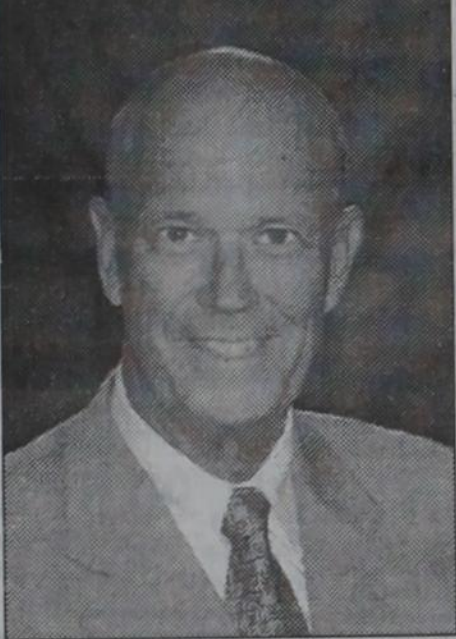

## Donald Rives Inducted Into The Texas Tech Athletic Hall Of Honor

Donald Rives was inducted into the Texas Athletic Hall of Honor in Lubbock in a ceremony on Friday, October 28, 2006, at the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center.

Donald was one of seven receiving recognition. The following is a page from the program on Wheeler's own:

Don Rives came to Texas Tech from tiny Wheeler, Texas, with his twin brother, Ron, on the promise that if they attended the same college their dad would buy them a car. It was appropriate that the car was red and black, because Texas Tech was the choice over several Big 8 and Southwest Conference schools.

After a year on the JV, in which Rives battled a back injury and played four different positions, he settled in at middle guard and became a starter from day one on the varsity. In his first game, a win over Tulane, he had nine tackles and recovered a fumble. At Rice he intercepted a pass and returned it 38 yards setting up the only points in a 3-0 win. In the Sun Bowl against Georgia Tech he blocked a punt. For his work on the season, he was named to the Southwest Conference All-Sophomore team.

As a junior Rives exploded with 194 tackles for an average of 17.6 stops a game. Against Texas A&M that year he laid a savage hit on an Aggie ballcarrier which caused a fumble that he returned to the eight-yard line, setting up a Red Raider touchdown. However, his best day that year came against SMU as he racked up 25 tackles and was honored with the 1971 Peruna Award as the best Red Raider performer in the SMU game.

The honors continued Rives' senior year as he averaged 14 tackles a game, despite playing through some nagging injuries. Again he tormented SMU with 20 tackles, six of which resulted in losses totaling 42 yards. For his efforts, he was named Associated Press National Defensive Player of the Week as well as Sports Illustrated Lineman of the Week. He also had 20 stops in the Texas game, and following the season he was awarded the Pete Cawthon Memorial Award as Tech's most valuable player. In addition, he was a consensus All-Southwest Conference pick and an Associated Press second team All-American selection at noseguard. He participated in the Hula Bowl following the season and played professionally for the Chicago Bears for six seasons.

A 1974 graduate of Texas Tech, he and wife, Sammye, a 1975 Tech graduate, have two grown sons, Chad and Blake, a daughter, Audra, and 3 granddaughters. Don and Sammye both teach in the Morton Independent School District in Morton, Texas, where Don also serves as the head football coach for the 2005 District Champion Morton Indians.

Participants also gain insights to guide their educational and professional careers, and benefit from a strong focus on college admissions. Through workshops, presentations, excursions and discussions, student leaders attain a clear advantage as they pursue and fine-tune their selected fields of interest. Students will have the opportunity to meet with admissions officers and gain valuable advice for navigating the college application process. In some locations, students will be able to tour several area universities.

The program is coordinated by People to People Ambassador Programs to fulfill the vision President Dwight D. Eisenhower had for fostering world citizenship when he founded People to People during his presidency in 1956.

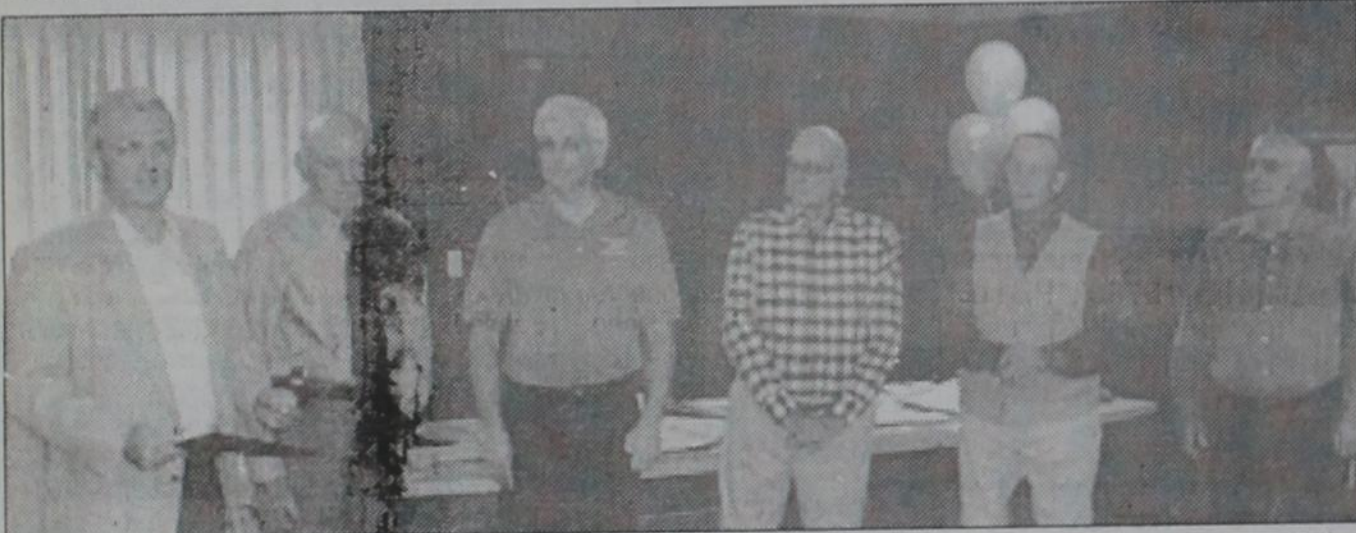

Beth Shelton, Sherri Jones, and Bob and I had the honor of being down there on Friday afternoon, to help people find the names on the individual panels and the row in which to find the names of some one special of each visitor. Sherri had volunteered to help but since there were plenty of us to handle it she went back to work at the courthouse. A few others from the courthouse took their lunch hour to come pay their respects. Even with the horrible wind, it was well worth get-

ting so cold for. We got to work along side several veterans, a few that had served in Vietnam. Charles Perez, of Lela, was one of those veterans that spent the day honoring his fallen fellow soldiers. We got to visit with so many interesting people that were looking for family members names, or those of friends, or just there to pay their respects to those heroes. Mobeetie was lucky enough to have only one son, neighbor, or friend lose his life in Vietnam. Keith Rowell was killed in 1968. His memory lives on in many of his local friends. Also close to our hearts was Russell Dan Woolard. He was a brother to Rick Woolard. He has a very special nephew to carry on his name and memories in the family. "Rusty", as some of his friends in Shamrock remember him, made a big impression in the lives of many, for being so young. The phrase "gone, but not forgotten" is so appropriate. They gave their lives fighting for a life style that they believed in and thought that every man, woman, and child is entitled to, no matter where they live. I was impressed with all of the schools that were represented by some very well informed youngsters. They were very well mannered. The teachers have done a very good job. Most of the youngsters had family members, extended family or family friends that they were looking for. One class even researched the war and it's victims on the internet. If they didn't have their own family or friends to look for they "adopted" a person and they all made rubbings of the names that they were looking for. Some of them even wrote thank you notes to the heroes. The thank you notes were going to be stuck to the wall near the name of their chosen person when the wind went down. Cindy Bowen had the chance to come see the wall with students from Canadian. She had the opportunity to go to Vietnam last summer. Charles Newton had served over there and the group he was with had a Vietnam citizen that was helping them. He was captured and put in a "reprogramming" camp. It was nothing but a

prisoner of a war concentration camp. The man survived four years there before being released. His family barely survived without him. Some American soldiers scraped together enough money to buy him a car. With that car he started a business that provides for his family. When asked how he felt about the war, he replied that it was a good thing for the people of that country and that they couldn't thank the Americans enough. Every person on that wall and their fellow troop members did make a difference in many lives. Many of us should be ashamed of taking our way of life for granted and being so ungrateful for the men and women that continue to protect us all. Seeing all of those names on the panels is quite humbling. We enjoyed visiting with Cindy, along with Susie Baxter and her 6th grade class from Canadian, Jeanette Umsted and Misty Tucker with students from Wheeler, Samie Corse and Brenda Hefley with junior high and highschool students from Ft. Elliott. Mrs. Corse's art class had gotten acquainted with the work of the artist of the wall. We also got to visit with Tracy Meyer from Darrouzett, Joe Pledger of Miami, TX, a lady from Leedy, Ok., and a gentleman from Altus, Ok., and as well as James Hubble from Marble Falls, TX. Joe Pledger is a nice young man that works for an area gas company. He has a long family history of members with military connections. One of his Uncles served under Vice President Dick Cheney, when he was the Secretary of Defense. Joe had the privilege to visit his uncle at his office and check out different offices as well as to see many of the monuments. The Vietnam Memorial wasn't quite finished when he was up there. He said even tho the Moving Wall was scaled down it didn't lose a thing. He wanted to pay his respects and get 3 rubbings off the wall. The students from Shamrock that are attending Samnorwood schools got to take advantage of viewing the wall after they got off the bus. What a way to end their school week. The VFW had many events scheduled for Saturday. It was so nice to see the wind go down some and it warmed back up. Our preacher, John Ulrey, had the honor of standing guard all day Saturday for the fallen heroes. Imagine he got quite warm out in the sun. He

## Walkers Pass Through Wheeler On Journey

Gary Long, 52, started "A Fat Man's Journey" across the United States from St. Louis, Mo. on February 15, 2006, in an effort to bring attention to "obesity in America". He started his journey at over 400 lbs. and carried a 60 lb. backpack.

Upon his arrival in New York City, he received national publicity, which was seen by Judi C. Herring, M.D. from Jacksonville, FL 32247. Dr. Herring and her husband, also a doctor, are also concerned about obesity in America. The Doctors through their studies have published a book on obesity entitled "Fast 5".

Dr. Herring contacted Long and asked permission to join him on the second half of his journey—Los Angeles to St. Louis. After arranging to meet in Los Angeles, Dr. Herring went through Alabama to pick up her mother to accompany the two on their walk and carry camping equipment and gear in a car.

After starting the journey, Dr. Herring explained the "Fast 5" diet to Long and he converted and is now on the diet. Since being on the diet, Long has been able to discontinue his blood pressure and diabetes medications.

On his regular diet of three meals a day and walking, Long lost an average of 10 lbs. per month. On the "Fast 5" diet and walking he is losing 9 lbs. per week.

The walkers came through Wheeler via way of Highway 152 on Friday, continuing into Oklahoma and on to St. Louis. The journey is to be completed the first part of December.

The "Fast 5 Diet" requires you to gradually move your breakfast time to 5 p.m. From 5 p.m. until 10 p.m. you can eat what you want. Continue the "five hour fasting" and you will eventually lose to your ideal weight. Exercise will speed up the weight loss, but it is not necessary to exercise.

## Defense Bill Funds Area Defense Efforts

## Dec. 15 Deadline For EQIP Funding

The USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Texas has set a Dec. 15, 2006, sign-up deadline for the 2007 Environment Quality Incentives Program (EQIP).

"The funds allocated for EQIP will help farmers and ranchers improve natural resources on private working lands in Texas," said Dr. Larry Butler, NRCS state conservationist for Texas. "The program provides cost-share and incentives payments to producers applying approved conservation measures that help solve natural resource problems."

Natural resource concerns are established in each county by local work groups, who identify the most important natural resource issues in the area. Through EQIP, NRCS also funds projects that address special statewide resource concerns recommended by the Texas State Technical Committee. The 2007 statewide resource concerns are animal waste, invasive species, plant condition, water quality, water quantity, and wildlife emphasis areas.

Immediately following the end of the sign-up period, all applications will be ranked. Producers with an approved application will work with an NRCS conservation planner to develop a contract and a plan and will begin implementing conservation practices next spring.

Local NRCS field offices have complete details for their county and the applicable state concerns. ## Sign-Up Period For Livestock Assistance Grants

Agriculture Commissioner Susan Combs announced today that the Texas Department of Agriculture will accept applications Sept. 29 to Nov. 13 from eligible livestock producers impacted by drought who qualify for payments under the federally-funded Livestock Assistance Grant Program.

On Sept. 29, applications will be available on TDA's Web site at [www.agr.state.tx.us](http://www.agr.state.tx.us); at all TDA offices; and at Texas Cooperative Extension and U.S. Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency county offices in the 216 eligible Texas counties.

Although local Cooperative Extension and FSA staff may have basic knowledge of the program, they will not have received specific training on the program, so producers with any questions are encouraged to call TDA at 1-800-TELL-TDA (1-800-835-5832).

The application must be postmarked by Nov. 13, 2006, and mailed to TDA headquarters in Austin addressed to: Livestock Assistance Grant Program, Texas Department of Agriculture, P.O. Box 12847, Austin, Texas 78711. Incomplete applications and applications postmarked after Nov. 13 will not be considered.

To qualify for LAGP funds, a producer must meet all the following criteria:

0Must have suffered livestock forage production losses because of drought conditions from March 7 through Aug. 31, 2006 (eligibility period);

0Must have a livestock operation that suffered forage production losses in one or more of the 216 Texas counties classified as D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought Exceptional during the eligibility period; and

0Must have raised eligible livestock for commercial use as part

of a farming operation during the eligibility period. Eligible livestock are adult beef cattle two years of age and older and sheep one year of age and older during the eligibility period. Livestock must have been owned by the producer for at least 30 days.

Forage production losses may include cost of lost forage, supplemental feeding costs, the costs incurred relocating livestock to new pastures, increased feed transportation costs and the cost of emergency water supplies.

Payments are limited to \$10,000 per producer, and the amount of compensation may not exceed the amount of forage production losses. Producers who apply in multiple states cannot receive more than \$10,000 in total compensation, and the same losses cannot be claimed in more than one state.

For general partnerships or joint ventures, payments will not exceed \$10,000 for each member of the partnership or joint venture.

Because of the anticipated number of applicants and the amount of available funds, payments will be limited and may only cover partial forage production losses incurred by each producer. Of the \$50 million USDA block grant for livestock assistance being distributed to 20 states, Texas' share was \$16.1 million.

Funds will be paid on a per head basis. Per head payment rates will be determined by the total number of livestock claimed by all eligible applicants and will differ for cattle and sheep based on standard animal units. The per head payment rate will be determined after all applications are received and processed.

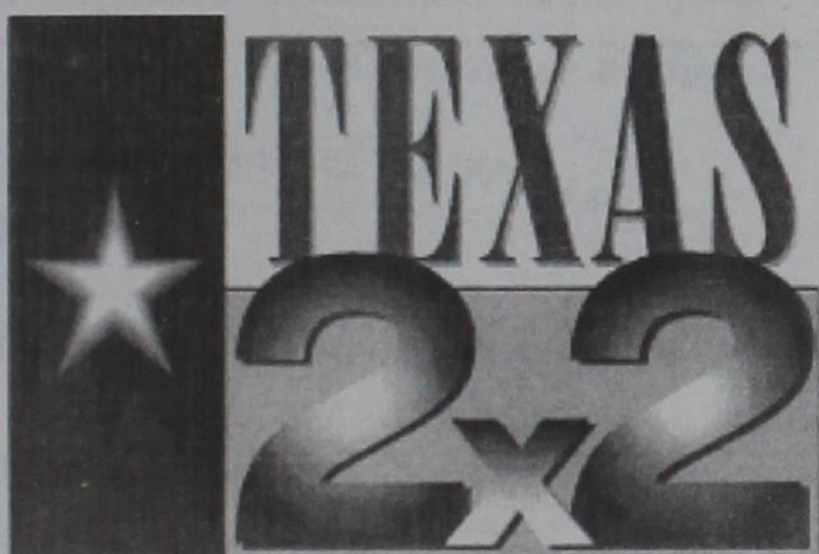
