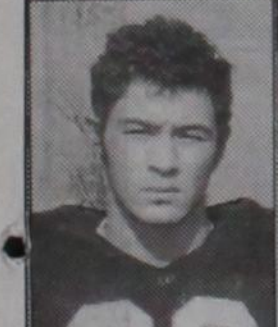

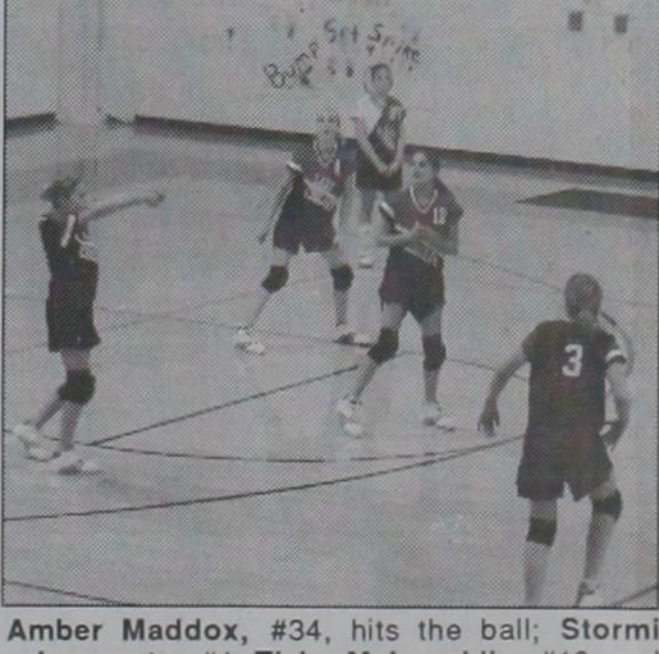

## Wheeler Church of Christ

If you've seen any supernatural movie, you know that Hollywood is now capable of doing incredible special effects. Current commercials can be made with Fred Astaire dancing with a vacuum cleaner or John Wayne selling beer. Acting in front of a greenscreen means that animators or computer geniuses can put in any background they desire. That is a long way since in the movie *The Ten Commandments* Charlton Heston as Moses parted the Red Sea and we found out they did it with a kind of jell-o mixture. There are some things I still have to imagine to picture them in my mind because I have no frame of reference.

For instance, in Luke 9:28-36 (it is in a few other New Testament places, too) Jesus is transfigured. A "transfiguration" is something that doesn't mean a lot to me because I have never seen anyone in a flash change their appearance. The Biblical story of the transfiguration shows Jesus' appearance changing dramatically. Maybe Hollywood could do something with this event. The description has Jesus' face changing, his clothes becoming illuminated in such a way like a lightning bolt flashing, and in addition to those changes there were two strangers/Old Testament heroes who all of a sudden appeared out of nowhere: Moses and Elijah. I understand why Peter and the other two apostles who saw these events were scared and started fumbling with their words. God had to intervene with words of power that would have made these humans even more apprehensive: "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him."

The message is to pay attention to Jesus over the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). The message is to pay attention to Jesus even when super-natural events make it difficult to pay attention. The message is to put your trust in Jesus. That message needs to be heard today, too.

Now I can say "Been there, done that."

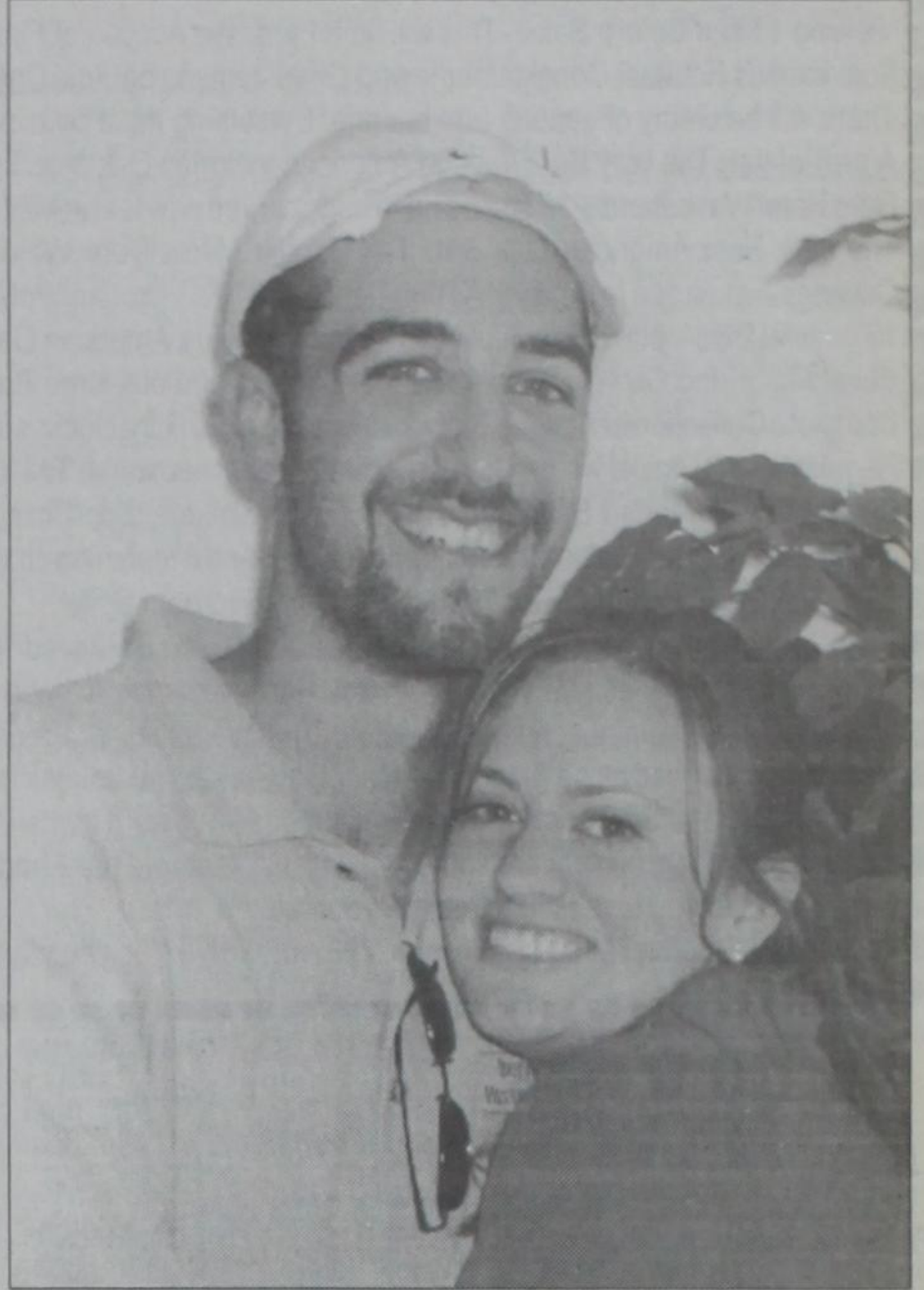

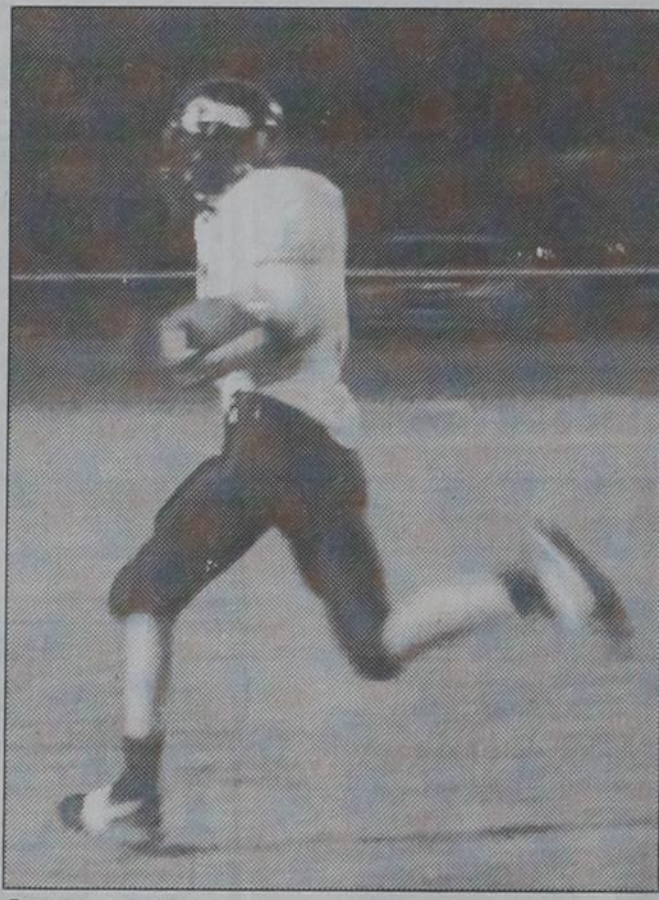

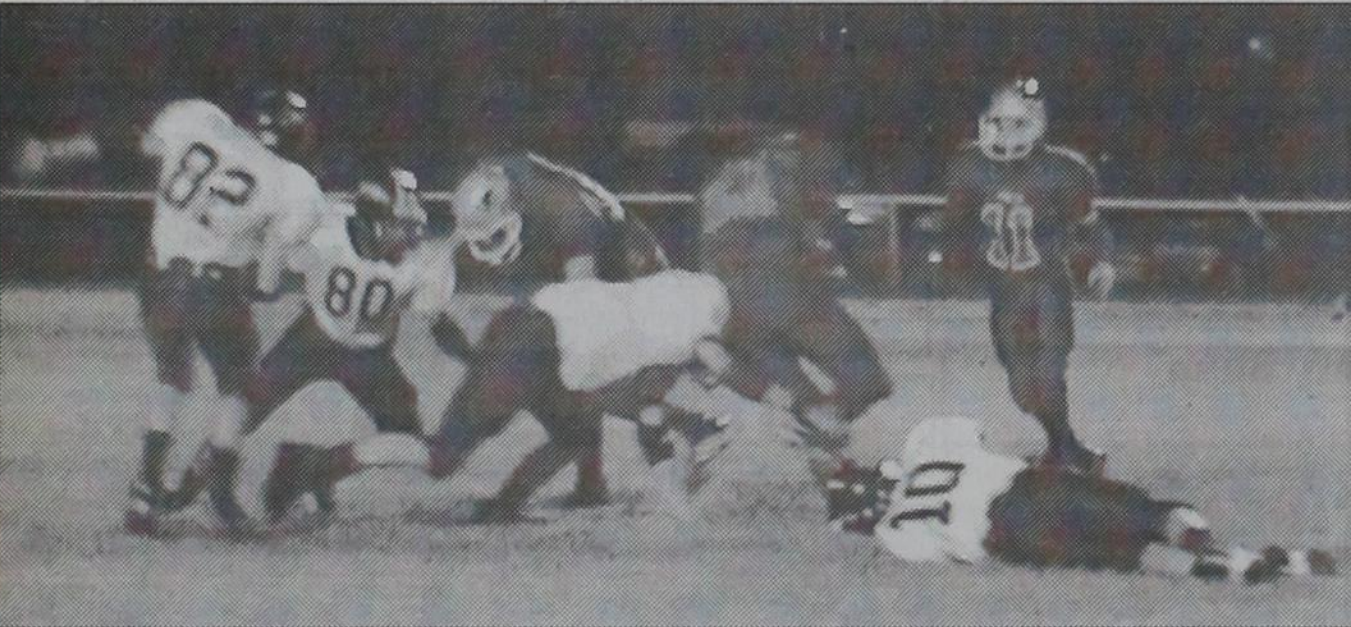

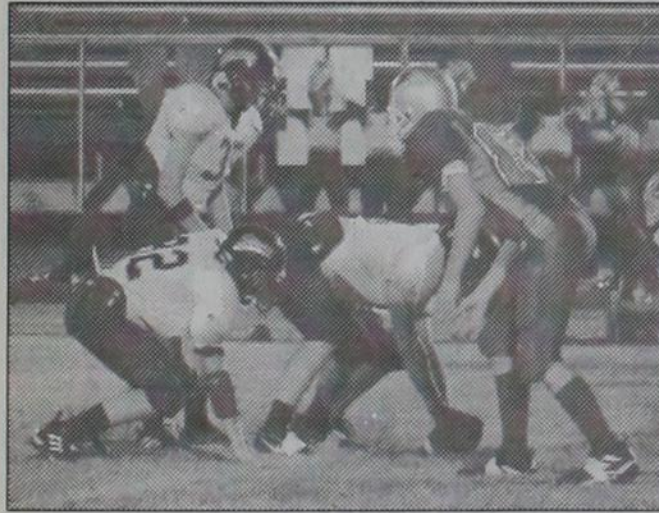

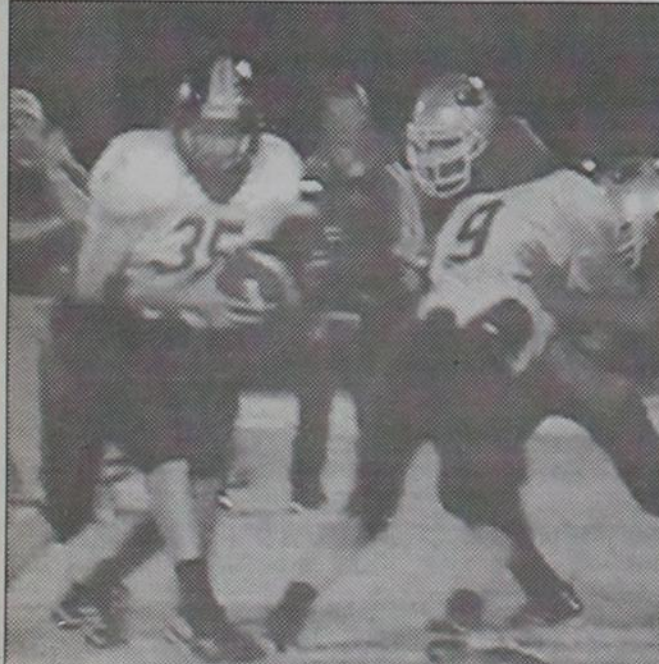

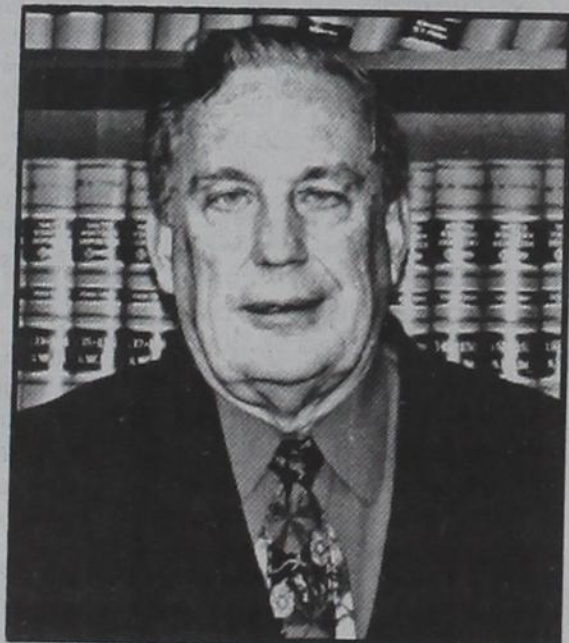
Wheeler. She had been a resident of Pampa since 1956. She was a homemaker. She was a member of the Highland Baptist Church and the Thursday Review Club.
